CULTURE MEETING- February 5, 6:30 PM Nico Goossens - How to Prepare Your Plants for an Exhibit

As it's time to start thinking about the big show coming up in March, Nico Goossens has a talk for you about how to groom your orchids to accent their visual charm as well as how best to display your plant. You likely have done all the right things for your orchids over the last year: watering, feeding, and providing proper light exposure. Now that the hardest part of the winter is coming to a close your plants are looking more vigorous and can use that little extra touch to get ready for the show.

Nico is one of those super energetic individuals, who is always there for anyone with a problem or a question regarding orchids, orchid culture, greenhouse growing, as well as outdoor growing. He is especially gifted with an eye toward plant presentation and putting together those bizarre, yet interesting displays at any of the Southern California shows that he participates in. He says his talk is very informal, open to comments from the audience. He has a few plants that he will use to illustrate how to clean, trim and stake for show quality exhibition. Whether you choose to enter a single plant for judging or include some of your plants in a mass

GENERAL MEETING- February 5, 7:30 PM

Learn about this amazing group of species and hybrids. You may be aware of Bulbophyllums but have you grown them? They make excellent companion plants with Phalaenopsis and warmgrowing Paphiopedilums. Little hybridization has been done but the results have been fantastic.

Fred Clarke has been growing orchids for 33 years and has been hybridizing for 25 of those years. With over 25 years as a professional grower and manager in the horticultural industry, Fred applies these skills at his orchid nursery: Sunset Valley Orchids, located in San Diego, California.

He is a passionate orchid grower whose curiosity in orchids is broad and varied. Although developing Cattleya hybrids has been his sustaining interest, he is also actively creating new Aussie Dendrobium and Paphiopedilum hybrids.

His pioneering work in Catasetum intergeneric hybrids led to the development



Changes for the Spring Show

- 5. Please sign up with Dave Hoffmaster in advance if you are putting in a Small Tabletop Display.
- 6. Junior Entries: Exhibitors must be under 18 years of age. Exhibitor may use any orchids even if he/she has not grown it. An index card with culture information on how the plant is grown needs to be included with the registration tag.


Debbie Halliday's Zygopetalum hybrid earned her a 1st Place and Best of Section 10(O). Sometimes these things can perfume an entire room.
