CULTURE MEETING - November 4th, 6:30 PM Preparing Your Plants for the Winter Season

Tom Biggart will present the culture talk in November. This is a timely topic as the days grow shorter, cooler, and we hope wetter. I'm sure you'll pick up some good tips for wintering your plants successfully. Tom Biggart is the owner and head grower of Granite Hills Orchids in El Cajon, a small town 15 miles east of San Diego. His nursery is a hobby business, which means he doesn't make a living

from growing plants. It is more a labor of love! Tom loves plants in general, and orchids are his main passion. He is very interested in Encyclias and has a large collection of Encyclia species and hybrids. The Australian cool growers are a current interest as well as Brazilian rupicolous Laelias. He is a retired elementary school teacher with orchids

He would love to have anyone stop by to talk orchids and pottery, should you happen to be in the San Diego area.

In his talk Tom will discuss all the basic growing conditions that matter to orchids including light, temperature, water, fertilizer and air movement. He will cover how these conditions must be altered during the winter season to ensure that the plants survive and thrive. He has gathered information from top orchid growers in the various geographic areas of San Diego County to add depth and breadth to the discussion.

We hope you will attend. There should be information that applies to every growing situation to help you improve your orchid culture during this challenging season.

THE DOCTOR IS IN (What is wrong with my plant??)

As we mentioned at the last meeting, we are offering a new service to members who are baffled by a culture problem. Here's how it will work.

- 1 Bring in the affected plant in a bag or box to quarantine it, clearly marked with your name.
- 2 Place it on the table to the right of the door when you arrive.
- 3 Fill out the registration form, which will be available at the table.

We will find a suitable expert for you and talk about your plants directly after the culture presentation at the right front table where we have the culture class.

You will need this information:

Plant name

When you discovered the problem.

Where you live.

Where you are growing it.

What kind of water you use.

Any recent changes – extreme weather, have you sprayed it, repotted it, changed your fertilizer, etc.

A picture of the plant in your growing area if possible.

We'll do our best to help out!

Remember: If you suspect that the problem is infectious (insects, etc) please bring the plant sealed inside a plastic bag!

Culture Tip for November

In preparing for this month's column, I did some web research to see what culture tips I could find. What I found is that our neighboring society, the Palomar Orchid Society, has an excellent cultural tips section created and maintained by Helge Weissig at http://www.palomarorchid.org/content/ november-do-list.html. This page has pretty much everything you'll want to think about doing in November listed. I recommend you visit the site to read what he has to say. The other site that I would recommend is the AOS website http://www.aos.org/. If you have a specific orchid question, there is quite a lot of good information on https:// www.youtube.com/ . Our Society has a subscription to Orchidwiz which is loaded onto our society computer which is available for browsing when not being used for presentations at our meetings. Ask Scott or Debby or me and we will help you.

What I would add to Helge's list is that before moving plants into my greenhouse area for the winter, I do several additional steps. First, I spray the area where the plants are going with a physan spray to hopefully kill any latent fungus left over from last year. Secondly, I change the fertilizer I use during the growing season from "Grow More" to "Bayer All in One" for two weekly cycles to give the plants a systemic component to help keep any unwanted pests from getting a start in the greenhouse where things are always a bit more crowded. Then, forward into the winter season. I use the Bayer fertilizer once about every 90 days instead of the Grow More fertilizer. Thirdly, this is a good time to

realistically evaluate the plants going into the greenhouse and decide if triage is required. Some summers are hard on plants grown outside. It's always hard to look at a struggling plant and say "Good Bye," but this would be the time, unless you have a critical care area and like the challenge and rewards of orchid rescue. Another option is that, when moving plants, sometimes we discover duplicate plants that we have forgotten about that would be candidates to donate to Conservation for the October Show in the Park to help support conservation efforts.



San Diego County Orchid Society Board Meeting Minutes October 7th, 2014

The San Diego County Orchid Society's Board meeting was held on October 7th, 2014. Attending were Scott LaBouff, Bruce Berg, Felisa Acantilado, Jack Schafer, Bob Clark & Carol Berg. Carol Kerr and Kay Klausing were excused absent. The meeting was called to order at 7:04 PM.

