CULTURE MEETING - September 2nd, 6:30 PM Building a Home Greenhouse, Part 1

Nico Goosens of Lico Orchids will be starting a two-part program on home greenhouses in September. Nico designed and built the hobby greenhouse for our club display at the Del Mar Fair. It was a well conceived and constructed building that attracted a lot of interest (see pictures). I suggested to Nico that he give a program on how to build a home greenhouse.

In planning the greenhouse talk he started to explore the chapters he would need to cover this quite extensive topic and realized that there was too much for a single session. We are therefore presenting this topic over two months in the hope of giving you a good overview.

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GENERAL MEETING - September 2nd, 7:30 PM Catasetums and Their Culture

Catasetinae is one of the most fascinating subtribe of the Orchidaceae. They represent about 200 species in 5 genera of mostly warm growing orchids originating from Central and South America with unique culture requirements. Learn more about this amazing group of species and their hybrids from Fred Clarke, the world-leading grower and hybridizer of this subtribe.

Fred Clarke has been growing orchids for since 1977 and has been hybridizing for 32 of those years. With over 29 years as a professional grower and manager in the

horticultural industry, Fred applies these skills at his orchid nursery; Sunset Valley Orchids, located in San Diego, California.

He is a passionate orchid grower whose curiosity in orchids is broad and varied. Although developing Cattleya hybrids has been his sustaining interest, he is also actively creating new Catasetinae, Paphiopedilum and Australian Dendrobium hybrids.

His pioneering work in Catasetum intergeneric breeding has led to the

Here is how he described his history with orchids and building greenhouses. "I got into orchids when I received a refused warehoused shipment way back in 1976 or so and joined the SDCOS soon after. Hoping to keep these desiccated plants alive, I learned a lot about the resilience of epiphytic orchids. For the first 20 years or so I grew them mainly outside until I built my present greenhouse in 1995. I had helped build a small greenhouse and shade structures with friends and at my parents' home, but gained most of my construction experience building houses over the last 30 plus years. Growing orchids in the greenhouse really took off when I built our present greenhouse and I've helped built 2 or 3 greenhouses since."

This promises to be a very useful series for anyone considering taking the next step and investing in a home greenhouse. They are immensely fun and satisfying if you do it right. Nico can help you get there.

We really got hands-on and divided plants, trimmed roots, laid in medium inch by inch with energetic pot whacking, and proudly labeled the finished products.

It was fun to watch our members who were new to this activity steadily gain in confidence as they went along. We also got to explore Jim's amazing gardens. His place is like a piece of the San Diego Zoo transplanted farther north with not only orchid houses, but also an impressive collection of palms. The weather was pleasant and cloudy, just how we like it.

After a busy morning of potting we all enjoyed the delicious and varied offerings of a potluck lunch. We even raffled off several plants at the end just for fun. A number of members stayed behind to clean up until Jim's place was spic and span.

We had a diverse group of participants from long-time growers who gave advice to brand new members just starting out. Thanks to all who came:

We will plan to continue having these workshops on at least a quarterly basis. It's a great place to get to know each other and a very useful "way in" when you're trying to get comfortable with repotting orchids.

CHANGES TO PLANT REGISTRATION SCHEDULE FOR SHOWS IN THE PARK

There have been some changes made to the plant registration schedule for our shows in the park. At the suggestion of a number of members, we decided an update was in order. Most of the changes are minor – just adding more color categories, clarifications, and some updates to genera that have changed names.

The most significant change is in the species section. We get such good participation from species growers that it has begun to seem a bit unfair to only give one Best in Section award to the entire species group. In the future there may be more revamping of the species classifications, but for now we are trying splitting it into two sections by size. Section 12 will be Standard species 6" or more from base to leaf tip and Section 13 will be Miniatures under 6". The classes will be the same for both sections.

We'll be interested to see how this works out and how you all like it. Pam welcomes your comments and input. The October show will be our first trial. Please take a look at the new schedule posted on the website.

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Culture tip for September Bruce Berg

September is usually still a hot month, especially out in East County, where I mist my plants in the mornings and in the afternoons only if the temperatures soar. As the days get shorter, plant growth slows down and most plants require less fertilizer Cymbidiums do not need as and water. much nitrogen in their fertilizer. You can use something like Hi Bloom or similar low nitrogen fertilizer through the end of the year. Check your Cattleyas for emerging spikes that foretell blooms in the fall. It is a good time to stake them up for presentation. buds are showing, then remember the orientation toward the sun when moving plants so that you can return them to the same orientation after staking up inflorescences. Otherwise, the buds will twist around to reorient toward the light.

Start preparing for where your plants are going to go when the weather starts cooling. This is a good time to go thru your winter growing area and clean it. A misting with Physan or other antifungal treatment would be a good idea. Make sure that things like water and heat are working.

Plant tags: Plant tags are very useful tools for the orchidist. I'm always picking up tips from members and would like to share some of them this month. Several months ago at a culture forum, I picked up these tips. Both Debby Halliday and Pam Peters always make new plant tags when they repots a plant, and puts the old tag in the bottom of the new pot in case the new tag falls out. Several members use colored tags to give quick information for plants that have special requirements, such as: watering, bloom numbers and dates, repotting, winter rest, no

water during winter, or plant division history. Phyllis Prestia uses colored tags to record if the plant has been virus tested. I also made a tag with her name on it to put in a pot to mark a plant that I'll give her a division of the next time that I divide it. Some tags come with markings for recording bloom dates as well as repotting dates. Fred Tomaschke always lightly sands his tags first with 200 grit sandpaper before using a soft lead pencil. He says the tags are legible for 20 Debby Halliday buys "Sharpie years. Industrial Extra Fine felt marking pens online from Amazon.com that do not fade ("permanent markers" aren't when exposed to greenhouse conditions). The placement of tags in pots can indicate orientation of the plant on the bench toward the sun so that emerging flowers do not twist when plants are moved.

I use a 1/8" drill bit to drill a hole in a tag as well as in the plant pot. I wire the tag to the pot with a 6" piece of telephone wire. This solves a problem I've had with tags falling out of pots. I then write the plant name, the date the plant was repotted, or divided, and a code number that I use with my Orchidwiz database program. To find tags, you can check the internet. Repotme.com sells colored tags. Ben Machado has white tags in stock. I use his. To add the color option, I bought colored electrical tapes to wrap around the tags to tell me if the plant would bloom in summer, fall, winter, or spring. Remember that good penmanship will help you later figure out just what that plant name is when someone is admiring your plant and you want to tell them the name of the plant, or you are filling out a registration form to enter your plant in for judging at one of our shows.


