#### **CULTURE MEETING**

One of our long time members, Ben Machado, is talking about *Schomburgkia* culture at this month's culture meeting.

Schomburgkias do well for Ben in his east county location, but he found that detailed culture information for Schomburgkias is seriously lacking. Through his personal experience and research he has a number of growing techniques that he is prepared to pass on to our members. At least a couple of the Schomburgkia species are somewhat readily available in the Southern California region; tibicinis and brysiana. Most of the other species are difficult to find and usually command a high price. That's why, when you get one you want to give it every cultural benefit for magnificent growth and blooming.

Ben has been growing orchids for 19 years and has evolved into his specialty interest, Schomburgkias. He has been a past board member of SDCOS and was Show Director of the Spring Show for a number of years. Ben is also the Show Director for the San Diego International Orchid Fair to be held at the San Diego Botanic Garden, formerly known as Quail Botanical Gardens. He also owns and operates a sideline business, Calavo Gardens, from his home, specializing in supplies for the orchid enthusiast.

The mission of this meeting is to provide orchid culture information to all orchid enthusiasts whether you are new to growing orchids or a more experienced grower. As such, this meeting will be referred to as Culture Meeting. I welcome your suggestions for future topics.







#### **Letter From the Editor**

Dear SDCOS,

The heat has finally descended, and this is the time of year that your Pleurothallids (Masdevallia, Stella, Dracula, Pleurothallis, Platystele, Lepanthes, Specklinia, Restrepia, Dressleria, etc.) will like to die unless you keep them shaded and wet with good-quality water. "Good quality" water means your Pur filter off the faucet or much better for most species, including deionized water for the semi-hardy species and reverse-osmosis treated water for the most sensitive. Many serious growers make the leap to provide these kinds of purified water for their collection (especially if they want to do well with Pleurothallids) in order to experience deeper levels of orchid growing success, and it can cost as little as filling a pressure sprayer with the Glacier 'penguin' water at the grocery store vending machine to installing a R/O system with a 1,000-gallon storage tank for a much larger collection and budget.

Many of you have plants that will die in this weather unless you water them every day, and all of your

mounted orchids will benefit from extra watering when the mercury rises. You cannot overwater a properly mounted orchid (except for maybe that blasted *O. liminghei* that hates water), so anything on a stick or a plank or a bark strip should be hit relentlessly by your overnurturing and hawkish watery care. Orchids growing in pots or deep shade won't need quite as much, but the more the merrier this time of year (the Governor even lifted the drought declaration, officially condoning your conduct).

A swamp cooler is necessary for many collections in this kind of weather; all it is is a giant humidifier that you use lots of money and water for unless you have a small collection. Make sure any humidifier water is pure, and make sure that when it comes to mounted ordchids "spritzing" with a spray bottle does not constitute watering.
