When many people see an out of bloom Sobralia for the first time, they exclaim "You mean that's an orchid?". Plants in this genus seem to resemble a tropical grass or exotic bamboo more than the Cattleyas and Phalaenopsis that are common in cultivation, yet Sobralias certainly are members of the orchid family. Native to Mexico as well as Central and South America, this genus includes delightful "miniatures" less than 10 inches tall to behemoths that can reach heights of 18 feet or more. Sobralia also includes plants with some of the largest flowers in the orchid world: Sobralia macrantha 'Voodoo Priestess' AM/AOS can produce flowers 15 cm wide by 17 cm high! Many San Diegans grow their Sobralias outdoors, and a great photo of Harry Tolen's 'Voodoo Priestess' greets you when you visit The Sobralia Pages. Houston Resident and AOS judge Nina Rach has constructed a wonderful and informative web site devoted to Sobralias and their relatives. The site includes an informative section on the geographic distribution of the genus, including a number of useful maps and links to sites that describe where Sobralia species can be found. The centerpiece of this web site is a section listing over 70 Sobralia species, many with information on the country of origin and photographs of both plants and flowers. Other useful features of this web site include a list of registered Sobralia hybrids, information on awarded Sobralias, and a brief page on Sobralia culture. Two additional and noteworthy sections treat the small-growing species and those with white flowers, many of which are difficult to distinguish from each other. Visit The Sobralia Pages for an introduction to this delightful genus!

# Go to an American Orchid Society Orchid Show


One of the best educational opportunities for most beginner orchid enthusiasts is to attend a local orchid show. They are always spectacular, even the smallest show. There are masses of flowers in the show itself and most shows have a large area dedicated to vendors of all kind of orchid plants and items. The American Orchid Society web site has a listing of the shows put on by their affiliated societies. Just choose "Calendar" from the linked page. You will see what is possible with almost any kind of orchid. It is also probably the only place you will be able to see many rare species of plants.

There's nothing like being able to see what the flower and plant really looks like of the plant on your wish list. I've revised my opinion on several plants I thought I wanted when I saw the size of a full grown plant of that variety. On the other hand, I've also decided I wanted something that didn't look very interesting from a picture on a catalog.

As you look at the plants, be sure to talk to the vendors who are local and get their business cards. This is the very best way to find local places to visit throughout the year to get the best orchids for your area. A local nursery will generally be more than happy to work with you and provide knowledge and expertise for your growing questions. They are also one of the best sources for learning what grows well in your area of the country. Many nurseries put on periodic classes on how to care for your orchids, how to repot, etc. Get on their mailing lists so you're aware of what is going on.

In many areas there will be one specialty grower who will exhibit and sell at local shows. If you are interested in the same kind of plant as he/she has you can gain a valuable friend by meeting them at a show. We have a world-renowned Equitant Oncidium (now know as Tolumnia) breeder in my area who loves to give tours of her greenhouses when her orchids are in bloom.

A friend of mine and I who were both interested in orchids, set up a monthly excursion to a local nursery to really meet and talk with them on a one-on-one basis. The amount of information you can learn in just one such visit is extraordinary. Ask questions. If you're having problems with a plant, take it with you (leave it in your vehicle so you don't spread disease and/or pests) and ask if they will look at it for you. Often you can not only find out what the problem is, but get the solution all in about 10 minutes!! And of course you can get a flowering plant as a bonus!

## Honohono an Island favorite

It makes no sense to me.

Why do people love the plants they love? Here's a good example: The honohono orchid, Dendrobium anosmum, has been popular in Hawai'i for many years.

Honohono in Hawaiian refers to the plants' growth habit of alternating leaves, very similar to the honohono grass (which actually is not a grass) or wandering Jew.

The honohono name refers to the leaves, but it is the flowers and not the leaves that people remember it by.

The honohono orchid blooms best when fertilized and watered more in summer than in winter.

In fact, the leaves fall off before flowering. I sometimes wonder about plant taxonomists too, because anosmum, its Latin name, means scentless.

Whoever named the plant probably was looking at a dried specimen, but it is the honohono orchid flower's incredible scent that gets everyone crazy about them every year.



The honohono orchid originated in Southeast Asia, where it is widespread.

It has slender stems that can easily reach grow 4 or 5 feet long. Flower colors range from lavender, to light pink, to white, there is even a semi-alba (white with a bluish lip), as well as a striped variety.

Blooming season normally ranges from March into May, so there is time to prepare for it now.

Local hybridizers are always trying to produce new color forms and to extend the blooming season.

Here is another crazy thing about the honohono: It comes from areas with monsoon climates, very wet in the summer and dry in the winter.

This raises problems for orchid enthusiast here because our rainy season is the opposite.

To make them blossom, we need to remember to water and fertilize them heavily in the summer and dry them slightly in the winter.

I don't think you can overwater a honohono in the summer.

Remember when we used to use the rice rinse water for the honohono? Could the secret be the talc in the water, or that we had to wash rice every day?

The honohono can be grown on hapu'u (tree-fern fiber) chunks, or in coconuts or even on cork bark. I prefer to grow them in plastic pots, with a bark and peat-moss mixture, not only because I'm cheap but because the plastic pots allow me to give the plants optimum moisture.

A growing area which has bright indirect sunlight will give you the best results. A temperature range from 55 to 85 degrees is ideal.

A slight chill in the winter will induce a good flowering season.

Propagation is quite simple. In June and July, cut old stems into four-inch sections and lay them in a tray of sterile potting mix or peat moss. Remember, new plantlets will emerge only from nodes that have not flowered.

Keep them moist and shaded, watch for slugs, and get ready to share with your friends.

One important tip is to sterilize the cutting tool that you are using after each stem. The best way is to flame them with a propane torch or cigarette lighter. Most diseases are spread by dirty tools. Cuttings should flower in a couple of years.

Visit Foster Botanical Garden's orchid display, and you will see the honohono in bloom from March into April. You also can see honohono at the Kunia and Windward orchid shows.

February 2004 *Orchids* Preview from the AOS website.

This month, H. Thomas Etheridge, PhD, introduces readers to the 13 plants lucky enough to win the Society's 2003 Special Judging Awards, which were announced at the AOS 2004 Fall Members Meeting. An annual presentation, this article is always popular among judges, commercial growers, hobbyists and others who want to see what orchids were judged the finest.

The species spotlight also shines on *Phragmipedium kovachii*, as Miluzka Damian Loayza, Norris H. Williams and W. Mark Whitten take a look at the molecular systematics of this New World orchid. 

Taipei, Jan. 19 (CNA) President Chen Shui-bian called on domestic orchid growers Wednesday to intensify innovation, research and development, and international marketing to make Taiwan a "kingdom of orchids." Chen made the appeal while visiting an orchid exposition that opened at the Taiwan Orchid Biotechnology Park in the southern county of Tainan. Innovation, research and development as well as international marketing are essential to increasing the global market share of Taiwan-cultivated flowers, especially after the nation's entry into the World Trade Organization, Chen said. "Only by

creating our own brands can we achieve the goal of building Taiwan into a 'kingdom of orchids, '" Chen stressed, adding that organizing expositions is one of the best marketing approaches. Chen also thanked the Cabinet-level Council of Agriculture, the Tainan County Government and the private sector for their concerted efforts to push for the establishment of the orchid park. Inspired by Taiwan's successful hosting of an Asia-Pacific orchid show last year, Chen voiced the hope that agriculture officials will do their utmost to bid for hosting the 2011 International Orchid Exposition in Tainan County. 
