Helen Pfister-What I've Learned in Eight Years with the SDCOS

This month our culture talk is from Helen Pfister, sharing with you her experience with the SDCOS, especially what belonging to the Orchid Society has done for her.

On the Road to the 20th WOC Singapore 2011 via China and Malaysia

Join Nico Goossens as he shares his adventures to the 20th WOC in November of 2011, with a group of orchid hobbyist and judges from San Francisco. He visited China from Beijing to Shanghai via bus, boat, and train and then Malaysia from Penang in the north to Johor Bahru in the south via bus. He then crossed the bay to Singapore, the city nation.

The presentation offers views of his

visits to The Forbidden City, The Great Wall, The Orchid Museum, Putoshan Island and Monastery in China, with travels through Malaysia finding orchids in the wild as well as nurseries, and then capping the trip off with the World Orchid Show and Conference in Singapore. In addition, you'll see photos of the Singapore Botanical Garden and its most prestigious Orchid Garden..



Update from your president

Welcome to summer!

Thank you also for re-electing me and the other officers for another term (which will be my last term) as President of our society. Looking back at the past year, the Board made a number of changes to address issues affecting our society.

Our society put on the 2013 Spring Show "Orchids by the Sea." The show was a great one! We hosted the AOS Members meeting in conjunction with our show and received many compliments from them on the quality of the show as well as the quality of our displays and plants. Unfortunately, our net income was down from the previous years. While attendance was not improved, our rates to rent the facility were up, and the second largest deficit was presales of tickets by the members. Our efforts in advertizing our show did not seem to work.

We formed a finance committee whose job is to find safe investments for the society's money.

We changed our newsletter to electronic delivery, with the option for members to continue with mail delivery if they help pay the cost of mailing.

Our membership has been slowly dwindling. This is probably due to a combination of factors. Many if not most similar societies have also been experiencing declines in membership. With social networking changing the ways we interact, I wonder if people now do not feel as much need for interpersonal interactions. Information is only a click away. Our Vice Presidents are working hard to bring in interesting and new speakers to make our meetings more interesting. We need to find more things new members and current mem-

bers will find interesting enough to want to be members of our society. This means things to do. Another factor is the increasing age of our members. At 64, I feel like one of the younger members.

We have started a program to give our new members gift certificates to be used with vendors who advertize in our newsletters.

We have a student membership program approved but not yet started.

Jim Wright has also started coordinating visits to our vendors. He has also started coordinating visits to member homes so we can socialize and see how other members grow their orchids.

Nico Goossens and I are working on coordinating hikes in search of our local native orchids.

Our Webmaster, Jack Schaefer, has been working hard to make our website useful and informative to our members as well as to document the quality plants awarded at our shows and AOS judging.

We host the local AOS judging center for the southwest region. Members are encouraged to have their plants judged for AOS awards. Paul Tuskes extends a welcome for any of our members who would be interested in learning about judging orchids to contact him about becoming an AOS judge.

This coming year, I intend to continue to work on fun projects to bring in more members while looking for ways to keep our new members engaged in participation with the society. One new member, Laura Nolden has volunteered to help recruit volunteers for our society activities. You may be hearing from her as our shows approach!

I would like to expand on Jim Wright's work to host social gatherings at member houses like we do with the Species group but change the focus more for the novices and look at basic orchid culture.

I will work to have a balanced budget and ensure our investments are managed.

This next year we will host our 68th annual Spring Show on March 21st, 22nd and 23rd. I will co-chair this again with Dave Hoffmaster. Several of the board members have volunteered to work as a committee to look into ways to make changes to our shows to see what we can do to improve our net income. Volunteers from the general membership to help on this activity would be welcomed.

Summer Show and Sale in the Park

It is once again time for another of our shows. I would like to encourage you to share your flowering orchids with us and the public. The dates for the show are July 20th and 21st; set-up will be on Friday the 19th. We will begin set-up about 2:00pm. On Saturday we are open to the public from about noon until 5:00pm and on Sunday from 10:00am until 4:00pm. We actually open to the public on Saturday when we have finished judging, generally, a little before noon. We also open the sales area to the public at 10:00 am on Saturday. Plants can be registered on Friday from 4:00 - 8:00pm and Saturday from 8:00 until 9:30 am. We begin judging at 10:00 AM sharp, so please have your plants registered before then. As a new feature to this Show, we will have AOS judging. Because this is new, we may have a few bugs to work out, so please be patient with us.

These events in the Park are an effort to encourage people to grow orchids and to educate the public about the hobby that we are so engrossed. Additionally, the Shows in the Park are a method of fund raising for our So-

ciety. The money raised helps keeps that cost of membership down. So, if you have divisions of plants that you would like to get rid of in order to free some space for new acquisitions, there are a few options. We have a member's sales area where you can sell your plants on consignment, you can donate them to the Society or you can donate them to the Conservation Committee. All options help. If you want to sell your own plants, first you need to be a member, and then you will need to get a vendor number from Carol Berg in order to get credit for your sales. If you have any questions, you may contact Carol or myself.

The only way for the Shows in the Park to succeed is for you, the membership, to support these activities. WE NEED YOU! Without you we cannot pull this off. We always need volunteers to perform a variety of tasks such as security, host, set-up and tear-down, help in the sales area and a variety of various and sundry other tasks. A few hours of your time are all it takes. There will be a sign up sheet for volunteers available at the July Meeting. This is a great way to meet members and to glean information for some of our tremendous growers/hobbyists. This is an especially great opportunity for new members who want to learn about growing orchids. There is always a need for security Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning.

Also, new this Show, I would like to suggest that people to bring in some sort of snack to share. Felisa and Ernie Ancantilado often bring pancit (it is a very delicious Philippine delight), so if you can bring some tasty treat to share, that would be great. The Society will provide water and coffee.


