This month is another return engagement from one of our favorite presenters, Ron Parsons, from San Francisco, the highly esteemed Species Presenter. The title of his presentation is "Monopodial Orchids".

Ron made his last appearance with the San Diego County Orchid Society exactly two years ago when he provided a presentation on Strange and Unusual Dendrobiums. This presentation, about "Monopodial Orchids" will have the same level of high quality and interest, and will include coverage about Vandaceous and Angraecoid orchids. Ron has ten different presentations available; this one he assures will be well received.

Ron is known throughout the orchid world for his photographic talent of orchids. His collection of photographs has now grown to over 20,000 slides. What an achievement this is to have all those slides, and to have them all in some kind of a cataloging system to be retrieved for various presentations and publications.

Here are few words that Ron offered about himself:

Ron has been interested in orchids for 27 years, growing almost nothing but species for 23 years and photographing orchids for over 19 years. He belongs to the Peninsula Orchid Society and The Bay Area Pleurothallid Alliance as well as other Orchid Societies of California.

He also photographs many other plant families, with a special interest in California wildflowers. He grows carnivorous plants, cacti and succulents, and has made presentations on California Wildflowers, Carnivorous Plants, Cacti and Gesneriads. He has had many of his photos published in various orchid and plant magazines and books. Ron grows his orchids mostly under lights and in an unheated greenhouse. He has traveled to Australia, Mexico and several Central American countries to collect and photograph orchids.

[Andy Phillips](#) of [Andy's Orchids](#) will provide the plants for the Plant Opportunity Table. This should be another treat because of the range and diversity Andy has with his stock. One visit to Andy's Orchids and you can easily believe that Andy is the biggest species grower in the US and probably North America.

AKA: *Dendrobium harrisoniae* Hooker, *Maxillaria harrisoniae* (Hooker) Lindley, *Lycaste harrisoniae* (Hooker) B. S. Williams, *Colax harrisoniae* Lindley, *Maxillaria pubigera* Kraenzlin, *Maxillaria spathacea* Lindley, *Stanhopea harrisoniae* G. Don.

ORIGIN/HABITAT: Brazil near Rio De Janeiro. Plants grow on almost vertical, east facing rock cliffs at 700-2600 ft. (200-800 m). The plants grow exposed to strong winds and almost full sun with their roots buried in cracks in the rock face that contain detritus but little in the way of vegetable matter.

Cultural Recommendations:

The following recommendations are based on averages in the habitat which should be approximated in cultivation. Reports from growers are included when they report success with conditions in cultivation that are outside the range indicated in the habitat.

LIGHT: 3000-4500 fc. Since *B. harrisoniae* is normally found

growing in exposed locations on east facing cliffs, full morning sun with afternoon shading is indicated.

TEMPERATURE: Summer days average 77-80F (25-27C), while nights average 66-68F (19-20C), producing a diurnal range of 10-12F (6-7C).

HUMIDITY: 75-80% throughout the year.

WATER: Moderate water is required during the growing season. Care should be taken to keep water off the leaves of new growths.

FERTILIZER: A balanced fertilizer mixed at 1/4-1/2 recommended strength should be applied once a week during periods of active growth. After new growth is mature, use a fertilizer with less nitrogen and more phosphorus to allow the new growth to harden before winter and to promote better blooming the following season. To prevent salt buildup during periods of heavier fertilizer applications, the pot should be leached or flushed every month or so. This is accomplished by prewetting the media and then flushing with water equal to twice the volume of the pot.

REST PERIOD: Winter days average 70-72F (21-22C), while nights average 58-60F (14-16C), producing a diurnal range of 10-12F (6-7C). Along with the cooler temperatures, water should be reduced to occasional misting or light watering and fertilizer eliminated for about 2 months in winter. Gradually resume normal water and fertilizer applications when new growth starts. Successful growers report that these plants should not be treated too well in winter. They suggest that water and fertilizer applications be restricted to every second or third time that Cattleyas are watered and fed. The pseudobulbs should shrink and even shrivel a bit during the winter rest. In addition, growers indicate that plants should be placed high in the



greenhouse to receive maximum light.

