

# Successful October 2021 Orchids in the Park Show

Our first orchid show since January 2020 was a resounding success. In spite of COVID protocols and some hiccups along the way, we had beautiful plants to show and lots of visitors. Dave Hoffmaster pulled together a full section of vendors and chaired the show in spite of his recent knee replacement surgery. Special thanks to Jack Schaefer and Bob Clark for saving the day when the truck rental fell apart, making multiple trips in their own trucks to get everything we needed to the park. We had hoped to have more volunteers, but those who came were dedicated and efficient, and together we pulled it off! Thank you one and all!

19 members brought in plants to give us a total of 169 orchids on display. Many of you tried out the new pre-registration system. It

proved to be very important as we had over 40 full sized cattleyas and were able to plan in advance where to put them all. That saved a lot of time and effort. I hope more of you will try the system in January. It also makes creating tags at the show much more efficient. Pam Peters capably managed both our registration and ribbon judging, and the judging teams had much to enjoy. The quality of the plants was outstanding. Rarely have we seen so many well-deserved blue ribbons!

Our James & Lise Wright Best of Show winner was Miltonia Anne Warner 'Ruth Kelly' by George Pflaum. This well grown and glorious plant also won the Forrest Robinson Cultural Award. It was a huge plant, and totally covered with deep purple flowers. The Siv Garrod Most Unusual Species Award went to *Scaphosepalum gibberosum* by Bill Loy. This was also a well deserved win for this miniature specimen with its wonderful water buffalo horns. Bill's table display was a real treat filled with all sorts of fascinating species. Our People's Choice voting was the best ever with over 700 votes cast. The whole point of the voting is to slow our visitors down and encourage them to really look at the orchids. It worked very well. As always, they choose a great variety of plants. 101 different plants received at least one vote. 18 of our 19 exhibitors had at least one plant chosen as a favorite by someone. The winner was Dendrochilum cobbianum brought in by Debby Halliday. The other top 10 winners are also shown in a following table.

From the ballots we also learned that 70% of our visitors came because they noticed our beautiful signs in the park. Carol Kerr both designed and placed our signs all over the park to let everyone know about our show. We are so grateful for her support and help.

Because of COVID rules, we had to cancel our popular Kids Corner, but were able to host orchid classes on the patio outdoors.

Ben Machado, Alex Nadzan, Nico Goossens, Kay Klausing, and Debby Halliday all gave lectures and demonstrations to interested audiences. Band practice in the afternoon gave us some background noise, but we made it happen.

Our sales area had a banner weekend! Myra DeTate and her dedicated helpers processed over \$22,000 in gross sales, netting \$2300 for conservation and \$3800 for the club. Myra noted that more than 1000 individual items were sold. Rachel Burns

capably managed Conservation Sales. The volunteers in the plant hotel gave our guests a safe place to keep their purchases while they enjoyed the rest of the park.

Shows take a lot of effort from a lot of people, but the satisfaction of showing our beauties to an amazed and admiring public and giving them a place to buy special orchids makes it all worthwhile. Working as a team with other members to create such a positive experience always reinforces my love and appreciation for this great club. **Thank you all. Well done.**




