General Meeting, April 4th, in person at Balboa Park, Casa del Prado Room 101, and Simulcast on Zoom; 7:30 PM. Gilberto Castro: Orchids and Other Things in the Brazilian Amazon Text by Gilberto Castro, Speaker, with additions by David Vandenbroek, First VP

SDCOS is thrilled to welcome the *very* experienced Gilberto Castro to our society to talk to us about his life and travels in a talk we're calling "Orchids and Other Things in the Brazilian Amazon".

Gilberto Castro is a Brazilian born in Rio de Janeiro on April 8, 1949. He lived in the US from 1965 to 1966, spending his junior year at Benson High School, in Omaha Nebraska. He graduated with a degree in

Natural History from the "Instituto de Biologia", of the "Universidade Federal do Rio de Janeiro", in 1972, and from the "Faculdade de Educação" of the "Universidade Federal do Rio de Janeiro", in 1973.

Gilberto has a wide experience in the Amazon, where he has traveled since 1975, and where, over the last 47 years, he has guided a number of different expeditions. He guided his good friend, Margaret Mee, the famous British Botanical Illustrator that discovered and documented in watercolors several new orchids in the Brazilian Amazon, on the last of her 15 journeys to the Amazon in 1988.

Additionally, he has guided three underwater filming trips for the Discovery Channel, 17 trips for the Margaret Mee Foundation, five trips for Kew Gardens of London for Professor Guillean T. Prance, at the time Director of Kew, 39 scientific illustration trips with illustrator Dulce Nascimento, participated on the filming of the great "big screen" documentary Margaret Mee and the



Moon Flower, and since 2015 has guided five trips for The Orchid Conservation Alliance (OCA), in Rio Negro and some tributaries.

He was part of a five-person team to go to the top of the Eldorado waterfall in 2014 and, in 2015, he was on the first team ever to reach the bottom of the Eldorado waterfall, the highest waterfall in the Brazilian Amazon. He has also been involved in countless ecotours in the area and in the Pantanal (the wetlands on Midwest Brazil), that he crossed in off-road vehicles more than 20 times on





the 140-mile trek from east to west, and once on a solo crossing on foot on a west to east trek.

Of his more adventuresome trips he participated in four editions of the Camel Trophy, Off Road Expeditions: Madagascar in 1987, Brazil in 1989, Siberia in the old Soviet Union in 1990, and from Manaus to Georgetown in British Guiana in 1992.

While all this traveling and fun was happening, he also started a business, sold it after 21 years, then did some computer programming for a small company, in DOS



based dBase program (some of it is still being used), and managed for some 20 years a sports fishing operation in the Amazon.

Since 2006 when he built his houseboat "Otter", he has run most of his expeditions on the "Otter" as the 5 trips for the OCA.

This promises to be a very interesting talk and we hope to see you there!



San Diego Botanic Garden World of Orchids Show

The orchid show at the SDBG is currently in its 3rd week of five and it looks wonderful. We are now up to 233 plants on display from SDCOS and POS members. 25 growers have participated so far. Thanks to Ashley Grable's help, the whole process is going very smoothly. If you have not had a chance, you should definitely go see it. (And if you want to bring something in – let me or Ashley know!)

This show is unique in being staged in a state-of-the-art greenhouse with hanging gardens helping to complement our plants.



The SDBG volunteers dress every pot with melaleuca bark or specially made jardinieres and moss, so it all looks very natural. The design is another original creation by Rene Van Rems who is so talented at showing off our beauties. Seeing all the flowers in natural sunlight is a rare treat, allowing everyone to really appreciate the colors. Having the show in a greenhouse also means that our plants can safely stay as long as the blooms are fresh.

The management of the show is a carefully organized process. Ashley sends a registration form to anyone who wants to participate. It needs to be turned in via email by Sunday evening. Ashley uploads the lists to a spreadsheet and assigns each plant a number. She then sends the names and numbers to SDBG by early Monday. They make up laminated name labels for each entry. On Monday afternoon, Debby goes around the display and notes which plants are ready to leave or need grooming. She sends out pickup notices on Monday evening and the plants get pulled out and "undressed" early the next morning. Every Tuesday we have changeover day while the gardens are closed when members can bring in new plants and pick up the ones that have been pulled. When they arrive at the gardens, they receive an envelope with ID number tags and name labels for each of their orchids. Once the plants are tagged and ready, we hand them off to the Garden team and they take it from there. It's amazing how well it all works.

Five weeks of orchid shows is challenging, but the upside is your plant has chances to make the show. It's really nice to know that if that bud just barely misses one week, it will be perfect when the next week comes around. The show is very popular with the public and it is fun to see everyone marveling over our collections.

SDCOS has also been selling at the Orchid Marketplace which runs on the weekends during the show. We have had member sales on March 10-11 and 24-26, and conservation sales March 17-19 all supported and ably managed by Myra DeTate. The sales have gone well and have benefited the club. POS is having a plant sale March 31–April 2, so there are lots of shopping opportunities.