The Secretary reported that the September Board minutes were approved by email and were published in the October Newsletter. The Treasurer presented the Financial report for September. A motion was made & passed to file the report for audit.

Our webmaster reported on the web activity for August and September. He also discussed the possibility of uploading board minutes and other documents to the website. The Membership chairman reported on Membership levels and noted that the 2014-2015 Roster had been sent to the printers. Bob Clark also reported on efforts to find a future site for the Spring Show.

The President reported on several issues. First money has been allocated to purchase a new projector and a new laptop for the Society's use. He reported that we had purchased a projector and used it at the October Meeting. The new laptop purchase is still in progress. We are also looking for new lapel microphones & David Brown is in charge of this effort.

Scott requested the consensus of the board on provisions for the December Holiday Party. Generally the board supported the purchase of meats and vegetarian dishes. It was moved to allocate funds for main dish purchases. The motion passed.

The 1sp VP was absent from the meeting but it was reported that the November speaker

would be Paul Tuskes and the topic for the evening would be Laelias. Paul will also provide the opportunity table which will be Laelia divisions.

Our 2nd VP, Debby Halliday, reported that Tom Biggar will be the Culture Class speaker for November. Tom will discuss prepping plants for winter. Debby presented a suggestion she had received for members to display orchid plants at Organ Recitals being held at the Episcopal Church on 6th Ave one Tuesday evening each month. The board asked for a fuller proposal.

A proposed addition to the Culture Class was discussed. Called "The Dr Is In", this would provide members with an opportunity to bring in plants that are not as healthy as they could be and have expert members of the Society offer suggestions about better care. Suitably labeled and quarantined (plastic bags if there are visible critters infesting the plants) orchid would be examined after the culture class by one of our experienced growers and suggestions as to care offered. Debby was asked to create a writeup for the newsletter explaining how this would work.

In her capacity as AOS representative, Debby noted the availability of webinars on various orchid topics provided by the AOS for member groups use. A webinar is an online seminar on a given topic. They are recorded and made available online. These could be scheduled for use during the Culture Class portion of the meeting.

The Past President, Bruce Berg, reported on several topics. First, the By-Laws changes are currently on hold. Next, he reported that the OrchidWiz subscription is now up for renewal. It was moved and passed to have the subscription renewed. Carol was asked to handle the renewal process.

Bruce discussed the Garner Fund Trust legal issues. The text of the Garner Fund Trust instruments and the SDCOS Board motions regarding the Garner Fund Trust have been examined. The Trust instrument does not place restrictions on the use of the Funds. The Board motions regarding the Trust does place restrictions on the use of the Funds and the investment strategy. The current SDCOS Board recommended to the Finance Committee that the Garner Fund principle should be invested in funds yielding higher return rates than the current CD rates with an emphasis on preserving the principle.

Bruce noted that Balboa Park has changed the parking regulations adjacent to the Casa Del Prado building. This impacts the Society's parking access for meetings and shows.

The October Show plans were also discussed in this light.

Balboa Park's Centennial Plans were discussed. We have been invited to participate by having a booth and representatives on hand on May 9th. The board requested David Brown to reply to SDBGF confirming our participation in this event. Our focus will be on orchids of the Panama area and related Orchid Conservation topics.

Our participation in the San Diego County Fair (SDCF) for the coming year was discussed. The board nominated Bruce to be the SDCOS representative to the SDCF for discussing the theme, display requirements and liaison with the SDCF officiers, primarily Cindy Benoit.

Bruce also noted that the Spring Show Budget must be approved by the membership. Dave Hoffmaster has drawn up a draft budget and this budget must be published in the November and December newsletters and voted upon at the January meeting. A motion recommending the draft budget to the membership was passed.

In regards to early advertising materials for the Spring Show, funds for presale tickets, bookmarks and quarter-sheet flyers was requested. In separate motions, the board approved separate motions for 1) printing bookmarks; 2) printing presale tickets and quarter-sheet flyers. Debby Halliday volunteered to redesign the quarter-sheet flyers.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:14 PM & the next Board meeting is **November 6**, at **7 PM**.
