General Meeting, September 3, in person at Balboa Park, Casa del Prado Room 101, Room 101 and on Zoom; 7:30 PM. Daniel L. Geiger, Ph.D.: Taking pictures of small orchid flowers: from iPhone to SEM Daniel L. Geiger and Ashley Grable, First VP

Dr. Daniel L. Geiger has grown orchids since about 2004, specializing from in the overlooked genus Oberonia from early on. He has served on and chaired the American Orchid Society Research Committee and has held occasional board appointments with local orchid societies. He has given talks on orchids locally in California, as well as internationally - including Australia, UK, and Singapore - and he has visited herbaria around the globe (AMES, B, BM, CANB, E, F, K, L, MICH, MO, NSW, P, SEL, SOG, SING, US, W, WU, Z, ZU). He served as guest editor for Rheedea, the international, peer-reviewed journal that publishes original research articles in angiosperm taxonomy. He has authored 12 scientific papers on the genus Oberonia, plus a number of more popular accounts. He currently writes the global monograph of Oberonia, which has an estimated publication in 2027.





Additionally, Geiger is a globally recognized authority on abalone and minute marine snails (little slit shells). Equally recognized is his expertise in Scanning Electron Microscopy, as well as micro- and macrophotography. His images have appeared in numerous articles, books, and exhibits (e.g., Smithsonian Institution, Natural History Museum of Los Angles, Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History, US National Aquarium). He has co-authored five books and an estimated 80 scientific articles, and he has named over 100 new species of snails, crabs, fish, and orchids. Ten species. including one orchid, and one genus are named after him. He has held various editorial positions and is an appointed member of the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Mollusk Specialist Group.

Geiger obtained his first degree (Diplom Biologie I) from the University of Basel, Switzerland. His Ph.D. thesis from the University of Southern California (USC), Los Angeles, received the 2000 Annual Award from the Malacological Society of London. After a postdoc in molecular systematics at the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles



County and teaching appointments at USC, he worked at Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History from 2005 to 2024, where he is now Curator Emeritus of Malacology. In his spare time, he enjoys cooking, woodturning, photography, playing baroque viola d'amore (honorary member of the International Viola d'amore Society, e.V.), and teaches yoga (RYT 200 & vin).

Small orchid flowers are challenging to photograph. In his talk, "Taking pictures of small orchids flowers: from iPhone to SEM", Geiger will discuss the issues (depth of field,

diffraction, focus strategies, lighting, various limitations) and show how those issues can be addressed. His presentation will cover a wide range of techniques and equipment; he ubiquitous smartphones, starts with continues with compact cameras and mirrorless/SLR cameras, ventures into zstacking with regular cameras. stereomicroscopes and compound microscopes, and even discusses UV reflectance imaging (insect vision) of microfloral orchids. Eventually the talk



ventures into research imaging with a scanning electron microscope (SEM) of dried flowers (critical point drying, variable pressure SEM) and live flowers (environmental SEM), as well as chemical element mapping (energy dispersive X-ray spectrometry/analysis).

Another Successful Repotting Workshop Nate La Breche, Second VP

Around 20 SDCOS members attended the repotting workshop on August 17th at Debby Hallidav's house in Rancho Santa Fe. Members started arriving around 11:30 AM to socialize. A wide variety of food was brought for the potluck, ranging from deviled eggs to chocolate chip cookies. There was something for everyone's tastes! The food was enjoyed in the ample shade of the backyard patio. The repotting demonstration occurred after lunch. It consisted of three segments. First, Nate La Breche repotted a small Cattleya hybrid. Debby Halliday then repotted a Phalaenopsis hybrid and demonstrated dividing a large Cattleya hybrid. Finally, Stewart Walton discussed testing orchids for viruses using commercial kits. It was an interactive experience where participants asked questions about tool sterilization, container selection, and root health.

After the demonstration, it was time to get down to business. Most members had brought plants that needed attention, including Cattleyas, Cymbidiums, and Phalaenopsis. Tables with newspaper and burlap on the lawn served as repotting stations. There was a full complement of tools, gloves, labels, and waste bins available for the activity. It was rewarding to see the confidence of inexperienced members increase as they obtained handson experience. By the end, all the plants looked great in their new homes. After repotting was completed, Debby provided a her clean, well-organized tour greenhouse. It was a treat to see her

collection! Our goal of educating newer members about an important aspect of orchid culture while also providing an opportunity to meet people was achieved.

Special thanks to Ben Machado with Calavo Gardens, who took photos of the event and provided supplies, including media and potting containers. Also, thanks to Debby Halliday for providing the venue as well as Tom Biggart, Lisa Humphries, and Stewart Walton for general assistance. If you missed this event, do not worry. It is planned to be held again in June of next year. Also, be on the lookout for a workshop next spring concerning how to mount orchids. We look forward to seeing you at future workshops!




