Orchids of the Earth - 2024 Debby Halliday, Show Chair

What a great show! We broke a few records for the most plants at a show in the park -248, the highest sales - we even beat last year, and by far the most People's Choice ballots I have ever seen! As usual, the quality of the plants was top class. The room was filled with color and fragrance and joy. The selection of hybrids and species was so broad we had fewer than 20 duplicates. The public responded by keeping our show room busy all the time and by buying lots of plants. Thank you to all 25 members who brought in plants. Thank goodness most of you preregistered as we had over 30 Cymbidiums which was many more than expected. See elsewhere in the newsletter Pam's report of all the Best of Section winners.

Betty Kelepecz was our biggest winner, earning Best of Show and the Forrest Robinson Cultural Award with her stunning *Arpophyllum giganteum*. It really lived up to its name with over 40 flower spikes, all perfectly in bloom. She also won the Siv Garrod Most Unusual Species award for her *Schoenorchis juncifolia*. Congratulations, Betty!

People's Choice went to a fabulous specimen Dendrobium hybrid from John Alexander. This gorgeous plant displayed 9 pendant flower spikes with over 40 pink and yellow 2" flowers on each spike. It was a sight to behold. I am still working through the stacks of ballots, but it appears that at least 200 different plants received votes, with many receiving more than 50 votes. John's

plant received 287 votes for the win. Congratulations, John!

We had a full roster of classes offered by our volunteer instructors — Kay Klausing, Alex Nadzan, Nico Goossens, Ben Machado, Phyllis Prestia, Arnold Gum, and myself. Nancy Walters ran a busy Kid's Corner. Bob Clark manned the membership booth. A special thanks to our show committee who covered all the bases to create and manage this beautiful show: George Pflaum, Tom Corzine, Myra DeTate, Pam Peters, Ashley Grable, Carol Kerr, Juan Bonilla, & Kay Klausing. Also thank you to everyone who volunteered and showed up to make this show happen. You should all be very proud!

We are still finding our way with the Spring Show after leaving the Scottish Rite Center. This year our format was smaller than last year's and we didn't have room for displays, but the response from the public was still outstanding. I feel confident that we had a successful show financially this year and it was considerably easier to produce than the year before. The May meeting will be our awards banquet, with more pictures and details about this year's winners and this beautiful Spring Show. Please plan to come and celebrate a job well done.


