If you haven't registered online to enter your orchids for ribbon competition at this year's San Diego County Fair, May 1<sup>st</sup> is the deadline!

To read the rules, click "flower show", or if you are ready to start, go to top right of the screen and click "sign in". I'd recommend that you print out the rules, since they will give you the dates you will need to bring in your plants as well as the classes of plants that you'll need when registering your plants.

#### choose "exhibitor".

Follow the prompts and fill in the blanks. You are a "first time exhibitor" and you are signing up in the "Flower Show Department", and the "Orchid Specimen Division". Select "Class 5, All 6 Specimen Shows. \$30". Payment must be with a credit card.

While a bit confusing, this will register you for the five competitive weeks of the fair. The rules talk about a separate division for cut flowers, but I have not seen online how to register for that division. 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

#### Culture Article for May -Using Rainwater, Part 1: Collection by Bruce Berg

With the drought conditions that we are currently facing, as orchid growers, we need to explore alternatives to providing good water to our orchids. I have been using rainwater collected from my roof for the past three years and will share with you my lessons learned. I started out using tap water until observing that the tips of the leaves of many of my plants, particularly the oncidium types were turning black. After listening to a Society culture talk and asking questions from our members of the probable cause being the high salt content of the water here in our municipal water.

Orchids in their natural state, and more important to those of us who buy orchids from vendors, is that these orchids are grown using water with very low salt content. If we add fertilizer (which are salts) to salty water, we are giving our plants a double shot of bad water. So, what can we do? One thing is to start with water that is very low in salt. We use the terms "DI" and "RO" to describe water that has salts removed by either a deionized water process or a reverse osmosis water process. The third option is to use rainwater which by nature comes very low in contaminants. If we use tap water, there is another option, which is to flush the plants with lots of water and thus flush out most of the excess salts. This option is not a good one going forward into a drought situation when water will be restricted.

When I decided to improve my water quality, my first attempt was to go with a DI system. The advantage of this system was that it was a rental system that connected directly into an outdoor water hose bib. I only had to sign a contract with the distributor (Siemens) who



delivered and set up the tank. I connected the outlet to a timer and misting system to water my plants. Water quality was 0.0 ppm salts and no waste water. The only drawback to me was that I had a bill to pay every month, and when it rained, I could see all that beautiful, free rain going out to the street. Also, the mathematics told me that 1" of rainfall on 900 Sf of roof should yield 600 gallons of water.

#### Culture cont'd

Since I love to tinker with projects, and since I already had my timer and sprinkler system installed, I did a cost analysis and convinced myself that I could purchase the materials to install a rainwater collection system for about what a DI system was costing me.

My system involves disconnecting the 90 degree elbow from two of my roof gutters, and placing 55 gallon barrels (from Nico Goossens) under them to collect the water. I put dirty water sump pumps (Harbor Freight) into the barrels and connect them to garden hoses (I made a 90 degree PVC elbow riser from the pump so that the hose would hang down straight). The garden hose runs up to my orchid area where I have two "water totes" that are 275 gallons each. I plumbed them together on the tops with a manifold which drops water into the top of each tank, using an air gap so that there is no siphoning back down the garden hose. The tanks have valves on the bottom that I connected together and run to a pump (next article on distribution). I painted the tanks to keep light out and also treat the water by pouring Physan 20 periodically into the water.

Before I bought the water totes, I used plastic 33 gallon trash cans to store the water. I still use these along with five 55 gallon barrels.

When using the trash cans, I put a plastic trash can liner in the can as extra light blocker. When my Totes get low, I remove the trash can liners and then pump water from the trash cans back into the totes.

So, am I satisfied? No. While my rainwater is only about 35 ppm I use all the water I can currently store by about the end of May (about 1000 gallons). My solution for now is to switch to RO after my rainwater is gone.

I have a RO filter system that I use to fill the totes when all of my rainwater has been used. I also use the RO system to produce filtered drinking water for us to drink. A problem with RO water is that RO systems creates waste water where the excess salts are concentrated. The waste water is pumped to our garden where it either waters our vegetables or our fruit trees.

And the costs? My initial investment paid for itself the first two years. However, having to replace the pump after the first year and having to replace RO filters increases the life cycle costs. I believe that my total costs are still less than a rental of DI equipment. Until I can find space in my yard for more water storage, I will probably continue with my current system.


# A successful potting workshop!

The consensus among the experts was that the plant is suffering from bacterial damage, possibly secondary to cold or sunburn or both. The solutions suggested all involve antibacterial treatment and keeping the plant dry to discourage bacterial growth.
