
GENERAL MEETING - September 5th, 7:30 PM Orchids of Crete & OCA Travelog

Speaker - Peter Tobias

Peter Tobias will be our speaker in September. He will be sharing photos of the orchids encountered on the April 2017 OCA trip to Crete. Crete is home to some of the most fascinating terrestrial orchid species, especially members of the genus Ophrys, or bee orchids. These delightful tricksters mimic certain female bees and produce pheromones to attract male bees. Pollination occurs when the bees pick up pollinia while trying to mate with the fake females. Their colors and patterns are rich and beautiful.

Peter started growing orchids on a Chicago windowsill in the mid 1970's with a white Phalaenopsis. His interest grew when a friend helped him to import some plants from India and Brazil so that he got a sense of the wide variety of orchids out there. An Ornithocephalus or a Dendrochilum is a lot different from a Phalaenopsis!

Ever since then he has enjoyed collecting and trying to grow odd species. Orchid growing became a lot easier when he moved to Southern California in 1980 and joined the San Diego County Orchid Society. The majority of his collection is now grown outdoors. In fact, Peter grows many of his orchids on the avocado trees in his back yard. The plants seem to have no idea that they are not in a jungle somewhere and grow and bloom beautifully in his very natural habitat.

Most of you also know Peter as the founder of the Orchid Conservation Alliance, a non-profit dedicated to the creation and preservation of orchid reserves. To date they have raised over \$173,000 enabling over 1256 acres to be preserved in six South American reserves. As part of their outreach and fund raising, the OCA organizes trips to interesting orchid habitats around the world. Travelling with fellow orchid nuts is a great way to see new places and search for plants. I have had the pleasure of participating in some of these adventures and I can highly recommend them.

I am excited to see the photos of Crete and the orchids they found there, and to hear more about this fascinating trip. It promises to be a very interesting presentation. Don't miss it!

PEOPLE'S CHOICE AWARD AT THE JULY SHOW IN THE PARK



We had great participation in our People's Choice voting at the latest show in the park. 634 people voted, which is at least double the number we have ever had before. The winner was Phalaenopsis Malibu Bistro 'Richard Waugh' HCC/AOS, grown by Debby Halliday.

The top 10 plants accounted for 50% of the votes. 109

different orchids received at least one vote! What a credit to the quality of this show. 26 different growers received at least one vote. That shows a high level of participation by our members, and clearly the visitors noticed.

We also learned more about how visitors learned about our show. 55% saw signs or walked in after they were in the park. We plan to purchase more signs to make our presence even more visible. 22% heard about the show at other orchid events or through our bookmarks and flyers. Clearly these are also worthwhile. We will be making our questions even more specific for our next show and will keep exploring ways to attract more people to our great exhibitions and Thanks and congratulations to sales. everyone who groomed and brought in their plants. You made this our best park show ever!

FYI – the real point of the People's Choice Award is to slow down our visitors and get them to really look at the plants. 





San Diego County Orchid Society Minutes of the Board of Directors Regular Meeting August 3, 2017

Summary

Attendees:

Kay Klausing, Debby Halliday, Ken Campbell, Tom Ketelaar, Myra DeTate, Carol Kerr, Pedro Sanchez, and Scott LaBouff. Bob Clark was not present – excused absent.

The meeting was held at Balboa Park - Casa Del Prado Building, Room 104. The call to order came at 7:03 P.M. by Kay Klausing, President.

Secretary's Report: - Tom Ketelaar

1. July 2017 Board and General meeting minutes had been approved via email.

2. On July 26, 2017 via email, Kay Klausing made a motion to upgrade the SDCOS presentation computer operating system from Windows 8 to Windows 10 with the cost not exceeding \$120.00. The motion was seconded; an email vote of the Board members was taken. The motion was approved.

Treasurer's Report: - Myra DeTate

1. Myra presented the July financials. There were routine questions. Scott made a motion to accept the July financials. The motion was seconded, voted upon and approved.

