Knowing how to detect, diagnose and treat these challenges is vital to becoming a successful orchid grower.

Besides occasional attacks by the usual suspects such as aphids, mealybugs, scale and the like, our speaker recently defeated an infestation of thrips, one of the most difficult of orchid insects to control. Come hear tips and strategies for prevention as well as elimination of this pest and their other unwelcome friends so your collection can grow strong.

He entered the AOS judge's training program in 1973, and was elevated to Certified Judge in 1983. In 1996, he moved to Mexico where he ultimately spent 10 years. He returned to California in 2007 only to find he had to recertify as a judge for the AOS. He once again became a judge in 2013.

Curtis writes "Orchiditis is a compelling and insidious disease, it takes over your life if you let it, and becomes all-consuming. I love it, and every day I find something new to explore.

"While in Mexico, I had the chance to look for Orchids in the states of Nayarit, Jalisco, Colima, Michoacan, and Guerrero. I was able to find many epiphytes and semi-terrestrial species. Through some contacts there, I was also given the opportunity to re-locate many plants slated for destruction because of road improvement projects and the like. We moved them to a nearby area and they were saved.

"During my "re-training" as a Judge, I had to prepare a presentation on how certain species influence the hybrids. I chose Oncidium leucochilum, a Mexican species, as my subject. The research that I did for the presentation is the basis for this talk. I also have an interest in other species in the Oncidinae alliance, one of which is Gomesa echinata (formerly Baptistonia echinata) and what might result from using this species as a hybrid parent.

Oncidiums

This month I will provide some additional information for several of the species of Oncidiums listed on our website. Some of the more interesting plants in the oncidium group are the hybrids which I hope to write about later.

General culture notes: When repotting oncidiums, use smaller sized mixes when repotting plants with smaller roots. Place plants where the new growths are going to have the most growing space away from the edge of the pots. New growths and inflorescences usually emerge from the base of the first leaf on a new pseudobulb. Use a balanced fertilizer on plants during the growing season. Flush out the pots once a month to get rid of built up salts from fertilizers. Fertilize weakly, weekly. frequently enough so that the top one third of the pot can dry out by night time. This means it is best to water in the morning. watering when the days are cool and overcast since the roots will not dry out quickly if cold and soaking wet. Try several locations to find where the light conditions are best for your plants. For a starting point, check out Jay Pfahl's web site or Orchid Wiz for lighting conditions.

Oncidium flexuosum: This is a plant which produces many branching inflorescences of bright yellow flowers up to or more than 200 flowers per plant on specimen plants. It likes a slightly lower light than cattleyas (1800 – 2500 fc). It does well in smaller sized shallow well-draining pots using medium sized potting mix. In nature they tend to bloom in fall into winter. Fertilize weakly weekly with a balanced fertilizer when the plants are actively growing.

Oncidium incurvum: This is a small, Mexican species with purple blooms and a

white lip. This is a cool growing orchid from the cloud forests. Andy lists this orchid as a fragrant, easy to grow orchid.

Oncidium leucochilum: This is a large sized, cool growing Mexican species with 1 to 12 ft long inflorescences with many brown with white lipped flowers and branches. Hardy grower in a basket. Use loose planter mix.

Oncidium ornithorhynchum: This is a small, fragrant, yellow flowered plant from Columbia. Note, until 2010, there was a mistake in classification in this plant and it was described as a pink flowered plant per Jay Pfahl. Our website description is in error. It is a cool growing plant that blooms with low light in the summer with long (20") pendant star shaped inflorescences.

Oncidium tigrinum: This is a very large, cool to cold growing, (3") Mexican species that is fragrant and very striking to see. It is called the tiger striped oncidium for its bold stripes on the petals which contrast against a bright yellow lip. The plant blooms in the fall and winter season and is a cool to cold grower.

In Memoriam Siv Garrod

SDCOS friends are mourning the sudden passing of Siv Garrod on Tuesday, June 27th. Siv joined our club in 1985 and enjoyed participating in our club's Species Group. For many years, Siv organized the sign up of hosts for the monthly Species Group meetings. As an avid collector of orchid species, she was an expert in their culture. enjoying their flowers year after year. She built an enviable collection. One of her favorites was the genus Neofinetia, also known as the Japanese Wind Orchid or Samurai Orchid. She always happily volunteered her time at our shows, helping participants to register their orchids for judging, ensuring that plants were in their proper sections, putting out section signs, and sharing her knowledge of plants when judging the species sections, her favorite. After judging, Siv would, on her own initiative, pick up and sort judging materials to be stored away until our next show, then join her friends to visit and enjoy the show. Often she donated orchid divisions from her collection to Conservation Sales and helped buyers select plants that would grow well for them wherever they lived. Siv also participated on our Conservation Committee helping to evaluate research and project proposals worth funding.

Outside of SDCOS, Siv's expertise was valued at the San Diego Zoo's orchid house where she volunteered one day a week for several years. Siv was also an avid grower of roses, enjoyed painting in watercolor, and was an active member of the House of Sweden, participating in all of their activities and working at the Glögg booth every December Nights in Balboa Park.

Professor <u>Gustaf Arrhenius</u>, a founding scientist of UCSD, was instrumental in getting Siv to move to San Diego in 1968. At



UCSD, she worked with many distinguished scientists, one of them being Martin Kamen, who discovered Carbon 14. She was a research chemist at the Susan S Taylor Laboratory from 1987 until her retirement in 2004. She had several published papers on photosynthesis. It was at UCSD where she met her husband, Chris Garrod, Emeritus Minister of Networks, orchid spouse, and member of SDCOS. Siv and Chris shared 31 years of happy marriage together.
