# South American Slipper Orchids: Habitats and Conservation

Ron Kaufmann will present "South American Slipper Orchids: Habitats and Conservation". Having traveled extensively to view orchids in the wild in South America, Ron is an authority in the slipper orchids of this continent. He will show South American slipper orchids in the wild, illustrating the habitats in which they grow and the considerations for their conservation and horticulture.

South American slipper orchids have caused quite a bit of commotion in the orchid world over the past several decades, from the description of *Phragmipedium besseae* in the early 1980's through the discovery of *P. kovachii* just over 10 years ago. Like their Old World relatives, the Paphiopedilums, some New World slipper orchids have been subjected to considerable collecting pressure, a practice that presents challenges for conservation of these magnificent orchids.

I'm looking forward to seeing all of you who have volunteered to make this the best show yet.

County Fair: Your society will be participating in the 2014 San Diego County Fair with a display booth to showcase your society and give the public information about our upcoming shows. We will have one day at the fair identified as "Orchid Day." Charlie Fouquette will be giving a talk to the public on orchids. In addition to this, members are encouraged to enter plants for ribbon judging. In addition to winning ribbons for your plants, there are also cash awards. Follow the links describing rules for feature garden competition and online registration. If you are interested, one of our new members, Cindy Benoit, is in charge of the gardens competitions! If you are interested, I think we could ask her to participate in a question and answer session at the May 1st meeting, which would be just before the deadline for entry submissions. The one month long fair has been divided up into four

one week long Mini orchid shows, each one with separate judging. This is in response to a problem remembered by members who were discouraged years ago with trying to predict what plants would be blooming months before the show. It also makes it easier on the plants to water and maintain them. Did I say that in addition to ribbons, there are cash awards?

Orchid activities this month: In addition to participating in the Spring Show, this is the time to begin getting ready for the new growths our plants will be putting on as the longer and warmer days are encouraging new growths. It is the time to divide and replant our plants. particular, oncidiums and other fine rooted plants would respond well to a fresh mix of medium, since the finer barks tend to decompose more quickly. As you divide and repot those plants, remember that those back divisions would be good donations to our conservation committee to support their efforts. I watch for nighttime low temperatures to consistently stay above 50 degrees and then repot my plants as I begin to put them under the shade cloth in my back yard.

Ron has a long-standing interest in conservation and has been a member of the SDCOS Conservation Committee for almost 15 years, serving as its chairperson since Since 1991, the Conservation 2004. Committee has awarded more than \$170,000 to support projects in 21 different countries. Ron is a founding director of the Orchid Conservation Alliance and currently serves on the boards of the OCA, EcoMinga Foundation (a conservation foundation based in Ecuador) and Orchid Digest. His recent projects include a forthcoming book entitled "Orchids of Tropical America: An Introduction and Guide," co-authored with Joe Meisel and Franco Pupulin and scheduled for publication by Cornell University Press later this year.

Ron has been growing orchids for nearly 20 years, starting with a reedstem *Epidendrum* and progressing to a diverse collection that contains mostly species orchids. He grows most of his orchids in a 36 x 24 foot greenhouse and several outdoor shade-covered areas around his house in San

Diego. Friends have suggested that he build a second, much larger greenhouse to accommodate the many plants that often make walking through his greenhouse an exercise requiring extensive training in gymnastics and yoga to avoid serious injury. Thus far, this recommendation hasn't been followed, although the temptation grows stronger every day!

Besides Ron's interest in orchids, he is a marine biologist by training. His scientific work includes studies of Antarctic and deepsea ecosystems as well as marine communities in coastal Southern California. Ron is Associate Professor of Marine Science and Environmental Studies and the Marine Science Graduate Program Director at USD. Ron earned his Ph.D at the Scripps Institution of Oceanography at UCSD.

# In Search of Wild Orchids, Agua Caliente

It was an early Summer-like Friday the weekend of March 7, 2014 when members of our society met at the Agua Caliente campground looking forward to seeing if we could find a patch of Epipactis gigantea orchids that Nico Goossens a few members of our society, and I had found several years This weekend, we had attracted a ago. We enjoyed a Dutch oven tamale pie dinner by Carol followed by a peach cobbler dessert. Nico surprised us with fried bananas, cookies, and key lime ice cream. over the winter, the plants were all in vibrant growth. It was still a bit early for them to be in full bloom, but there were some just getting started. It was too early to see any seed pods. We did not do a complete survey, but did a consensus survey (not a scientifically precise survey because to access the plant groups would disturb the companion willow and grasses that were protecting them from discovery by the general public) and estimated there were between 100 and 200 plants in the patch.

On Sunday morning, we broke camp, and drove to a trailhead for Pena Springs. Nico had a hunch that the Pena springs area might be a good location to explore and see if we could find more orchids. The hike was a pleasant walk in the desert. We found companion plants, running water, but no orchids. On the walk back out, we found evidence of previous occupants of the

spring's area, stone mutates, and a few pot shards which reminded us that we all are visitors on these lands where orchids live.

Letter from the Editor

Dear SDCOS,

Welcome to spring! The season is nicely begun by our annual spring show, with lots of great flowers. By the time you read this, you will have already seen the fantastic plants our members have grown. I promise pictures in the next newsletter.

Now is the time when I think about moving some of the plants I have coddled in sunny windows for the last 4 months back to the harsh outside. The days are now longer than the nights and the angle of the sun at noon is climbing, exposing areas that were shade to sunlight. This in combination with our recent warm weather means we need to pay special attention to keeping the surface mounted plants adequately watered. Remember the saying "You can't water orchids too much, but you can water them too often." I'm also betting that with the drought, the mineral content of the water will get worse, so if you (like me) don't use purified water, be sure to water your plants thoroughly when you water so that the minerals in the media can dissolve.
