### **NOVICE MEETING**

March 1, 6:30 PM-Casa Del Prado-Room 101

With the upcoming annual show at the Scottish Rite Center at the end of the month I would like to encourage you to participate in the Amateur Tabletop Display section inaugurated at our 2010 show.

This section is included in judging and is awarded. This is an opportunity for you to show your creative side and have some fun. The few tabletop displays entered last year showcased orchids in personalized, imaginative arrangements. Tabletop displays need not be elaborate nor do they require you to have many orchids. A display can include as few as two or three orchids. The idea here is to present them in an attractive manner to accentuate the flowers' beauty with the use of color, arrangement and combination of orchid flowers and greenery.

To get you started I will show you some ideas with example displays and discuss the following sections/classes. Rules will be covered as well—yes, there are a few simple rules.

### **GENERAL MEETING**

March 1, 7:30 PM-Casa Del Prado—Room 101 By Bruce Berg, 1st Vice President

Thank you, Peter Lin for your whirlwind trip around the world looking at some very interesting and unusual orchids! Those who missed Peter's talk, missed out on an interesting review of orchids from around the world with information on some of the common plants we are familiar with as well as some very exotic plants that should also be able to find a home in our collections. Understanding how the plants grow in the wilds gives us some hints on how we can grow our plants in our collections. The talk was very well presented and a lively question and answer period afterwards indicated that the audience was interested in his talk.

Our March meeting will feature Neal Biggart who will give us an introduction to orchid genet-

ics. This should be an interesting talk because she will be helping us understand not only some of the basics of orchid genetics, but also she will help us with some of the nomenclature used in describing just exactly what genetics is all about. Neal Biggart describes herself as an Environmental Toxicologist, a designation that describes her lifelong interest in the natural world and the risks posed to living organisms by toxic compounds in food, water, and soil. She earned a Ph.D. in Genetics at UC-Berkeley, developed a research program that allowed her to demonstrate that heavy metals such as nickel, chromium, and cadmium cause specific mutations in human cells that can lead to cancer, and for the last ten years of her career, taught Bi-

# Monthly Report on AOS Judging at Quail Gardens

Judging at the Encinitas site (Quail Gardens, Administration (Ecke) Building) begins at 7:00 pm on the first Monday of each month. The facility opens at 6:30 pm. Anyone interested in orchids is encouraged and welcome at the sessions. Visitors may join the judging teams at their tables, but cannot participate in the judging process. Anyone who wants to exhibit plants for judging but is unable to bring the plants to Quail Gardens, please contact one the local judges or have others bring the plants to the facility.

At the February 7, 2011 Encinitas session eight cultivars were shown.

### Linden Burzell brought in

Cattleya loddigesii with two flowers and two buds on two inflorescences. The natural spread of the flowers is 10.5 cm. Sepals and petals are light pink, fading to lighter colors distally; the lip is off-white, side lobes pink, throat light yellow, striped light pink.

#### Betty Kelepecz showed

Masdevallia dimorphortrica with about thirty-five flowers on seven inflorescences. The natural spread of the flowers is 1.8 cm. Sepals and petals are dark maroon; the lip is similarly colored. AM/AOS.

Masdevallia mandarina with three flowers and



one bud on four inflorescences. The natural spread of the flowers is 8.5 cm. The sepals are white, flushed and striped rose-pink. Photo by Ar-

# Westminster Orchid Show Was Fun!

Last year was the first time our society entered a display in the Westminster Orchid Show and we were overwhelmed by the quality of the displays and the quality of the plants. We were invited to participate again this year in exchange for a promise by the Newport Harbor Orchid Society that they would reciprocate and enter a display in our Society's Spring Show.

Helen Pfister, Carol, and I did some brainstorming on how to put together a display following the theme "Orchid Extravaganza." We first had to figure out what an "Extravaganza" was. After that, we played around with different table arrangements to figure out how to display the plants. Most importantly, we were supported by the following SDCOS members who donated plants for us to add to the display: Renate Schmidt, Betty Kelepecz, Irma Adams, Ann and Paul Tuskes, Dave Hoffmaster, and of course, Helen, Carol, and yours truly. Four a.m. came awfully early, but Helen and I were determined to get our plants into the display area early so we could use wheeled carts (the mall opened at 10 am and no carts were to be allowed after that time). It was a nice drive up to LA and it was a breeze to do our setup with no one around to see our confusion.

