This month's culture class is about growing Tolumnias, those delightful minioncidiums we all enjoy so much. They pack a lot of impact into a very small, compact package with their sprays of brightly colored flowers coming out of surprisingly small plants.

Nico Goossens will be our speaker. He has focused on Tolumnias for many

years and really knows how to grow them. Whether it is mounting, watering, over-wintering, or coaxing out the maximum amount of blooms, Nico has cracked the code.

He grows orchids with Lisa Humphreys at Lico Orchids and is a long-time member of our society. Most of you will

# GENERAL MEETING - July 5th, 7:30 PM Stanhopeas

Speaker - Ron Parsons

The speaker at our July meeting will be Ron Parsons.

The topic of his talk will be Stanhopeas.

Ron Parsons has been growing orchids for over 40 years and has been interested in and has grown species orchids for most of that time. He loves to photograph orchids and other flowers whenever he can, whether it is in collections or on trips to see them in nature. Ron has approximately 40,000 digital images, most of which are orchids, and has a slide library of flower photographs that exceeds 100,000 images. He has about 2500 published photos that have appeared in magazines, periodicals, journals, and books. He was co-authored three books, all with Mary Gerritsen. The first two are called *Masdevallias, Gems of the Orchid World* and *Calochortus, Mariposa Lilies and their Relatives,* and a third book has just been published in January of 2014, a two-volume set called *A Compendium of Miniature Orchid Species.* The most recent book has nearly 1200 pages,



The Secretary reported that the May Board minutes were approved by email and were published in the June Newsletter.

The Treasurer distributed copies of the monthly treasurer's report to board members for review. A motion was made & passed to file the report for audit.

The webmaster reported on updates to the website.

The Membership Chair reported on the current membership count.

Jack Schaefer and Debby Halliday reported on the Spring Show Wrapup meeting. One of the results was the decision to move the selection of the Show Theme for 2017 2 months forward to the July General Meeting.
