The speaker for the July SDCOS general meeting will be Christopher Croom, SDCOS Newsletter editor and Board Member, who will be presenting on "How to Smell an Orchid," which will be in the same vein as the presentation he gave to the novice class last month, but should have sufficiently different information so that people who attended last month's novice meeting won't get bored or be barraged with information they already know.



Book Review: The Orchid in Lore and Legend

by Luigi Berliocchi (2000, Timber Press)

One of my most enjoyable orchid reads over the years has been *The Orchid in Lore and Legend*, by Luigi Berliocchi. While many of the plants mentioned in it have old names, or are species that used to be popular but are now seldom seen in American horticulture, there are still many, many other species that Berliocchi writes about that might be in your own collection at home.

While orchid books tend to be rife with questionable information, and this book is probably no exception, they are nonetheless an integral component of becoming a better orchid grower. At least 10% of your orchid budget should be set aside for books, and even more if you want to increase the quality of information you have access to. If you *really* want to learn about orchids, try buying any of the multi-volume series of books titled "*The Orchids of*_______," where the blank is the name of the country that the orchids you are interested in grow. (Hence, geographical knowledge is also vitally important to become a better orchid grower.)

In any case Berliocchi's book is cheap (you can get it online for less than \$10), and loaded with interesting stories about early orchid collectors, the orchid frenzy of Victorian England, medicinal uses of orchids, ancient writings about orchids, orchid artists through history, and similar trivial information about orchids.

Some of my favorite topics covered by Berliocchi are orchids that are used as aphrodisiacs (which include many, especially those from the Ophrys genus and those with long pseudobulbs like Den-

drobium chrysanthum); and stories of edible orchids, such as the varieties of Ophrys that are used to make salep; Vanilla; and Stanhopea tigrina, which was reported by Hernandez to be an occasional ingredient in tortillas.

So, based on the ethnobotanical and historical information contained in it alone, *The Orchid in Lore and Legend* is an excellent buy. While it has no color photographs or cultural information, it is fun and enjoyable to read, and deserves a space in every orchid lovers' library!

Book Review: Fragrant Orchids

by Steven A. Frowine (2005, Timber Press)

I gave a talk on fragrant orchids to the Orchid Society of Southern California last May, and during that talk, one of the OSSC members asked me what I thought of "that new book on fragrant orchids." Considering that I might have to answer that question again and was completely unfamiliar with the book, I decided to hit up my local bookstore and give it a try.

Frowine's book is full of useful information, although the title is somewhat misleading. Considering that over 80% of orchids have osmophores, or scent glands, it would seem that his book should catalogue at least 15,000 species alone, rather than the meager 110 species and hybrids he describes (which makes the \$29.95 price tag a little hard to swallow). But, it contains very useful horticultural information, especially oriented to folks who prefer growing their orchids exclusively in pots.

While the sense of smell is highly subjective, I was amazed to find how many orchids that Frowine and I agree on: Miltoniopsis santanei and M. phalaenopsis both have the fragrance of roses to me, too (although I find them to be both strong, instead of "light" and "strong," respectively). Frowine also finds the same Vanilla fragrance to Oncidium ornithorhynchum that I do, although he thinks that the sweet cleaning product-scented O. cheirophorum somehow smells like citrus or lemon (again, smell is a very subjective sense).

Like most orchid books, there are occasionally a few major transgressions: Frowine describes the flower of Coelogyne lawrenceana as being 3 1/2" across, when it is more like 6"; and notes that Bulbophyllum echinolabium smells like carrion when in bloom,

when it actually is a dead ringer for dog droppings.

But, minutiae and price aside, this is generally an excellent book for beginners or anyone interested in orchid fragrances, and there is nothing else like it on the market today.

The San Diego Botanical Foundation: What Is It?

The following is from a letter from the San Diego Botanical Foundation, who requested that this information be made available to all SDCOS members:

"The San Diego Botanical Garden Foundation, Inc. is a non-profit, tax exempt organization formed by and coordinating the activities of its Affiliated and Associated Members in the San Diego area (including the SDCOS).

The Foundation had its inception in 1962 when the San Diego Floral Association, at the suggestion of the San Diego County Orchid Society, called a meeting of all interested clubs and societies to consider ways to develop a Garden Center and establish overall leadership.

Organization of the Foundation resulted. It now represents more than 55 groups with a combined membership of more than 6,000. The Foundation also solicits memberships, sponsors, and contributors.

The Garden Center, A Dream Come True (continued on next page...)

In the 1960 Bartholemew Master Plan for Balboa Park it was noted that more than 50 garden clubs in the San Diego area were an important community resource. The report noted the need for a gardening leadership organization and a home for it in Balboa Park.

Answering this call, the various floral and garden groups organized and incorporated the San Diego Botanical Garden Foundation. In 1966 a Foundation Committee met with the City Council and called attention to the fact that nothing had been done about the Bartholemew Plan's recommendation. The Committee proposed that a Garden Center be built to replace the old Food and Beverage Building in Balboa Park.

A bond issue was submitted to the people, and with the campaigning by members of the San Diego Botanical Garden Foundation, the Committee of 100, and other groups, the bond issue passed overwhelmingly. Ground was broken in November 1969 and Casa Del Prado with its Garden Center became a reality when the building was dedicated and occupied in November 1971.

In Casa Del Prado there are many cultural activities under the sponsorship of the Park and Recreation Department of the City of San Diego. As a result of the Foundation's leadership at the inception of the program to build the Garden Center, the Foundation's Affiliated Members have priority in the use of the designated Garden Center areas.

This use averages more than seventy meetings a month by the Affiliated and Associated Members, including open house programs and public exhibits. These public programs attract thousands of people a month, with some special events, such as shows, drawing attendance of more than 6,000 over a two-day weekend."

Letter From the Editor

Dear SDCOS,

Early summer is Sobralia season in San Diego, and if you have any of these graceful-looking orchids with short-lived blooms, I hope you are enjoying the rewards of good horticultural practices. Other members of the Cattleya alliance should also be blooming for you this time of year (Lc.'s Blc.'s, Slc.'s, etc.) as the new growths harden and mature. Remember that light is usually the biggest limiting factor in blooming your orchids, and that the more light you can give your orchids without damaging them, the better they will bloom. Your reed-stemmed epidendrums should also be in full display, and many encyclias and their hybrids bloom this time of year also.

If your Phalaenopsis plants are done with their blooms and the spikes are no longer growing or branching (at all), this is a good time of year to repot them. Also, you can move them outside for the summer, but just make sure they don't get any direct (sun)light. Let them grow and do their own thing for the summer after you repot and don't push them too much, although forgiving Phalaenopsis are hard to overfertilize unless
