

Getting your plants outdoors for a breath of fresh air for the summer Text by Bruce Berg

So, if you are like me, summertime is the time to get my plants outside where they can get fresh air and bright sunlight and be happy, happy, happy! So how and what do we do to get our plants out there?

First, we need a place for them to go where they can get bright, but not direct light, as much of it as we can provide. Some growers have spreading trees or patios, where we just need some way to keep the creepy crawlies away from our plants. Years ago, I bought a steel frame canopy from Harbor Freight for about \$100 and modified it by cementing a length of 2" PVC into the ground. It fits into the pipe of my kit car canopy to provide wind shear protection. I found that Farm Tec will custom cut heavy clear tarp with grommets spaced to your specifications. I hang some mesh screen under the plastic tarp using some PVC pipe to support the mesh when I think the sunlight will be too intense during our summers.

The only thing left to do is to build shelves. I haven't done it yet, but I think that I can buy some ABS pipe and put together a shelving unit. I put cross bars on my shelves, and then lay corrugated tin sheets on top. If you do some head scratching and figure things out ahead of time, you should be able to put everything together without doing any cutting, except for PVC pipe. The thing you might want to do is make your shade structure wide enough so one corrugated tin covering can fit over the supports, making each bench four feet wide.

Likewise, you can mount your plants by mounting a piece of 4x4x10x10 galvanized chicken wire fencing to your vertical tubing. Larger mounting pots can likewise be hung from the rafters. If you have pressurized water system to water your plants, use PVC pipe, using galvanized wire to hold the pipe from the roof framing. Then support a 1/2" watering tube wired to the PVC pipe that you can use to connect misting heads. If you want to aim the heads, use the PVC pipe and use #12 or #10 wire to wrap around the pipe and also around the 1/4" hose to aim the spray heads. The pipes can be supported by the same wire. If you are worried about the weight of the water bending the PVC pipe, add another support wire. One wire per leg of your structure should do the trick. It would also work better if your shade frame used ABS pipe. I used wood to make the framing inside my shade area and also my greenhouse, but now that a 2x4 costs about \$8, you might look for alternative building materials. The greenhouse kits that I looked at cost several thousand dollars, before adding pumps and fans.

A little trick when working with PVC is that you can make a bend of any angle by using 2 "T" connectors, and a short piece of pipe between them. Dry fit the pieces and then glue the pieces that you want to stay tight. Double check alignment moving any sections in place, and then finish gluing!


