GENERAL MEETING—January 7, 7:30 PM Miniature Orchids

Dan Newman, owner of Hanging Gardens located in Pacifica, California, will present Miniature Orchids. Orchids come in many sizes, from massive to miniscule. While there is no universal definition of what makes a miniature orchid, most collectors would agree that everyone who gets hooked on orchids eventually runs out of space! There are more fascinating species in the world than any of us can hope to accommodate, but by including some smaller-growing plants in our collections, we can fit more variety into the space we have available. The aim of the talk will be to illustrate the charm and diversity

of "miniature orchids," and to discuss their needs in cultivation.

Dan first got interested in orchids as a teenager following a visit to the greenhouse at the Los Angeles County Arboretum in Southern California where he grew up. After reading an article in *Sunset* magazine and devouring the few orchid books available at the local public library he mustered the resources to order three species orchid plants from Orchids by Hausermann in Illinois:

Brassavola cucullata, Brassia gireoudiana, and Paphiopedilum venustum, whose exotic shapes and markings in one of the books' illustrations had captivated him. Unfortunately, conditions in his childhood bedroom were not ideal (there may also have been issues with consistency of care), and those early subjects soon made the ultimate sacrifice, providing an early lesson in how <u>not</u> to grow orchids.

On a vacation to Hawaii some twelve years later, in 1982, Dan bought a tiny Dendrobium hybrid seedling at a lei stand in the Honolulu Airport. The bright San Francisco apartment where he was living by then turned out to be a much better environment for orchids. When the little Dendrobium grew into an impressive blooming specimen, he was hooked! By 1996 he had 350 orchids in the same onebedroom apartment. That year he moved his plants to a rented commercial greenhouse in San Francisco. Later, he acquired the large species collection of his friend and orchid mentor, Walter Teague (think Pleurothallis teaguei), and his hobby evolved into his nursery, Hanging Gardens. Dan started growing orchids full-time in 2000. A few years later he moved to a larger greenhouse in Pacifica, on the coast a few miles south of San Francisco. He currently has approximately 15,000

plants, mostly cool to intermediate growers (true warm growers are difficult in the cool coastal climate, but he tries to push the envelope as far as it will go!). His collection includes a few hybrids but is mostly made up of species, his first love.

Dan joined the San Francisco Orchid Society in 1987, and served as its president in1996-1997. In recent years, he has spoken on a variety of topics to horticultural groups in California and elsewhere.

President Bruce Berg called the meeting to order at 7:08 PM.

Officer Reports:

Minutes for the November meeting were approved via email prior to this meeting and were published in the December newsletter.

Carol Berg presented the treasurer's report for November. David Brown moved to file the report for audit—the motion passed.

The rent for the garage has increased.

Committee Reports:

Jack Schaefer, our webmaster, reported that the number of people visiting the web page is about the same. The Winter Show in the Park is showing more activity as well as the Spring Show "A Symphony of Orchids."

Bob Clark, our membership chair, reported that our membership is down from last month.

David Brown needs to purchase some necessary equipment for the Society. He will get the price list for the next Board meeting. David Brown will be writing an article for the newsletter about the 2015 celebration in Balboa Park. David will be asking for donations of specimens of all types that grow well here in San Diego. He will work with the Park and Recreation Department to recognize those making the donations (and SDCOS) and to coordinate donations that will be displayed in the Botanical Building and grown at the nursery at Morley Field. This will not only be for the 2015 Centennial for the future as well.