2. Also presented were the financial results for the July show in the park.

President's Items: - Kay Klausing

1. Research for a new transport cart to move show materials from the transport trucks to Room 101 and back for park shows has begun. Lou Wilson had provided Tom with some preliminary research. If purchased, the transport cart would be the possession of SDCOS, used only for park shows, and housed in the storage garage. Board members discussed more vendor choices, types, weight concerns, transport on the load trucks, shipping costs, etc. Research on this item will continue.

2. The use of social media to spread information about the various shows to the membership was again under discussion. Various board members reviewed actions they had taken to get information about the July show out to the public by use of various social media channels. The channels used and others to be considered will continue. Debby had made a concentrated effort to use Facebook for show details dissemination. She incurred some expense by paving to move the SDCOS show information higher in the Facebook notice ladder. Scott made a motion to reimburse Debby the amount of \$50.00 for that expense. The motion was seconded, voted upon, and approved.

3. Kay is working on the various committee appointments. He will be contacting the current committee chairs and approaching others to serve and obtain their consent to serve. Once that task has been completed, the committee appointments will be presented to the Board and finalized.

4. The format and distribution of the SDCOS newsletter again came up for discussion. Suggestions for a new format is requested from the membership; David Eveleth, current newsletter editor, has been consulted. The Board is researching pricing, printing and distribution vendors, electronic and hard copy distribution, advertising sources, etc.

5. The drive for new members, the reasons members both new and seasoned joined SDCOS, keeping happy members, more participation by members, the interests of the membership, current activities and the need for new activities to serve the membership are major goals for Kay during the current Board's term. He will be personally interviewing both new and current membership individuals to request their suggestions and insights. The new suggestion box has already received items for improvement, comments about the new meeting time-line parameters; placing the meeting agenda on the projection screen was well received and made the time restraints flow well. Keeping the Board and General meetings focused and efficiently run is another targeted goal.

6. The SDCOS website presentation was again introduced for consideration. This led to very exciting and dynamic exchange of ideas regarding the Society's website. At times there were two and three separate discussions taking place making it difficult to record. Whether to reconstruct a new design from scratch or to use the structure of the current website were two of the items energetically expressed by various members. After discussion that was not able to resolve the issues at hand, Debby made a motion that Carol Kerr and Jack Schaefer develop a proposal to be presented to the Board for the website. The motion was seconded, voted upon with one abstention, and approved.

First Vice-President Items: - Debby Halliday

1. Debby will provide in the September newsletter information and details regarding the September meeting's main speaker.

2. She provided a written detailed report of the People's Choice Ballot results for the July show. There was a total of 634 ballots cast, the most since collecting the ballots of the people began. There were votes for 109 plants and 26 exhibitors with the top 10 plants receiving 50% of votes cast. She will be providing more details in the September newsletter.

3. Data also tallied from the People's Choice Ballots was how attendees learned about the July show. Many of the attendees were driven to the show by the signs they saw around the park and outside the entrances to Room 101. This led to a discussion of the need for more signage and placement at strategic locations in the park for future shows. Carol Kerr will be assisting Debby and Scott LaBouff in gathering designs, prices, placement locations, types of signs, etc. so the Board has data to consider for increased signage.

Second Vice-President Items: - Ken Campbell

1. Ken will provide in the September newsletter information and details regarding the September meeting's Culture Class.

2. Ken presented his "Second VP Talking Points" to the Board. Items presented, briefly discussed, and open for future consideration were: a) the flow of the General Meeting agenda, b) Total length of the General Meeting, c) the need for the Microsoft Office Suite and security software being placed on the presentation computer to make it compatible with presentation materials used by the society and presenters.

Past President Items: - Scott LaBouff

1. Scott will be working with Pedro Sanchez to develop a plan to bring more Hispanic heritage attendees to participate in the society and the shows the society offers to the public.

Thursday, September 7, 2017, at 7:00 P.M. – Balboa Park - Casa Del Prado building, Room 104.

No other items being on the agenda, Kay made the motion to adjourn the meeting; it was seconded and approved.
