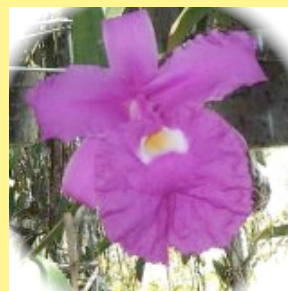

Summary of Minutes from the SDCOS General and Board of Directors Meeting(s) for February 2016

General Meeting: At the General Meeting, held on February 2nd, Ron Kaufmann presented the Conservation Committee's proposals for Grant Funding. A motion was made and passed to accept the proposals.

Board of Directors Meeting: The San Diego County Orchid Society's Board meeting was held on February 4th, 2016.

Attending were Scott LaBouff, Kay Klausung, Bruce Berg, Carol Berg, Jack Schaefer, Bob Clark, Carol Kerr & Carey McCoy. Debby Halliday was excused absent. The meeting was opened at 7:03 PM.

The Secretary reported that the January Board minutes were approved by email and were published in the February Newsletter.

The Treasurer presented the financial report for February. A motion was made & passed to file the report for audit.

The webmaster reported on updates to the website including Winter Show Awards and Photos.

The current Membership was reported as 325 active members.

The By-Laws have been emailed for review & comment.

Spring Show Co-Chair Jack Schaefer reported on progress on the Spring Show. Since the next Show Committee meeting was scheduled for Saturday the 6th, there was no report from a Committee meeting. However, Jack did report that commitments had been received from over 75% of the expected vendors and at least 50% of the Display booths were committed. It was reported that fabrication of new lath sections for the

expanded Best of Section table was in progress. Jack moved to allocate funds for additional tracklights and equipment. After some discussion the motion was passed. Initial work on the Show program was in progress.

Scott LaBouff, Society President, reported that Bruce Berg, Carey McCoy, Dave Hoffmaster and Jack Schaefer would be doing setup and teardown of the Society's display at the Newport Harbor Orchid Societys Show and Sale and Westminster Mall.

Also, Scott reported on the formation of a Nomination Committee to nominate new officers for the yearly election and that the San Diego Botanical and Garden Foundation (SDBGF) was in the process of evaluating storage assignments in Rooms 101 and 104 in the Casa del Prado building. Our Society has made one locker and two shelves available for reassignment. The SDBGF has taken no immediate action.

He also reported on the Balboa Park App. David Brown has been asked to find out what is required to have SDCOS "***Orchids in the Park***" Shows listed on the App.

Our 1st VP, Kay Klausung, reported that Tom Biggart will present "Orchids in Thailand" at the March General Meeting. Kay is also working on the publication of our Spring Show dates in the *Orchids* and *Orchid Digest* magazines.

Our 2nd Vice-President Debby Halliday was absent however it was reported that the Culture Class in March would feature Pam Peters and Debby Halliday discussing "Preparing your orchids for show".

Under General Board Member's Items, Carol Kerr discussed promotional materials.

Preparing Your Orchids for the Show – by Pam Peters

Early preparation of your orchids for entering in the show will pay off and add to your enjoyment of the hobby and our spectacular plant display. February preparation for the March show is the perfect time to start.

First, thoroughly check plants to make sure there are no insects on the leaves and flowers. If aphids or scale are visible, spray with diluted isopropyl alcohol or a Captain Jack's mixture. Then very carefully remove aphids with a q-tip. Scale might need a little extra nudging to remove. Finish with a light splash of water. Check the potting medium to be sure there are no snails, slugs or ants.

Cymbidium, phalaenopsis, and cattleya leaves can be washed with a cut lemon, neem oil, milk, or diluted dish detergent to get rid of the fertilizer residue and salts. Rinse with water and dry immediately with a soft cloth.

Hopefully cymbidiums will be in bloom this year at show time. Stake the spikes early so the flowers are nicely presented. Trim off dead leaves and leaf tips with razor blades (one per plant).

Clean cattleya alliance orchids by wetting the stems and pseudobulbs under a faucet and remove all dead sheaths and other dead tissue. A toughie sponge is helpful in doing this. Remove yellow or dead leaves and leaf tips with a sterile disposable razor blade. Stake and secure the flowers so that they are looking up and visible to the judges. Flowers may be beautiful, but if not properly staked, they won't win those ribbons.

Put your orchid in a clean plastic or terra cotta pot with that has no salt or fertilizer build-up. You may also use a cache pot.

Make sure your plant is secure in its pot and won't tip over. Before or after judging, the plant most likely will be moved to another spot. Remove the plant tag but tape your name to the bottom of the pot. Keep a list of the plants you bring in and what section they are in.

The joy of seeing your beautiful orchids on a display table with other members' plants is a source of pride. Receiving your first ribbon is total elation and a reward for your good growing habits.

Plant registration is Thursday, Mar 10 from 3:00 PM – 8:00 PM, and Friday morning, March 11 from 7:00 AM – 9:00 AM. The Schedule of Classifications for Plant Registration can be found on the SDCOS website <http://www.sdorchids.com/SpringShowSchedule2016.html>

Amateur growers can register plants as Amateur or Commercial. Registration tags should have the correct plant name (registration clerks can help you). Plants may be entered for American Orchid Society or Cymbidium Society of America judging. Please bring in your orchids and participate in our show!!!
