Pankaj Kumar: Orchid Diversity of Hong Kong S.A.R. (P.R. China)

We are excited to have Dr. Pankaj Kumar speak with us virtually this month about the orchids of Hong Kong.

Dr. Pankaj Kumar is a renowned expert in orchid ecology and taxonomy, with over 21 vears of experience in this field of study. After his doctoral and post-doctoral training on the systematics and ecology of orchids in Central India and the Western Himalaya, whilst based at two of the most prestigious Indian institutes, Wildlife Institute of India and Forest Research Institute, he worked at Kadoorie Farm and Botanic Garden (Hong Kong) as a Botanist, focused on taxonomy, ecology, and conservation of orchids and plants in the Indo-Myanmar other Biodiversity Hotspot and South Asia in general. Dr. Kumar is now a visiting scholar at Texas Tech University. He has published widely (126 total publications) on taxonomy, ecology. illegal orchid trade. conservation assessments. His publications include new species descriptions and taxonomic appraisals, habitat ecology, plantpollinator interactions and wild orchid trade in reputed peer-reviewed journals and a book on orchids of Laos PDR. He is an active member of various IUCN SSC Specialist Groups, Hong Kong Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan and is the Red List Authority for Orchids of Asia. Besides orchids, Dr. Kumar enjoys archery, birding,

botanical/digital illustration, hiking, and wildlife photography in his leisure time.

Dr. Kumar will be speaking to SDCOS about the orchid diversity of Hong Kong. Located on the easternmost margin of Indo-Myanmar Biodiversity Hotspot, Hong Kong has a very small land area of around 1100 km², the third highest population density in Asia, and yet harbors a very high biological diversity. The area probably had tropical seasonal rain forest in past that was denuded primarily for agriculture for hundreds of years, and then some vegetation was burnt during the World War II along with occasional man-made fires. With plantations and better legal protection, the remnant primary vegetation in small patches thrived, expanded, and gave way to colonization of new species through gradual succession.

Today Hong Kong harbors nearly 2100 species of vascular plants including around 140 members of family Orchidaceae with representation from all five subfamilies. At the same time, new species as well as new records are being reported frequently. The presentation is based on 11 years of orchid study and hikes in Hong Kong. It is an attempt to showcase the colorful world of native orchids of Hong Kong.

Our opportunity table this month will be provided by El Jardin Tropical, a relatively new local orchid vendor. Juan Bonilla spoke to SDCOS in January and we are excited to receive some plants from El Jardin Tropical.



World of Orchids at San Diego Botanic Garden: How to Participate

From March 10 to April 09, the five-week World of Orchids show will take place in the elegant conservatory at the San Diego Botanic Garden in Encinitas. The plants that our members and the members of POS bring to display are what make this such a beautiful show. If you have not participated before, here's how it works.

All plants must be pre-registered so the garden can prepare name tags. I have emailed out registration forms for the first week. If you haven't received a registration form and would like to participate in the upcoming weeks, please email me at President@sdorchids.com. Because we are displaying blooming plants, we will need to take out the faded ones and bring in fresh ones every week after that. Tuesdays are the designated change-over days. I will send out plant registration forms each week on Wednesday. They will need to be filled out



and returned to me by the following Saturday. I forward that information to the gardens so they can prepare the name labels.

Pre-registered plants are brought in every Tuesday. The gardens are closed, but the gates are open for us on Tuesday morning. The plants will remain in the show until the following Tuesday, or longer if their flowers still look nice. Because the show is in a greenhouse, the plants do well, even if they are there for more than a week.

When you bring your plants, you will receive number tags to attach to each plant and the laminated plant name labels prepared by the garden. We prefer that you bring only the plants you registered, so they will have appropriate name labels. The numbering system allows us to track the plants and make sure you get them all back again. On the same day you bring in your plants, any plants being removed from the show will be available for pick up. We give everyone a delivery time to make sure there is always plenty of table space for dropping off your plants.

You do not have to bring plants every week to participate. We are excited to display your plants whenever they might be in bloom. It is quite a special show. The designer, Rene van Rems, always creates spectacular displays. If you want to be part of it, just send an email to president@sdorchids.com and we'll include you.

We will also be selling plants on some of the weekends. Member sales will be March 11-12 and 24-26. Conservation sales will be on

March 17-19. We will need both plants and volunteers. Sign up information will be at the meeting.

I hope you'll plan to be part of this month-long orchid event!

Cymbidium Sale for Conservation

A long-time orchid grower and former member of the San Diego County Orchid Society has donated his extensive *Cymbidium* collection to the SDCOS Conservation Committee. These plants will be available for sale at an open house on **Sunday, March 12, from 11 AM – 4 PM**. There are more than 200 plants, which were collected over the past 40 years from nurseries in San Diego and Santa Barbara. The collection includes primarily hybrids spanning a range of colors from white and yellow to red and spotted. Most of the plants are in 2-3 gallon pots.

Many of the plants will be in spike or in flower on March 12, and most have labels with plant names in the pots. Based on a sample of 12 plants, about 90% of the collection tested positive for Odontoglossum Ringspot Virus (ORSV). Despite this, the plants are vigorous and clearly have been cared for very well.

In addition to the plants, there are two greenhouses that also will be available when the plants have all been moved.

The plants are located at a private home in Poway. Because of limited space, people who are interested in attending the sale will need to make a reservation during a one hour time window between 11 am and 4 pm. Please send your reservation request to conservation@sdorchids.com or call Ron Kaufmann (619-994-7584). Reservations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis. The home address will be provided when your reservation is confirmed. Some photos from the collection are included.















SDCOS Spring Show April 21 - 23

Cypripedium, Epidendrum, Habenaria. Paphiopedilum, Phaius, Phragmipedium, Sobralia, and Zygopetalum - grown locally by San Diego County Orchid Society members.
