



Carrie Buchman: Restrepia, the easy Pleurothallid

We are pleased to have Carrie Buchman speaking to us this month from New Jersey about Restrepia: the easy Pleurothallid

Carrie Buchman been growing orchids for almost 40 years. She currently has over 300 orchids spanning the alphabet from Aerangis to Zygopetalum. She loves small, unusual and cute orchids. She grows in a converted sunroom, which is somewhere between a windowsill and a greenhouse, attached to her house with many going outside to enjoy the New Jersey summer. Her orchids have won ribbons in many shows including the prestigious Philadelphia Flower Show; and she has earned flower, cultural and botanical awards from the American Orchid Society.

Carrie is the president-emeritus and Show Chair for the North Jersey Orchid Society which is held annually at Rutgers University in New Brunswick, NJ, Co-chair of Orchids at the Philadelphia Flower Show, and an Associate Judge with the American Orchid Society's Northeast Judging Center.

Carrie is a native Pennsylvanian who grew up near Media and still has relatives in the Philadelphia area. She lives in Wyckoff, New Jersey with her husband, Tim, where proximity to New York City provides ample

opportunity to enjoy the theater and fine dining.

Carrie was graduated from Smith College with a double major in Physics and Math. She went on to earn a Master's Degree in Computer Science at Fairleigh Dickinson University. Much of her career was as a Software Quality Engineer in military, commercial and space aviation and, in the early days, anti-submarine warfare. She then moved to managing Quality Systems for Johnson & Johnson, from which she retired in 2012.

She is a frequent and popular speaker at Orchid Societies and Garden Clubs, and we're looking forward to hearing from her this month!

Taking Care of Your Orchid after it Blooms

After the flower has bloomed, with few exceptions, plants will not produce more flowers from the same pseudo bulb. This is the ideal time to do maintenance on the plant.

The object of maintaining your plant is to remove dead parts of the plant, including pseudo bulbs, dead roots; dead spikes; replacing old mix, and to repot or divide your plant. You also do not want to transmit plant virus from one plant to another. You must take care. Use disposable gloves. Keep your tools sharp and clean. Inspect your orchid, and if it looks like it may have a virus, test it. If it is infected, there is no way to cure the plant, toss it. I throw away the plastic pot also.

Smell the mix and if the plant looks good and the roots are not crawling out of the pot, you might just want to cut off dead flower spikes and let it go for another year. If the mix smells like a swamp, repot the plant.

Conventional wisdom tells us to wait to repot until you can see new green tips on the roots. This usually coincides with new growth. I repot once a year after the blooms drop.

First, remove the old flower stem. You can do this by using a sterilized pair of scissors or a razor blade, or other method that will remove the stem completely down to the pseudobulb. I remove the old wrinkly sheaths and inspect for scale or mealy bugs. If they are present, spray them with alcohol

and brush them away with an old soft toothbrush. Be sure to check both sides of the leaves.

Use sterilized tools. I recommend using either a solution of laboratory grade sterilant or Clorox. I also use a collection of scissors that I put back in a jar that has sterilant in it. Another option is to use flame used for soldering copper to sterilize the scissors by burning any virus that may be on the scissors. I prefer to use several pair of scissors so I can rotate using them. I use a pair of gardening shears for dividing large plant roots when I want to make a division.

Repot the plant. After washing out a pot for reuse, I clean it with a final rinse of a 1/4 strength Clorox solution. After using the potting mix to pot the plant, I add slow-release fertilizer (lawn fertilizer), and then I spray the newly repotted plants with “B 1” until liquid comes out of the bottom of the pot.

I have made a number of trades and gifts over time with members and, if they show me the plant, or a photo of their plant, we’ll talk about it! Remember this also when repotting and you have the chance to make a division.

If you see a plant at one of our meetings that you particularly like, you may ask the member to save a division for you when they next divide it and let them know what you have in trade. Use your best plants for trading. This is a good opportunity to introduce yourself to our members.
