Peter T. Lin will be presenting a talk on one of his favorite topics: Mini-Catts, also known as miniature Cattleyas. Peter will be sharing a fastpaced Powerpoint presentation on these charming orchids. The journey will begin with a review of the miniature species, early hybrids, and then to some of the relevant hybrids of today. He will also review how to grow these wonderful plants.

Due to limited growing space, Peter likes to specialize in miniature orchids, both species and hybrids, and has received numerous AOS awards. His other interests in orchids include Dendrobiums, Angraecoids, and Neofinetias. He maintains a collection of a thousand or more orchids at his home in Southern California in 3 small greenhouses, as well as in the house under fluorescent lights. Peter will be providing the plants for this month's plant opportunity table. There will be a nice selection of orchids, so be sure to buy your tickets!

Peter started growing orchids over 25 years ago, but then stopped due to school and starting a career. It wasn't until about 9 years ago that the orchid "bug" came back and he is now heavily involved once again. He is an accredited judge with the American Orchid Society and a hybridizer of mini-Catts. He enjoys meeting with other orchid enthusiasts, and can often be found at various orchid shows and societies around the country. 




Set up will start at 8:00 Thursday morning and will end when set up is complete, usually between noon and 1:00. Those working during the show will be split into morning or afternoon shifts of 4-5 hours each. If you cannot commit to a full 4-5 hour shift, that is OK as we can still use whatever help you can give.

We will have sign-up sheets at January meeting for all the different tasks and all the different shifts. If you can help during the show, please sign up. The sooner we know how many volunteers we have, the better we can plan for staffing levels each day.

Lunch will be provided on Saturday and Sunday for those who volunteer for a shift. For example, someone that works the Saturday morning shift from 9am to 1pm will get lunch at the end of the shift. Those working the afternoon will get lunch before starting their shift. There is a lunch room just off the entryway to the display room. Food will be provided by Ranch Catering.

Presale tickets with your name on an envelope will be available at the meeting also. Please pick up your tickets so we can save the cost postage. Each member is asked to take and pay for a packet that contains 6 tickets for \$30. You can either sell the tickets or give them away to friends and family. We would appreciate payment by the show date. If you and not able to help in this way, just let us know. Sales of these tickets are part of the reason our annual dues are maintained at such a low level.

We will also have coupons at the January meeting worth \$1 off admission to the show as well as show posters. They will be on the same table as the presale tickets. We would appreciate any help you can give by passing out the coupons or by leaving a poster and coupons where the public will see them and hopefully attend our show.

December 8, 2011

President Bruce Berg called the meeting to order at 7:09 PM.

Officer Reports:

Minutes for the November meeting were approved via email prior to this meeting and were published in the December newsletter.

Carol Berg presented the Treasurer's report for November. Helen Pfister moved to file the report for audit – the motion passed.

Committee Reports:

The Spring Show committee met prior to the Board meeting. Bruce Berg gave an update to the Board. A call tree was suggested if more volunteers are needed. Marketing ideas were also discussed by the committee. The tickets have been put in envelopes and are available for pickup by members at the January meeting. Members will be saving the society postage if they pick up their tickets. The Society depends on the income from these tickets to help with Society expenses. Volunteer signup sheets will be available so that the members can sign up for the various tasks to put on a show. David Brown volunteered to contract Marina Village checking on the availability and cost for possible future Spring Shows.

Letter From the Editor

Dear SDCOS,

This is normally that trite time of year when I propose that we all make a bunch of promises to our orchids that we'll have a hard time keeping over the net 12 months. Perhaps the problem with New Year's resolutions is that they're always too unrealistic, holding us to standards of humanity that only the best among us can maintain for less than 1% of the time. There's a tremendous disconnect between how we would act in a vacuum when engaging in thought experiments that employ idealized notions of human morality and the way we typically act...most of the time. This means I can tell you to water more and repot more and take the pledge to do so myself, so we can all regroup in 11 months or so and bring each other up to speed about how we spent the last year doing nothing.

I could just take the reverse psychology route and tell you that you really won't take better care of your plants in 2012, that you'll talk and talk about it, yet never come through for your collection, but something tells me

this audience can see right through that tactic, therefore requiring a much more nuanced approach:

Since you will neither water, nor fertilize, nor repot your plants more in 2012, *at least make an effort to harm your orchids less*.

I get it, old habits die hard. This is like the distinction between positive and negative reinforcement: positive reinforcement is "I give you something you like if you do something good"; negative reinforcement is "I'll take away something you hate

if you do something good." Call this the negative reinforcement of reverse psychology. And in the spirit of the season, don't forget:

Happy Growing, Christopher
