Speaker - Dave Hoffmaster

June is repotting time. For those of you who missed our very informative potting workshop this month, you're in luck. Dave Hoffmaster will be demonstrating and explaining how to divide and repot Cattleyas.

Dave is a life member of the SDCOS and has been in the club for about 12 years.

He was also our Spring Show chairman from 2013 – 2015. Dave learned to love growing plants early in life, when his father was a botanist at Penn State. He would hang out in the greenhouse and experience the pleasure of helping green things grow. His wife Patti introduced Dave to orchids when they met in 1999.

Speaker - Dr. Norito Hasegawa

The speaker at our June meeting will be **Dr. Norito Hasegawa**. The topic of his talk will be "**Multifloral Paphiopedilums**".

Norito was born in Los Angeles and is a now-retired dentist. He first became interested in orchids after seeing orchids in mass at the World Orchid Conference held in Long Beach in 1966. Although he failed miserably with his first orchid, he persisted in trying to grow them outdoors, and in no time he had hundreds.

Over 35 years ago, Norito became a judge in both the Cymbidium Society of America and the American Orchid Society. He has traveled over 3 million miles to many foreign countries talking and/or judging in places such as Japan, South Africa, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Denmark, Germany, New Zealand, Taiwan, England, France, Switzerland, and many

When Patti & Dave moved to the San Diego area in 2001, he took advantage of the opportunity to begin growing orchids at home.

Dave grows his plants outdoors on the patio and in a very efficient shade house on their coastal North County property. His collection includes cattleyas, other hybrids, and also many of the more exotic and challenging species. He has about 250 plants which all thrive under his care.

Dave will repot and divide one of his cattleyas and will talk about the most important considerations for being successful. He will discuss culture, pot choices, and media selection, and will demonstrate the techniques he uses to create a healthy transplanted orchid. As a bonus, the division he creates will be placed on the opportunity table where you could win it in the raffle.

This is a great chance to become more knowledgeable and confident about repotting your cattleyas. Now is the perfect time of year for this job, so come learn from an expert!

Debby Halliday and Jack Schaefer Co-Chairs







Summary of Minutes from the Board of Directors Meeting for May 2016

Board of Directors Meeting: The San Diego County Orchid Society's Board meeting was held on May 5th, 2016.

Attending were Scott LaBouff, Kay Klausing, Carol Berg, Bruce Berg, Jack Schaefer, Bob Clark, Carol Kerr & Carey McCoy. Debby Halliday was excused absent. The meeting was opened at 7:09 PM.

The Secretary reported that the April Board minutes were approved by email and were published in the May Newsletter.

The Treasurer distributed copies of the monthly treasurer's report to board members for review. A motion was made & passed to file the report for audit.

The webmaster reported on updates to the website. Bob Clark noted that a copy of the current membership email list would be given to the webmaster to update the web email facility.

The Membership Chair reported that the total membership was up.

Spring Show Relocation Report – The Board has been researching alternative venues for the Spring Show with an eye to reducing the cost of the facility. A review of the facilities at Marina Village in Mission Bay was conducted including an on-site tour of the buildings. It was concluded that Marina Village did not provide any advantage in terms of price and had several deficits.

Jim Wright Fund – Scott noted that the board should focus on projects with long term benefit to the Society.

Kay reported on the proposal to provide LED lighting over all plant display tables for our shows. Jack provided table sizes and counts plus power availability data. Kay showed 4 possible designs to the board and reported on

the cost of each. In all cases the cost would make the project unfeasible. It was decided to drop this proposal. Debby Halliday had noted at a prior board meeting that providing lath panels as backdrops in the vendor area would be welcomed by the vendors using the central portion of the floor space. The board approved the idea. Scott noted that supplies for this project could be obtained from a local source using the source's community non-profit vouchers.

The report on the Spring Show Wrap-Up meeting was deferred to the next board meeting.

Bob Clark moved to rescind the motion creating a new Director-at-Large position. The motion passed after much debate. Bob moved to create a Show Oversight Coordinator position as a Standing Committee. The board accepted the motion.

President Scott LaBouff commented on a new student member, Olivia Salonen, who has joined the Society. Welcome Olivia!

Scott commented on plans for the Society to develop a quarterly program for use in education systems in the San Diego area. He reported that John Walters has committed to providing support for our plan.

He also reported that the Society's page has been implemented on the Balboa Park App. He had a few wording issues to discuss with the app's creator, but generally our page looks good.

Scott asked Carol Berg to research a Bus Excursion to the Huntington Botanical Garden's Orchid Show in October. He noted that the AOS Fall Member meeting is being held in conjunction with the Show.

The Balboa Park Garden Party event has invited the Society to participate. However this year they are asking for a sizable application

fee. It was decided that we would not participate.

Our 1st VP, Kay Klausing, reported that Norito Hasegawa will discuss Multifloral Paphs at the June General Meeting. He noted that *Orchids* magazine will have the dates for our orchid shows in their next issue.

Our 2nd Vice-President Debby Halliday was absent but had noted previously that the Culture Class in June would feature Dave Hoffmaster with a presentation on Cattleya Repotting.

Under General Board Member's Items, Carol Kerr continued her review of the current Society Seal. She showed the board a large version of the old seal and discussed various ways of creating a new clean copy.

Carey McCoy reported on the design of our booth at the San Diego County Fair. She showed the board several sketches and reported on the quantity and positioning of loaned plants. There was some concern about lighting in the booth so Jack Schaefer and Bruce Berg agreed to look at the lights available in the garage and decide what would work best.

Past President Bruce Berg gave an update on the San Diego County Fair plans. Bruce requested, and was granted, funds for supplies for the display. He asked Jack Schaefer to use the web email system to send out a notification of the application process for Society Members who wish to enter plants for competition at the Fair. Bruce agreed to write up a paragraph and forward it to Jack for distribution.

Bruce also commented that the bookmarks we use as advertising materials need to be updated with new photos on the front side and a revision of the Show dates and information on the back side. He requested

funds for the purchase of updated bookmarks to be available at the Fair. His motion was passed.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:38 PM and the next SDCOS Board meeting will be on June 2nd at 7PM.


