David Vandenbroek, President



General Meeting, October 1, in person at Balboa Park, Casa del Prado Room 101, Room 101 and on Zoom; 7:30 PM. Dr. Harold Koopowitz: *Disas*: species, hybrids and their culture Harold Koopowitz and *Ashley Grable*, First VP

Harold Koopowitz is Professor Emeritus at the University of California at Irvine (UCI), where he taught biology and did research on conservation biology. He was also Director of the UCI Arboretum for twenty years. He has authored over a hundred scientific papers and books, many of which deal with orchids. He has travelled extensively in the tropics to study orchids.

For ten years, Harold was editor of the Orchid Digest. He is now its Editor Emeritus, and he continues to contribute to that magazine.

Harold is well-known as a *Paphiopedilum* hybridizer, but in recent years, he has turned his attention to the genus *Disa*. Recently, Harold was honored by the World Orchid Conservation Trust with their Medal for Horticulture for his work as an orchid hybridizer.



Besides playing with his plants, Harold's other hobby is writing. He is the author of a series of adventure novels about orchids. You can view his books on Amazon.com through this <u>LINK</u> or by searching for Koopowitz. Harold grew up in South Africa and moved to the US after university.

In his presentation, Harold will speak about *Disa*, a genus of approximately 180 orchid species indigenous to tropical and southern Africa, of which the best-known is *Disa uniflora*, or the "Pride of Table Mountain". His talk will cover *Disa* species and hybrids – many of which have brightly-colored flowers in reds, pinks, and oranges. He will also unlock the key to the culture for this mostly terrestrial genus, which is quite different from the culture of many other orchids. SDCOS is delighted to welcome one of the orchid world's celebrated experts to pull the veil back on this mysterious and beautiful genus.