GROWING MEDIA: *B. harrisoniae* grows well mounted on slabs or rafts if high humidity can be maintained and sufficient water can be provided. Medium sized fir bark produces good results for most growers who use pots. Successful growers suggest that these plants grow well in a potting mix more like one used for *Paphiopedilum* than one used with *Cattleya*. They further indicate that fir bark with a little coarse sphagnum and some perlite added produce excellent results.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Because these plants are intolerant of being disturbed once established, repotting should be done only when necessary and then only when new root growth is starting. When dividing, each division should consist of 4-5 pseudobulbs. Growers report that they have never found what initiates blooming, and that some plants never bloom. Whether or not they were providing the conditions indicated above is not known.

Plant and Flower Information:

PLANT SIZE AND TYPE: *B. harrisoniae* is a medium sized 10-16 in. (25-41 cm) lithophyte that is sometimes found growing as an epiphyte.

PSEUDOBULBS: The clustered, ovoid pseudobulbs are 2.0-3.5 in. (5-9 cm) tall and often suffused with red-brown, especially near the apex.

LEAVES: The single oblong leaf is 7-12 in. (18-31 cm) long and may be 5 in. (13 cm) wide. It is stiff and upright, leathery in texture, and glossy dark green.

INFLORESCENCE: Normally 2 per growth, they emerge from the base of the newest pseudobulbs. They are usually about 2 in. (5 cm) long and bear 1-2 flowers.

FLOWERS: The 2.5-3.0 in. (6-8 cm) flowers are waxy in texture, long lasting, and are heavily fragrant. The oval-oblong sepals and petals are spreading with a smaller concave dorsal sepal. Usually white, they may be yellowish or greenish yellow. The large lip is 3 lobed, hairy, rich wine-purple to magenta-red with darker veins.

HYBRIDIZING NOTES: *B. harrisoniae* has not been used extensively in breeding, but it has been successfully crossed with other members of the subtribe *Lycastinae* as well as with allied genera such as *Zygopetalum* and *Huntleya*.

It's time to start priming your plants for display at the annual fall Orchid Fair, October 13th and 14th. The Fair features ribbon judging, as well as judging by American Orchid Society (AOS) and Cymbidium Society of America (CSA) accredited judges.... so who knows, your plant just might win an award!

Bring your plant(s) to the Activity Center (that's the first building on your right past the main gate entrance) at the Del Mar Fairgrounds. Plant Registration Hours are:

Friday, October 12 3:00 pm to 8:00 pm
Saturday, October 13 7:00 am to 8:00 am

If you enter through the Solana Gate (north entrance on Via de La Valle), parking should be free anytime on Friday, and Saturday only before 8 am to drop off plants.

Plant registration is free, and you can enter as many plants as you like. Friendly folks will be there to help with any questions. So whether you are a novice, an 'old-timer', or somewhere in between, bring your blooming beauties in for plant registration so they can be part of the big show!

Let me introduce myself. My name is Hodaka Watabe, Hootie to my friends. I am Japanese but have lived in Malaysia for 10 years as manager of an orchid establishment. At present I am also involved in preparations for the 17th WOC which will be held in Malaysia from 24 April to 2 May 2002. Starting with this issue of OGD I will bring you regular news about the 17th WOC in the hope that many of you will decide to attend.

This time I would like to provide you with some general information. The conference is organized by the city council of the City of Shah Alam which is just outside the capital of Malaysia, Kuala Lumpur. In many ways it is a brand new city with beautiful parks, broad avenues, ultramodern facilities and an architecturally impressive blue-domed mosque.

About 70% of the country is covered with green and contains many beautiful and some endangered, but well protected orchid species. In addition we have many orchid gardens, nurseries and laboratories all within easy reach of those who want to see them. Our internal transportation network is excellent. Roads are wide and well constructed. The country is well run and safe. Rental car agencies, gas stations, hotels and restaurants abound. Those who prefer domestic fare will find all major international food chains here. Prices are low and the Malaysian Ringgit is valued at 3.8 to the US dollar. There are no currency restrictions for tourists. Banks and legal money changers are everywhere.

