Carol Beule: The Genus Lycaste Text by Carol Beule and Ashley Grable, First VP

Carol Beule is an EMMY award winning Costume Designer with a Master of Fine Arts in both Costume and Lighting Design from the University of Wisconsin, Madison. She was a professional Costume Designer for 40+ years, and has designed for Film, Commercials, Theatre Productions, and TV shows. She lived in NYC the first 15 years of her career and is now retired, after growing orchids in Southern California for the past 28 years.

In her search to find the perfect plant for her growing area, Carol discovered the Japanese orchid called *Neofinetia* (*Vanda*) *falcata* and various other species that thrive outside in Southern California. *Lycaste* is one of those. Carol grows various forms of *Paphiopedilum*, *Phalaenopsis*, *Cattleya*, *Laelia*, *Dendrobium*, *Sarcochilus*, and Asian *Cymbidiums*.



Lycaste is an orchid that is native to the New World and is found from the Tropic of Cancer to Tropic the of There Capricorn. both warm are growing and cool species. growing who's growing conditions and


appearances are different. While they are often thought to be a greenhouse orchid, they can be grown alongside *Cattleyas* and any other outdoor growing, temperate-climate range orchid, when their specific needs are met. They also can easily become very large specimen plants.

Carol is a fully accredited American Orchid Society judge, the 1st VP of the Orchid Society of Southern California, recently served on the Board of The Orchid Digest, and leads the committee that creates the Society's display for the Huntington's annual October Orchid Show. She also visits Japan yearly when possible and is a member of their Japan Fuukiran Society.

When she retired, she started making ceramic pots for the Japanese / Korean / Chinese orchid called the *Neofinetia* (*Vanda*) *falcata*, Asian *Cymbidiums* and other small plants. She grows in 2 small greenhouses and outside in her yard in Studio City, CA. She has grown orchids for 25 years.

She recently wrote a 3-part article for the American Orchid Society monthly magazine on the pots used to display the *Vanda falcata* in Japan and the US. It was illustrated using some photos taken by her and other OSSC members. The 1st part started in February of 2022, and continued through to the April issue of last year.

It is almost January and that means the Winter Orchids in the Park Show & Sale is in a few more weeks. The show will be January 27 & 28 this year. Please check the website for the hours. It is time now to start thinking about which plants you want to display at the show. Be extra vigilant on pest control, and place your plants so the flowers open in their most attractive orientation. It means you arrive at the show with stickers already printed to put on your registration tags, saving you time and effort. More importantly, your show committee knows in advance what plants to expect and that makes the layout far more efficient.

Remember, you earn a volunteer reward coupon for every day you work. You also get to be a part of showing the public the wonders of our very special hobby! Jobs to be done include set-up and take-down, judging, cashier, security,

putting out signs, and even giving a class if you want to. It all makes a difference.

We already have a full group of vendors signed up to sell at the show. In addition to the usual offerings, this show is going to be one of your best opportunities to buy Cymbidiums. If you would like to sell some of your own plants, please let me know. We will make sure there is table space for you. Our shows have become quite popular with vendors and the space can get pretty full. It's harder to save you a spot if we don't know you're coming!


