Jim Wright will enlighten us on all aspects of ribbon judging, along with how to choose an appropriate plant of your own and preparing it for the show. This includes how to stake the flowers for optimal orientation and cleaning your plant to ensure it is free of pests. You do not want to show a plant with bugs crawling around or with unsightly scale. Also important is how to package your plant for safe travel to the show. Finally there is the process of entering your plant by completing the entry form with the correct judging section and class.

Our upcoming Spring show, March 9th - 11th, is a perfect opportunity to show your plant. It is a satisfying experience to enter your orchid regardless whether it is awarded a ribbon and the show is an excellent opportunity to ask questions and expand your knowledge. There are several opportunities to volunteer during the show where you can interact with fellow members and the public. All of these activities are a perfect time to learn more about orchids. Bruce Kidd Trip to Thailand

Bruce Kidd, will give the March Presentation regarding a Trip to Thailand.

The thrill of encountering wild orchids growing *in situ* is one of the most enjoyable experiences of the orchid hobby. Who hasn't looked at potted orchids sitting on the bench and wondered what an entire hillside or forest full of them might look like growing in their natural state, sprawled over tree limbs or clustered on rocks alongside a waterfall, the way the first orchid explorers found them? Wouldn't you like to see them that way, rather than huddled by the window near the kitchen sink? Are

those grand old days of orchid exploration days really gone by, not to return? Well, not necessarily. It might be a little more difficult these days to find pristine, untouched populations of wild orchids, but they're out there if you work to find them, and the excitement of discovery is as genuine today as it must have been two centuries ago

Last year, Bruce and Yasue Kidd went on the orchid trail during nearly two months wandering in Thailand. They'd been told that you need to get



a guide, or you'll never find orchids in the wild. That turned out to be true in areas easily accessible to humans. So, Bruce and Yasue took it as a challenge to see if by following their orchid instincts and hiking uphill long enough, maybe they could find some hidden treasures without the leeches, diseases and cannibals that made orchid hunting a real adventure back in the early days. And finally, they found what they were looking for. Tonight's presentation, "An Orchid Adventure in Thailand," shares some of that experience.

Bruce Kidd has a M.Sc in Weed Science from the University of Arizona and recently retired after 30 years with Dow AgroSciences, where his work involved helping turf and growers solve weed, disease and insect problems in ornamental crops including orchids. Bruce is a past president of the San Diego County Cymbidium Society, and grows about 500 very

President Bruce Berg called the meeting to order at 7:19 PM.

Officer Reports:

Minutes for the January meeting were approved via email prior to this meeting and were published in the February newsletter.

Carol Berg presented the Treasurer's report for January. David Brown moved to file the report for audit—the motion passed. The Board held discussions on the profit and loss and on how to decrease our losses. This was tabled until after the Spring Show.

Committee Reports:

Dyed Orchids and Other Abominations

Someone awesome sent me another windmill to tilt at last month, and this trend reminds me of when the Dendrobium White Fairy #5 was infused with glow-in-the-dark genes from the firefly to make the first radioactive-looking orchid in 1999. That patent has or is about to expire, so expect to see these plants at a big box store near you sometime soon.

The windmill, this time, was dyed orchids. Yes, dyeing—a process usually reserved for lame flowers like carnations on St. Patrick's Day, has now taken root in our hobby.

In the February 2012 issue of *Greenhouse Grower*, there's a great article about Phalaenopsis 'Blue Mystique', grown by a company called Silver Vase, that apparently neither has the skill nor time commitments to make blue Phalaenopsis the hard way, by selective breeding with *Doritis pulcherrima* var. coerulea and others. Moreover, unless you use the proprietary dye treatment at home (and you can't get it), your next spike from 'Blue Mystique' comes out pure *white*.

Silver Vase claims that the dye process brings more people into the orchid industry who might not otherwise be interested (and I'm sure they really want to stay as soon as their advertised blue orchid blooms out white). The company has also discovered that their dyed inventory sales now far surpass the rest of the orchids they sell, making them fearful that once the fad passes they won't be able to make ends meet.

Not to mention putting 'Blue Mystique' in single quotes is an insult to awarded orchid cultivars and expert breeders everywhere. Dyed (or unnamed) plants bred for the "throw away" market are not for orchid hobbyists like us who actually care about getting the plant to bloom again.



about our hobby and encourages people to purchase plants that we are not likely to learn very much about. As an orchid society, we should help folks find the proper names for their plants when they lose the tags, but with tens of millions of hybrids compared to only about 30,000 species, this task is a lot easier for species, particularly when our Society doesn't regularly utilize OrchidWiz or any of the expansive (and expensive) orchid databases that help one identify hybrids. Those beholden to the idea of having Noids (orchids without proper tags) in their collection and bringing them to anything other than monthly meetings should probably discuss the merits of a "Noid Invitational" once or

twice a year with the Board to showcase these plants (that should not really be showcased) in a different venue, with only horticultural and specimen awards given. In the immortal words of Eminem, "Here's my two cents: my ten cents is free."