It is easy to fly to Kuala Lumpur. Major international airlines like Singapore Airlines, Malaysian Airlines, Japan Airlines, Turkish Airlines, China Airlines, Saudi Arabia Airlines, United Airlines, ANA, Lauda Air, EVA Airlines, Korean Airlines, KLM, QUANTAS, and many others fly to the new Kuala Lumpur airport from all over the world. Fares can be low especially if booked in advance. Contact the airlines directly, your travel agent, or one of the many travel websites.



Trip of a Lifetime!

17th World Orchid Conference

Shah Alam, Malaysia

April 24-May 2, 2002

What international event happens every three years, brings together orchid lovers from all over the world, as well as hundreds of thousands of blooming orchids, and it's all flavored with the beauty and hospitality of the host city? It's the World Orchid Conference! Ask anyone who has attended one over the years, and you'll no doubt hear memories of meeting interesting new friends, adding a few (or more) exotic orchids to their collection, learning more about orchid growing from world-renowned lecturers, viewing scores of magnificent exhibits, and side trips to interesting foreign locales.

The last WOC was held in Vancouver, B.C., in 1999, and at least a dozen SDCOS members attended. Next spring the 17th WOC will be held in Shah Alam, Malaysia, near the capital city of Kuala Lumpur, from April 24th through May 2nd, 2002. The Conference calendar promises an exciting list of events, including Exhibits, Commercial Sales, Judging, Preview Reception, Judges Breakfast, Poster Exhibition, Scientific Sessions, Grower/Hobbyist Sessions, Lectures, and Closing Ceremony. Attendees can register for the entire conference, or just for a day, depending on their interests.

Besides the official conference activities, the hosts have arranged dozens of social events to choose from, including Royal High Tea with the Prince of Selangor, Handicraft and Shopping Tour, Feng Shui Tour, Kuala Lumpur by Night, and Historical Malacca Tour, to name a few. A number of special Orchid Tour packages have also been arranged, including a trip to Mt. Kinabalu, Sabah, Mulu Caves, Sarawak, (both on the island of Borneo), Sumatra Orchid Safari, Thailand, Philippines, and Singapore. Several reputable orchid travel guides, including Leona Bee and Eric Hansen, have planned their own special itinerary for small groups with an individual focus (see contact information below).

You might wonder, "Can I buy orchids at the WOC, and bring them back home with all the permits required?" You bet! The hosts at the WOC in Vancouver made it fast and easy, and the Malaysian hosts will certainly follow suit. Phytosanitary inspectors and CITES officials were available throughout the show in Vancouver, staffing a booth right on the sales floor. You would simply purchase your plants at the show and make a list, including the vendor(s) name. Then a day or two before you leave, take the list to the CITES booth at the show, along with a copy of your import permit (free, but you must obtain one before you leave) and pay the necessary permit fees, around \$15-20, as I recall. When you arrive in the U.S., you would declare the plants, show them your paperwork, and you should

be all set to pot them up at home. If you are considering buying orchids at a nursery elsewhere in Malaysia, make sure they can provide the phyto and CITES permits needed for export. If so, they can likely mail the plants to you with all the paperwork prepared, so they will arrive shortly after you return home.

With advance planning, a trip to next year's WOC need not break the bank. Convenient hotel accommodations are available to fit every budget, especially if you travel with a companion. Since rates are per room, not per # of guests, you can divide the nightly rate in half with your companion. Rooms are still available at the Cititel, a 4 star hotel just 20 minutes by coach from the Conference, for \$54 a night..., but don't wait long to reserve a room. Malaysian food is a multicultural experience, blending Chinese, Indian, and Indonesian influences. By dining where the "locals" eat, rather than at tourist-oriented venues, you can find meals that are both economical and delicious. Air fares these days are highly competitive; with some searching on the Internet and a little flexibility in travel days, you can find a good value.

I hope this information plants a seed of possibility in your mind, such that you consider participating in the next WOC in Malaysia. Imagine being surrounded by orchids, Asia, and orchid friends....doesn't that sound like a Trip of a Lifetime!


