We have a very interesting topic and speaker in July. Betty Kelepecz will talk about flasking orchid seeds in her own home lab. We all know Betty as an expert in raising cool growing orchid species. Well, she also has a real propagation lab in a spare room at home where she flasks orchid seed for herself and Andy's Orchids among others. Betty's undergraduate education and first post-college employment was in microbiology. While a police officer at the Los Angeles Police Department, she was the commanding officer of LAPD's Crime Lab and after retiring from law enforcement, she was hired as the lab director of a private forensic DNA laboratory. When the lab shut down,

GENERAL MEETING - July 1st, 7:30 PM Laelias of Mexico

The genus Laelia was at one time a very large group of orchids ranging from Mexico through Central America and Brazil. Today's taxonomist, rightly or wrongly, have reduced the genus to a small group of eleven species all of which are endemic to Mexico. These plants vary from the quite common to some which are rarely seen in collections. The flowers and plants are guite variable and all exhibit a classic beauty associated with other members of the Cattleva group. All of these species are unique and have considerable worth in horticulture. Many have great potential as parental stock. This lecture will deal mostly with the variability of the many flowers and the habitats from which they grow.

James attended the University of California at Santa Barbara where he studied anthropology. In 1971 he began working at Santa Barbara Orchid Estate. After 16 years there, and becoming manager, he left to establish his own nursery with his wife, Lauris. In 1987 they purchased *Orchids by Rowe*, a 2 acre cymbidium nursery 2 blocks from

Betty obtained various pieces of equipment that she used to establish a small home hobby orchid propagation lab.

Before her first flasking experience, she sought out a well-known and successful orchid propagator (is there such a thing?) SDCOS member Billy Baker, who was kind enough to teach her the basics of orchid propagation. She flasked her first orchid in 2008. It was a green capsule from none other than a Masdevallia orchid of hers that she had personally pollinated. She has found it to be fun and satisfying and a continual learning experience. Since 2008, Betty has flasked over 200 mostly species orchids.

For most of us, there is an air of mystery about the journey from orchid seed to viable plant. I was fascinated to discover that we had in our midst a serious hobbyist who had taken on this most challenging and technical phase of orchid growing. I think you will find her talk both informative and inspiring. Hobbyists can actually do it all!

President Bruce Berg called the meeting to order at 7:04 PM.

Officer and Committee Reports:

Secretary's report – Jack Schaefer (acting) May Board minutes were approved via email prior to this meeting and were published in the June newsletter.

Treasurer's report – Carol Berg

Carol presented the report for the month of May.

David Brown moved to file the report for audit – the motion was seconded

and passed.

Carol noted that SVO had donated a quantity of FDK After Dark plants and they were being sold with funds going to conservation.

Carol discussed the new keys and who has them. She also commented that new Signature cards would be required in mid-July after installation of the new officers.

Carol moved the allocation of \$40 for supplies for the new member culture class. The motion was seconded and passed.

Carol reported that John Walters has an extensive collection of Orchid Digest magazines & would like the society to find a use for them. After discussion it was decided to compare our current holdings with John's collection, reserving any issues for society use that we don't already have and to dispose of the rest as the society sees fit.

During discussion of John Walter's donation, 1st VP Scott LaBouff moved to acquire copies of Mary Gerritsen's A Compendium of Miniature Orchid Species, Vol 1 & 2 as well as her Masdevallias: Gems of the Orchid World. The motion was seconded and passed.

Bob Clark moved to allocate \$300 to purchase a new projector. After discussion of priority, Bob Clark amended his motion to allocate \$1000 to purchase a HD/WXGA projector (3000 lumen). The current projector is old and will be retained as a backup. David Brown will research available projectors and report back to the board. The motion was seconded and passed. Report from the Fair

Word has it that our exhibit at the Del Mar Fair is the most visited exhibit at the fair gardens. That fact won't be contested by the many volunteer ambassadors who are kept busy answering many questions about orchids and insects. It is a testament to all the volunteers that great interest is created when you help people understand the nuances of nature and the importance of all the parts playing a role. While most people have the misconception that orchids are difficult to grow, we hobbyists all realize that a little bit of knowledge about how orchids grow in nature, makes this untrue. While this year's fair theme, The Fab Fair - highlighting the Beatles coming to America fifty years ago, allowed us to connect the importance of beetles, our Fab Millions, with plants (and for our benefit) as both pollinator and decomposers in the world, it is the one to one conversations with ambassadors that help fair goers understand how important all insects are in nature and how easy it can be to grow orchids. Hopefully everyone visiting our exhibit booth will realize that growing orchids can be a very rewarding pastime.

Our exhibit highlights a small greenhouse, an outdoor shade arbor, and a small garden setting where many orchids can grow. We used a small stream and pond with bunch grasses and terrestrial orchids to depict an easy to care garden. The cute small

greenhouse is large enough to judiciously house several hundred orchids both potted on the bench and mounted on the wall or hanging from the rafters. And the shade arbor can be a fabulous way to grow orchids outdoors. People leave with the realization that they too can have showy orchids in their home environments.

This is the first time, to my knowledge, that all three San Diego county orchid societies collaborated to inform the general public about our orchid passions. With exhibit construction help, orchid plant loans, exhibit props, and volunteer ambassadors (from members of five So Ca societies), we truly presented an exhibit worth visiting and staying a while. Outside loan contributions greatly enhanced our display: wall blocks from RCP, Torrey Pine trees from HAGGAI Tree Company, rain barrel and fountain from RainThanks & Greywater, custom rain gutter from Hydroflow, plus greenhouse and mist fogger from LICO Orchids. I would be remiss not to mention the guidance and support from landscape designers Candace Vanderhoff of Rainthanks & Greywater and Gigi Lopatriello of Sun-Coast Design. Then I

really want to thank Jerri Larsson from BioQuip Products for his guidance on insect knowledge, but especially for his generous loan of insect boxes for our information table. However, I believe it is the contributions of all the volunteers as ambassadors that truly made the difference at the Fair.
