This will be an interesting talk since we can learn from the pro about this genus where hybrids are so commonplace but species are hard to find and not often seen in collections.


George will also provide a matching plant opportunity table for the April meeting with Cymbidium species and hybrids.



Getting Ready for Summer

Now that winter is over, the plants we've kept inside to protect them from cold and wet conditions can be safely moved back outdoors. We know that we need to prepare our plants for the season when many of them will begin a period of rapid growth and we need to get the outside growing areas ready for them. As a guideline, most of the hardy plants can be moved outside when the nighttime temperatures remain above 50 degrees or after our Spring Show is over.

Spring Cleaning: Now is the time to do a bit of spring cleaning and look over the area where we will move our plants for the summer. Do a check to see that the area can provide the basic requirement your plants will need: light levels appropriate to the type of plant. Check benches or mounting areas for structural soundness. Spray with a bactericide like "Physan 20", or diluted "Clorox." If you have a spraying or watering system, check and clean filters and valves. Replace washers. Test to make sure everything works. Test water quality if you are using RO or DI, and you haven't used it for a while. Add Physan 20 to water tanks. Check your drainage system to make sure you don't have a potential mosquito problem. Put out snail and slug baits just to be safe. These pests are on the move this time of year and are looking for new homes and tender food. Spray for ants if necessary.

Preparation: Before you start working with your plants, set up a work area where you can have room to spread out and have your materials handy. You will probably need the following items: pots and potting mix; a tub or box to mix your potting mix in; your favorite potting tools such as gloves, spray bottles, scissors, etc.; virus testing supplies; Physan 20; rooting stimulants; newspapers; extra plant labels and soft lead pencils; and buckets to collect waste plant material and

old bark. Make a shopping list and get your stuff ready! I recommend a trip to Calavo Gardens!

Pots: You can reuse your old pots, but I would recommend that you go ahead and buy new ones. They are inexpensive, and you do not have to worry about virus transmittal. If you want to reuse clay pots, most experienced members would recommend that you clean them as best as you can and then heat them slowly in an oven set at 400 degrees for at least an hour, allowing them to cool in the oven before removing them and reusing them. If you have a sterilant spray to apply before potting, that would be a good idea also. Plastic pots can be washed then soaked for an hour in a solution of 1 cup Clorox per gallon of water. followed by a final rinse with clean water before reusing. A final spray with a sterilant is also advised. Use protective gloves and clothing when working with these chemicals. As a note, some members use plastic pots to plant their orchids in, and then put the plastic pots inside clay pots which provide humidity and stability and protection for wandering roots.

Potting Tools: I recommend that you purchase two cement grout mixing tubs to mix your orchid bark in, unless you have something better that you already have. They come in two sizes at Home Depot. The small one at about \$7 is just about right. Two of them will make the job easier, one to hold the mix, and one to use when taking your plants out of the old pots. You'll need a trowel to measure and mix the ingredients. You'll also need a supply of newspapers to line the tub as you take the plants out of the old pots and remove the old mix and to give you a clean work area for repotting each plant. Use a clean razor blade (you can find cheap ones in the paint department at Home Depot or at

The county fair website is now open for online registration for individuals who wish to participate in the 2017 San Diego County Fair orchid competition. You have until May 12 to complete your registration to compete for ribbons and cash awards associated with the ribbons. Go to SDFAIR.com and select "participate" then select "competitive exhibits" then scroll down until you see the flowers box and select "flower show." When you select flower show "enter now", you will be taken to a screen that starts your registration process. Hit the "register button." You will need to use a credit card to pay the registration fee. Follow the prompts to get to the screen where you select whether you want to register for one show, or all 5 shows. There is one show per week during the duration of the fair. It is a good idea to print out and read the rules before registering. Orchids are the last two Divisions, 5100 and 5101.

Potting Mix: You have a lot of choices here. Potting mix will vary based in part on the type of plant you are potting, the size of the plant and its roots, your watering habits, your microclimate, and your budget. I'll provide a future article on potting and potting mix options.

Repotting Workshop

Mark your calendars for April 15th. Bruce and Carol Berg will host a repotting workshop for new members as well as for other members who would like help learning how to repot your orchids. The workshop will start at 10 AM. Debby Halliday and several other experienced members will give hands on demonstrations showing how to repot orchids and help members repot their orchids. Test kits should be available for virus testing.

The address for the event is 9228 Maranda Dr. in Santee, CA. If you are coming east on Highway 52 into Santee, take the Mast exit, cross under the freeway and proceed on Mast Blvd until you reach Maranda Drive. It's a right turn just past the bridge over the lakes and thru the intersection with a signal light. We are on the left side of the street as you drive up. If you are coming north on H 125 into Santee, turn right onto Mission Hills and take a left onto Carlton Hills. Take a left onto Carlton Oakes and then a quick right onto E Heaney Circle and then left onto Maranda Dr.

The Society will have supplies available for the repotting. The cost per plant will be \$5 to cover cost of materials. Members are requested to only bring in one or two plants so that we can help everyone. Ben Machado is furnishing the materials, and members wishing to preorder additional materials from Ben should do so prior to the meeting. Ben now carries Kiwi bark from New Zealand which is a higher quality potting material used by some of our members. Note the bark we will be using is Sequoia bark.



From the editor -

A cautionary tale

An exchange for trading in orchids and orchid seedlings is now operating in Yunnan, China. Exchanges allow the efficient pricing of commodities and make it easier for buyers and sellers to connect. The Yunnan exchange facilitates trading in orchid seedlings from commercial growers and marks the growth of the orchid market into a true commodity market. Exchanges also allow rapid price fluctuation of commodities with demand as well as futures purchases and short selling (bets that the price of an orchid seedling tomorrow will be higher or lower than today).

In the early 1600s, tulips in the Netherlands transitioned from a curiosity to a commodity and tulips became the 4th leading export product (after gin, herring and cheese). As prices rose, markets that enabled futures contracts (including trading fees) arose and

the price of tulip bulbs escalated rapidly; futures trades in the formal exchange and outside it enabled many to make a fortune overnight. Unfortunately, a rapid escalation of prices culminating in the fall of 1636 was followed in February of 1637 with the bubble bursting and the price index for tulip bulbs falling by about 20-fold between Feb 3 and May 1. "Tulip mania" is now a buzzword for irrational and dangerous market behavior.
