

Carol Klonowski: Tolumnia

Carol Klonowski has been growing orchids since the 1980's when a friend in Berkeley, California, gave her a cattleya orchid and it bloomed out with three big, dark lavender flowers and an intoxicating fragrance. She built an entire greenhouse in her backyard to accommodate the precious plant, which only led her to buy more orchids. Then another friend gave her a gift membership to the Orchid Society of California, and it's been a serious hobby ever since.

Carol has served as Director, Vice President, and President of the Orchid Society of California for most of the past two decades and is currently a fully accredited Judge with the American Orchid Society in the California Sierra Nevada Judging Center.



Carol will be talking to us about Tolumnia, a genus previously known as the "equitant oncidiums". The genus, split off from *Oncidium* in 1986, has charming flowers clustered at the top of slender stems on plants that are compact. Hybridization of tolumnias is a story that moves from the Caribbean to the Hawaiian islands, and back again. Latest hybrids have taken advantage of the many colors and patterns in these diminutive 'Dancing Ladies'. With proper culture, these plants can be a part of any orchid collection.

The plant table this month will be provided by Lisa Humphreys and promises to be a great show – come prepared to buy some tickets!





[1] Fdk. Doubtless 'SVO II' AM/AOs Exhibited by Fred Clarke Awarded AM, 88 points


[2] *C. walkeriana* 'The Pinkprint' AM/AOS Exhibited by Jose Carlos Lopez Awarded AM, 82 points

SDCOS Show Registration Schedule Revised

The SDCOS Show Registration Schedule has been revised and will take effect for the January 2023 show.

The new schedule will be used for all shows. For the April show, there are no longer designations for Amateur or Open / Commercial Sections. The Schedule was updated for clarification purposes and to be more in alignment with our current shows. Some minor changes to classes, footnotes, and the following section name changes:

- Section 15 Large Species A to S (Angraecum to Masdevallia)
- Section 16 Large Species A to P (Maxillaria to Zygopetalum)
- Section 17 Small Species A to S (Angraecum to Masdevallia)
- Section 18 Small Species A to P (Maxillaria to Zygopetalum)
- Section 19 Small Displays 4' x 4' or less
- Section 20 Large Displays 6' x 4' or greater
- Section 21 Vendor Displays 6' x 4' or greater

The URL for the new Schedule will be posted on the SDCOS website in early January. An email blast with the new Show Schedule as an attachment will be sent out to the general membership by mid-January.


