



# Ron Parsons: Orchid Rarities and Oddities

At our Zoom meeting on Tuesday, January 5th, we will be pleased to hear from Ron Parsons on the topic "Orchid Rarities and Oddities." This talk features some of the strangest and rarest plants in the orchid family and includes both terrestrial and epiphytic species. The majority of terrestrial orchids are not in cultivation, and many of those shown were photographed in nature. Most of the epiphytic species presented are in cultivation, and, though some may be relatively common, others are not; hopefully all will inspire awe.

Ron Parsons has been growing orchids for more than 45 years and has been interested in species orchids for most of that time. Ron loves to photograph orchids and most other flowers whenever he can, whether it be on



trips to see them in nature or in collections. He loves to travel to see orchids in the wild and does so as often as possible.

Ron has more than 80,000 digital images, most of which are of orchids, and still retains a slide library that exceeds 100,000 botanical images. He has 4,000 published photos that have appeared in magazines, periodicals, journals, and books.

Ron has co-authored four botanical books, all with Mary E. Gerritsen. The first two, published by Timber Press, are Masdevallias, Gems of the Orchid World and Calochortus, Mariposa Lilies and their Relatives. Their third book, a large, luxurious, 18.5 pound, two-volume set, A Compendium of Miniature Orchid Species was published by Redfern Natural History Productions in January of 2014, and has 1,200 pages, 1,800 photos (1,600 are his), and features 500+ species in detail with many others included for comparison. In 2019. The American Orchid Society Guide to Orchids and their Culture was released and is now already on its third printing.

Currently, they are working on a second edition of *A Compendium of Miniature Orchid Species*, which will have over 1,100 new photos, including photos of nearly 500 species not in the first edition. There will now be four volumes and more than 2,600 photos, with up-to-date text revisions and taxonomy. Ron willingly shares his knowledge about plant habitats and suggestions for culture with all who are interested. Follow him on flickr.com, or visit his website, flowershots.net.

Culture Class: "Orchid Roots" for Beginners, a Free Internet Orchid Database, by Alex Nadzan Wednesday, January 6th, at 7:30 PM

Orchid Roots (<u>www.bluenanta.com</u>) is a free internet orchid database that can provide useful information to the orchid beginner and experienced orchid enthusiast alike. One can search the genus and name of the species or hybrid or just the species name.

For orchid species, it can provide origin and distribution, synonym names, and immediate offspring information. For hybrids, it will give the most recent genus name, parentage information, and a list of immediate offspring made from the hybrid. In addition, several pictures are available for many of the species and hybrids. Users are encouraged to submit photos through a Facebook page.

Alex will walk you through the basics of the database and provide some examples to demonstrate Orchid Roots capabilities and then compare it with the more expensive Orchid Wiz database.