The show was beautiful. Some of the other societies in the LA area also had booths at the show. The SDCOS display was awarded 2<sup>nd</sup> place for society displays. This was very rewarding because we thought that there were some truly awesome displays in competition. One of Renate's plants, *Angraecum* Lemforde White Beauty (see top photo on right), was awarded the trophy for the "Best in Class Vanda and Allied Genera." Many of the other plants that our members brought in were awarded ribbons.

There were many of the vendors from San Diego County that we are accustomed to seeing as well as some international vendors and some vendors from northern California. As we drove back home on Sunday afternoon after taking down the display and carefully packing all the plants into my pickup, we thought about the fun we had and what we might do for the next year's show.

Renate Schmidt gave an excellent presentation at the February meeting on some of her tricks on getting her plants to look their best for the show. In addition to the open areas for displaying plants for ribbons or trophies, remember that plants you enter with tabletop displays, or that you may wish to share with the SDCOS display, are eligible for awards too. Just be sure to fill out 2 entry tags for any plant not displayed in the open areas.

# San Diego County Orchid Society Board Meeting Minutes

## February 3, 2011

Attendees: David Brown, Carol Berg, Bruce Berg, Bob Clark, Genie Hammond, Patti Hoffmaster, Dave Hoffmaster, Scott LeBouff and Jack Schaefer.

President David Brown called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM.

#### **Officers Reports**

Minutes for the January meeting were approved prior to this meeting and were published in the February Newsletter.

Carol Berg presented the treasurer's report for January. Bruce Berg moved to file the report for audit and the motion carried.

#### **Committee Reports**

Winter show—the general feeling was that the show went well and was well attended. Plant sales were not what we wanted but the vendors and all the plants they offer add something to the show so there are no plans to change the format. There was some confusion from plant sales between vendor numbers and prices and we need to think of another way to mark these items. A bar code scanner would alleviate the problem but costs \$650 and is probably not worth the expense.

Spring show—the show committee held a meeting prior to the Board meeting. The major items that came out of that meeting included:

We have a total of 22 vendors that have committed to provide sales booths at the show. We need 26 to fill the sales area.

We are short of exhibits to fill the main showroom. We have 20 vendors or groups that have agreed to provide 8 x 8 exhibits and we need 26. More space will be provided for table top displays. Rules for table top displays has been publishes but we need more people to sign up for them.

The Show Schedule for judging was published on our web site. All trophies to be awarded at the show have been ordered and will be available by show time.

We have 36 people that have volunteered to work as judges and 8 volunteers as clerks. We could use 4 more judges and clerks.

Ranch Catering will provide lunches for the volunteers all three days of the show. Lunch will be free to volunteers and the menu will be the same as last year.

Genie Hammond will conduct corsage making classes on Saturday and Sunday at 11AM and 2PM.

#### Web Committee

We will modify the home page to make the upcoming spring show the main feature. We have included a map to Scottish Rite to help anyone interested in the show.

The web page will feature SDCOS shows and will have a link to provide additional information on our shows. We will continue to list other shows in southern California but they will be only in our upcoming events section.

Jack will schedule another web committee meeting for later this month.

#### **Old Business**

We have held the novice class in room 101 for the last several months on a trial basis. The general consensus is that this is working out and we can continue to do so for the foreseeable future. There is still an issue with background noise in such a large room but it will not prevent us from holding the class there.

The motivation behind moving the novice class to room 101 is to open up room 104 for AOS judging. Bruce Berg moved that the Board approve moving AOS judging to room 104 during our meetings. That will encourage our members to attend judging sessions and will allow the judges to participate in our meetings. The matter will need approval of the membership at the next general meeting before we can notify the ASO Judging Center.

There was some discussion relative to offering free SDCOS membership to high school and college students and a way to promote interest in the Society to people at an early age. The discussion was tabled for a month to allow us define which students would qualify.

#### **New Business**

The speaker for the general meeting will be Neal Biggart discussing orchid genetics.

The speaker for the novice class is to be determined.

Bruce Berg moved that we purchase a copy of "The Judge, the Hunter, the Thief and the Black Orchid" for use at our meetings. The cost of the DVD is \$15. The motion passed.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:05 PM.



#### **Letter From the Editor**

Dear SDCOS,
