Jose Carlos Lopez: The Four Seasons of Cattleyas

This month we're excited to have a new local speaker talk to us in person in Balboa Park; Jose Carlos Lopez will be presenting one of his talks, The Four Seasons of Cattleyas, as well as providing plants for the opportunity table.

Jose Carlos Lopez is a Business student at Mira Costa College who has been cultivating orchids for over seven years. His orchid venture began at the age of 13 years old when he started to follow his father to work at Sunset Valley Orchids. Before he knew it, he was volunteering at the nursery and was helping clean orchid flasks, repotting orchids, and doing small tasks. Carlos eventually began to become more involved in the nursery's operations and maintenance and started to take part in attending orchid shows. He is currently the manager of Sunset Valley Orchids and has



years of experience with Cattleya, Catasetum, Australian Dendrobiums, and Sarcochilus. Jose Carlos Lopez is currently training to become an American Orchid Society Judge and works with Orchid Digest as well.

This presentation will include information on caring for Cattleyas throughout the year and will include cultural cues for species and hybrids that root at different times. We will explore the species that bloom in each discussing their different season, varieties and important cultural requirements. From the large flowered unifoliate species the to fragrant and colossal bifoliate Cattleyas, this talk will also showcase a few hybrids too.



The next orchid show will be **THIS WEEKEND**, **July 29 – 31**, in Balboa Park so get ready as we have a lot to do. This event will be both a show and a sale so prep your orchids to display and make room on your bench for a new one.

The purpose of the show is to show the beauty of orchids to all the people that attend. If you have orchids in flower, please consider bringing them so we can show them off. We need to fill the room with blossoms and the more, the better. You may bring in your plants Friday afternoon between 3 and 7 or between 8 and 9 AM on Saturday morning. You will be able to pre-register your plants online as we did for the Spring Show or register them when you bring them in. The show will feature both ribbon and AOS judging so prep your orchids to show their best.

We request that any plant brought in for display be left at the show until closing which will be at 4:00 Sunday afternoon.

As always, we need help to pull off a show like this. It starts with a crew picking up all the materials we need from our locker and bringing them to Balboa Park. The show room then needs to be divided into display and sales areas with all the necessary lattice and tables. We are dependent on our members to set up the room, so if you are available, please consider working a shift. We have a range of jobs from setting up the room on Friday to taking it all down on Sunday. In between, there are lots of less demanding jobs such as cashier and security that need people to work them. A complete list of the positions and the times we need can be seen on our web site, <u>sdorchids.com</u>. Just click on the volunteer tab on the left side of our home page and the list will appear. I should mention that you earn a Volunteer Reward Ticket for every day you volunteer, and that ticket can be your chance to win a plant at a raffle.

Conservation will have a sales booth at the show so if you have plants to donate, bring them in Friday afternoon between 3 & 7 or Saturday morning before the show opens.

[5] Galeottia burkei 'Sunset Valley Orchids' AM/AOSExhibited by Fred ClarkeAwarded AM, 84 points














Fūkiran Society of America Show Text by David Vandenbroek, First VP

The <u>Fūkiran Society of America</u> held its 12th Annual Exhibition and Judging this month.

Neofinetia falcata (now Vanda falcata) has been collected and appreciated in Japan for centuries. There, these orchids are primarily collected and displayed for characteristics other than flowers, including leaf shape, leaf texture, leaf variegation, root tip color, and the shape of the ridge where the leaf joins the main plant. During judging, the quality of the pot and the moss ball the plants are potted in are also heavily evaluated.

At this event, Jason Fischer, Satomi Kasahara Davis of <u>Seed Engei</u>, and Satomi's father Mr. Kasahara, who flew in from Japan, served as judges for plants brought from across the United States. They also took time to provide feedback on plant culture to all who asked. Five winners were chosen, including our very own Phyllis Prestia!

This event also included speakers on everything from newly recognized varieties, to potting techniques, to how to make Fūkiran pots, and more.

The event was hosted by <u>Cal-Orchid</u>, in Santa Barbra, directly across from the <u>Santa</u> <u>Barbara Orchid Estate</u>, during their annual Summer Hummer event. The three exhibitions, open houses, and sales make for a great excuse for a weekend trip to Santa Barbara – or a very long day trip for this author... :)
