Updates from your President

It is time to have a party! The next General Meeting will be our annual Awards Banquet. There is information elsewhere in the newsletter with details. The focus of the Banquet is to recognize and thank the many volunteers who have worked so hard this past year to support the Society. In a way, all of us are to be thanked for supporting our Society by attending meetings, volunteering for the many tasks that need to be done during the year, and financially supporting our programs. When we see our members who have worked so hard this year, take a moment to thank them. If you know of a person who should be recognized for their efforts this year, please email me so that I can make sure they are recognized and thanked at the party.

We had a great, fun, Spring Show this year. There were many beautiful plants and displays brought in by our members. We will have a report on the past Spring Show at the May meeting. There are several items that we, as a Society, need to vote on. First, we need to decide if we want to have a show next year. This is a question that will require some reflection by you, our members. If we wish to have a show at the Scottish Rite Convention Center, we will have to sign contracts for the next 3 years. We have not been able to find a better venue for our show. Scottish Rite is asking for a substantial increase in rent, and though the final amount has not been negotiated, it is in the range of \$1500 per year for the next 3 years. Secondly, the new contracts require a \$1000 per year deposit which is due when we sign the contracts. This \$3000 amount must be approved by the general membership before we can sign contracts.


We almost met our goal for income from this past show. We will have to figure out if we can increase revenues enough to cover the rate increases. Secondly, we almost did not have

enough volunteers to put on the show. When members do not commit to volunteer to help at the show, this makes the job of determining if we have enough people a very difficult task. As a result, during the show, sometimes we are short help and sometimes we have more help than we can use. Financially, our members did not support the advanced sales of tickets. Income from this activity netted \$1500 less than last year. It's up to all of us to determine if we wish to continue our spring shows in the future.

Another item to be presented at the May meeting is a slate of candidates for Board officer elections at the June general meeting.

April 3 of this year, we lost one of our long time members, Loren Batchman. He passed away on his 72nd birthday after a long bout with cancer. There will be a memorial service at the San Diego Botanical Garden center (Quail) on May 8 at 11 am. Those who knew him are invited. Also, the family has requested that anecdotal stories involving Loren would be welcome. Casa de las Orquideas is having their annual seedling sale on May 19.

So, I'll see you at the party and let's enjoy some good food, good company, and maybe a libation.



In Memory

On April 3 of this year, Loren Batchman lost his long battle against cancer. We lost a great friend, mentor, and supporter who was a longtime honorary life member of our Society.

The San Diego County Orchid Society recognizes and appreciates the many contributions, support, training, education, and motivation that we have received from Loren for many decades. As an active member of the Society, Loren presented many talks about his work and passion for the breeding of Cymbidiums and Zygopetalums. This is in addition to the many outstanding displays of orchids at our Shows. He also has been a big supporter of the Conservation work of the Society.

Loren was an accredited AOS judge for over 24 years. This past year, he was nominated for the honorary status of Judge Emeritus which recognizes the many years of support for AOS judging locally in Southern California, nationally, and internationally. He published articles for AOS and for international publications on the hybridizing of Cymbidiums and Zygopetalums. He developed and presented training materials for new AOS judges.

In 2000, he started publication of the Cymbidium Society of America journal. He did all these things while also starting and running Casa de las Orquideas with his wife, Nancy in 1976. He was always happy to share his love of orchids. Prior to this, he was a rocket scientist working with the aerospace industry here in San Diego. One of his favorite sayings was "It really does take a rocket scientist to grow orchids."

He has registered over 376 Cymbidium hybrids and over a dozen Zygopetalum hybrids

for which he has been awarded 147 AOS and 126 CSA awards.

In a larger way, he has also been recognized as one of the world's leading hybridizers of Cymbidiums and Zygopetalums. He has been recognized with the AOS Award for Excellence in 2009 for his international work in hybridizing Cymbidiums and Zygopetalums, the Cymbidium Society Hudlow Medal for outstanding Cymbidium hybridizing in 2003, a bronze award at the Tokyo Dome show, and the sponsoring of a new trophy by the Cymbidium Society of America at the Santa Barbara Orchid Show—to mention only a few of the recognitions by friends and colleagues over his career.

