SDCOS Conservation Grant Awardees 2011

The SDCOS Conservation Committee met on October 1st to evaluate applications from a number of people and organizations. After careful consideration, the Committee recommended the following grant for funding. This recommendation was approved by the SDCOS board at the October board meeting.

A vote of the membership is required for all society expenditures in excess of \$750, and a motion to approve this award will be made at the monthly General Meeting on November 1st. A study of the conservation genetics and future viability of a rare North American orchid, (Platanthera praeclara). Submitted by Steven Travers, Department of Biological Sciences, North Dakota State University. The tallgrass prairie is one of the most threatened ecosystems in North America. Only a small percentage of the original habitat exists, and much of that remains as isolated fragments. Many of these fragments contain populations of the endangered Western Prairie Fringed Orchid (Platanthera praeclara), ranging in numbers from a few to a few thousand individuals. The long-term conservation of this species relies on understanding the consequences of fragmentation, spatial isolation and reduction of population size on genetic diversity, which can be impacted adversely by all of these processes. However, little research has been done to assess how genetic diversity has been affected by habitat fragmentation. This project includes the assessment of genetic diversity in populations of Western Prairie Fringed Orchid from Nebraska through Manitoba. The results of this study should be useful in formulating future conservation plans for this rare and endangered species. Total amount recommended = \$2,032



Letter From the Editor

Dear SDCOS,

Many of you should be seeing the signs that your plants are starting to slow down their growth rate in preparation for winter. While there's a few species that can be reliably counted on to initiate inflorescence development this time of year (*Vanda roeblingiana*, *Stenorhynchus speciosa*, *Amesiella monticola*, *Brassavola nodosa*, many Mexcian Laelia species, etc,), beyond plants like these going into their blooming cycles, you should see little or no growth in your collection. One possible exception might be a few new pseudobulb flushes at the base of your sympodial orchids, but these will often tend to stay very small or even rot off when nighttime winter lows mix with moist growths. This is why watering at night this time of year is a bad idea in general, and also why tapering off on the water your plants receive (except for maybe your Pleurothallids and PNG Dendrobiums) is also beneficial this time of year.

This is also a good time of year to start looking for signs of damping off, bacterial rot, and fungi, and to start spraying with an appropriate fungicide. There are a number of highly effective chemical sprays and powders

on the market, although copper-based soaps and a 5:1 water/milk solution will go a long way to clear up spotty leaves that water droplets pooled on one night. Ground cinnamon is also a good thing to sprinkle on your plants this time of year, as its main ingredient, trans-cinnamaldehyde, is both antifungal and antibacterial.

Another thing that often happens to indoor growing areas this time of year is that outdoor insects, which are starting to slow down, begin to notice that indoor growth areas have everything they need, including the absence of cold, and they

start to domesticate themselves and move indoors. This is often when infestations in indoor collections begin, particularly with cottony mealybugs and other pests that can blend into your walls and sneak up on your growing area a few inches at a time. Beware this season, and your plants will stay healthy until spring.
