Ken Cameron: The Power of Movement in Orchids: Fast Action Floral Snap-Traps in Porroglossum

Everyone is amazed the first time they see the flowers of Porroglossum, and you will be too! In fact, Charles Darwin was fascinated by the power of movement in plants, and if he had known about the pleurothallid genus Porroglossum, he almost certainly would have considered these small Neotropical plants to be among the most remarkable of all orchids. I say this because physical stimulation of the flower's labellum causes it



to actively snap inward thrusting pollinators against the column in a sort of floral trap. To better understand these orchids, we reconstructed their evolutionary history using a combination of different types of genetic data. For our movement / kinematics study we recorded high-speed videos of the active, floral snap-traps of nearly all Porroglossum species while in Ecuador at Ecuagenera Nursery, and used computer software to calculate various features of their motion. A strong pattern of correlation between the movement of these orchids and the elevations at which they grow emerged. Our study, therefore, considers the function, structure, pollination biology, and 'behavior' of these remarkable orchids through the lens of their natural history. Some tips on their cultivation in modified chilled wine coolers will also be presented.

Biography:

Ken Cameron, Ph.D. is a Professor and Chair of the Department of Botany & Conservation Biology at the University of Wisconsin-Madison where he also serves as Director of the Wisconsin State Herbarium, a collection of more than 1.3 million plant specimens. He has published more than 100 scientific papers and books on the biology of different orchid groups, but is best known for his research on Vanilla and related orchids. Ken was recognized by the American Society of Plant Taxonomist with the Peter Raven Award for Exceptional Botanical Outreach in 2014 and is highly sought after as a speaker for orchid societies around the country.

GOOD NEWS! We can finally have a potting workshop again and you are invited! Bring your orchids and learn to repot with all supplies on hand and instruction included. The workshop starts with a pot-luck lunch and will be held at SDCOS President Debby Halliday's beautiful tropical garden in Rancho Santa Fe.

It's an excellent way to meet some of your officers and long-time members in a relaxed and friendly setting. We'll have lunch together with a potting demonstration followed by time to work on your own plants. There should be plenty of helpful experienced members on hand to answer questions or assist you.

We will meet at **12 PM** for lunch on the patio and then get to work. Ben Machado, of Calavo Gardens, will provide medium and a range of pots. We will also supply scissors, labels, stakes, gloves, etc., so you only need to bring your plants. For best results, they should be showing new root growth. That will ensure that they take off and grow immediately with minimum transplant shock.

We are asking for a fee of \$5 per plant to cover the supplies you use. Ben will also have a few other items on hand for sale if you need them. He specializes in supplies for orchid growers and is a long time SDCOS member.

Please bring a lunch dish to share. We'll provide drinks and utensils. You are invited

to enjoy the meal and conversation and take a tour of Debby's greenhouse and gardens before or after the workshop.
