

Did you know some AOS awards are given to the plants, others are given to the grower, and still others recognize new and unique trends? Paul and his wife, Ann, are both fully accredited AOS judges. This month we're excited to have Jose Carlos Lopez return to us to give a new talk of his on Habenarias. His talk last year to our society on the Four Seasons of Cattleyas was very well received, and it will be a great opportunity to hear about this beautiful genus.

Jose Carlos Lopez is a Business student at Mira Costa College who has been cultivating orchids for more than eight years. His orchid venture began at the age of 13 years old when he started to follow his father to work at Sunset Valley Orchids. Before he knew it, he was volunteering at the nursery and was helping clean orchid flasks, re-potting orchids, and doing small tasks. Carlos eventually began to become more involved in the nursery's operations and maintenance and started to take part in attending orchid shows. He is currently the manager of



Sunset Valley Orchids and has years of experience with Cattleya, Catasetum, Australian Dendrobiums, and Sarcochilus. Jose Carlos Lopez is currently training to become an American Orchid Society Judge and works with Orchid Digest as well.

This presentation will include information on the diverse genus of Habenarias, including a bit about what makes them special and how to care for them.