We will miss his friendly manner, inspiration, and training that he has extended to all orchid enthusiasts.

Nancy and family have invited friends of Loren to attend a memorial service at the San Diego Botanical Garden (Quail) on May 8 at 11 am. They have invited anecdotal stories to be shared at the memorial and online at: http://stei-23721.tributes.com/show/Loren-E.-Batchman-93552563 They request that the stories be written down so that they can be put in a book. Your Society has put together a photo book of Loren to be given to the family. They also request that no flowers or plants be brought.

2013 Spring Show Scottish Rite Center Decision

We have an opportunity to book the Scottish Rite Event Center for March 22-24, 2013 for our annual spring show and sale. It is the recommendation of the show committee to enter into a contract with the Scottish Rite Center for those dates. We will, however, need to put a \$1000 deposit down at the time of signing and that is something the SCDOS membership needs to approve in advance.

We have held our annual spring show at the Scottish Rite Center for as long as most of us can remember. There has been some discussion about moving to another venue as the rental cost at the Scottish Rite Center is going up but it is not the show committee recommendation to do so at this time. We will start making preparations in just a few months for the next show and we must commit to a location before we can start. In addition, any changes we make will impact the effort required to put on the show.

The total cost of renting the Scottish Rite Center for 2013 will be \$15,330, up \$1593 from this year. Although these increases are difficult for the Society to absorb, the cost of similar facilities is going up as well. We have a long history with the Scottish Rite Center and people associate our show with them. It is our feeling that we will lose attendance and therefore ticket sales if we move to another location.

The issue of signing a contract and making a \$1000 deposit requires a vote of the member ship. We will present the matter at the May general meeting for discussion and a vote. April-blooming *Dendrobium hasseltii* has flowers that are typical of the Pedilonum section of Dendrobiums, with their fluorescent orange lip spots and column undersides on a backdrop of crystalline, lightly veined, hot pink sepals and petals. These grow great outdoors in semi-shaded frost-free areas and need good quality water that doesn't burn the tips of the fine and wiry roots that come out of the bottoms of the pseudobulbs.



Encyclia cordigera var. rosea, another April-blooming species, is a handsome Panamanian version of an orchid that is found throughout lowland Central America and Northern South America. Lico Orchids traded me some money for this one.



Dendrobium pendulum has pendant, bony pseudobulbs that are swollen at the nodes. Also, the flowers last 4 weeks and have 4 colors on them. This is my second pendulum, as the last one didn't like moving to a new backyard without shade.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:55 PM.



There's a huge vacuum in the orchid world right now, as we lost one of the top cymbidium hybridizers in North America (and the world) with the passing of Loren Batchman. While he was too humble to admit this himself, he was simply the most accomplished and important Cymbidium hybridizer for hundreds of miles. Luckily, he has an extremely talented and knowledgeable family to carry on the torch in his absence. Don't forget Casa de las Orquideas's seedling sale on May 19th.

I hope all your repotting is just about done, because as soon as that marine layer burns off, we're in for a real cooker this summer. Of course, it might not burn off until August, leaving you with only 1 or 2 months for having to water your mounted orchids daily for optimum results. That might buy you some time to baby everything and get it opti-

mally established before the mercury rises to uncomfortable heights in most places in the county. Also, now is the time to start thinking about moving all your "bathroom plants" outdoors for the summer if you have the right light conditions for them. Nothing beats the consistently moving air and day and night temperature variations of a properly set up growing area that is not inside a house that people live in. Even if you shower with your orchids 4 times a day, you're always going to get better ambient humidity levels for the orchid by growing it outdoors, unless you live in Anza-Borrego State Park. El Cajon might be "dry" to you, but home living in El Cajon to your orchid might as well be life in the Atacama Desert unless part of your house was designed to be

a terrarium for your Solomon Island Skinks. Plus, insect problems can be just as bad indoors, where most average folk don't have their own Lizard's Resistance Army to control them. Silly average folk.
