CULTURE CLASS - October 3rd, 6:30 PM Orchid viruses - detection and prevention

Speaker - Kay Klausing

This month's class will address a very important topic, orchid viruses. I have been asked, "Why should I care about viruses?" And the answer is that one infected plant can spread the disease and put your entire collection at risk. At risk of what you ask?... Shorter lived blooms, lower flower quality, reduced plant vigor, and a gradual decline in the overall plant health. Clearly not the path to winning ribbons at the shows.

Since many plants show no visible or immediate signs of infection, virus

detection has in the past been difficult. Fortunately simple and inexpensive test kits are now available that can detect the most common virus types. In class tonight we will not only do some actual virus testing, but also discuss how to minimize the chances of a virus spreading across your collection. If you have a plant and would like to see it tested please bring it in. There will be a nominal charge of \$2 per plant to cover the test kit cost.

GENERAL MEETING - October 3rd, 7:30 PM Back to China

Speaker - Ron Parsons

Our speaker for the October meeting will be Ron Parsons, with photographs and information from one of his many trips to China.

Ron Parsons has been growing orchids for more than 40 years, and has been interested in species orchids for most of that time. Ron loves to photograph orchids and most other flowers whenever he can, whether it be on trips to see them in nature or in collections. He loves to travel to see orchids in the wild, and does so as often as possible.

Ron has close to 60,000 digital images, most of which are of orchids, and still retains a slide library that exceeds 100,000 botanical images. He has almost 3500 published photos that have appeared in magazines, periodicals, journals and books. Ron has co-authored three botanical books, all with Mary E. Gerritsen. The first two, published by Timber Press, are *Masdevallias, Gems of the Orchid World* and *Calochortus, Mariposa Lilies and their Relatives*. Most

recently, the third book, a large, luxurious, two-volume set, *A Compendium of Miniature Orchid Species* was published by Redfern Natural History Productions in January of 2014. The latter has nearly 1200 pages, 1800 photographs, and features more than 500 species.

Ron has just returned from China, so it seems appropriate to have him present one of his lectures about the orchids of China. This is what he says about this lecture. In 2013, I made my second trip to the province of Sichuan (known to most Americans as Szechwan) in China. In 2012 I went on a tour led by the late slipper orchid specialist Holger Perner and his wife, Wenging, to see various Cypripedium species (the temperate species of slipper orchids, found only in the northern hemisphere, and generally in colder climes). I enjoyed that trip so immensely that when Holger said he could arrange another tour in 2013 but visit at least a few new sites. I signed up again, this time from June 17- July 01. We saw a number of rare and beautiful orchids as well as numerous other amazing flowers and stunning scenery. This talk will feature the diversity of Sichuan, China seen on this trip.

I'm sure we will all enjoy virtually joining Ron on this wonderful tour. It will be a real treat to see his photographs and to learn more about the native flora of Sichuan.

The plant opportunity table will be provided by Andy's Orchids, so you will want to plan to participate in the raffle. See you in October!

Summary

Attendees:

Kay Klausing, Debby Halliday, Ken Campbell, Tom Ketelaar, Myra DeTate, Carol Kerr, Bob Clark, and Scott LaBouff. Pedro Sanchez was not present – absent.

The meeting was held at Balboa Park - Casa Del Prado Building, Room 104. The call to order came at 7:10 P.M. by Kay Klausing, President.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> - Tom Ketelaar August 2017 Board meeting minutes had been approved via email.

Treasurer's Report: - Myra DeTate

Myra presented the August financials. Due to calendar timing, the investment accounts were the only figures not current. There were a few questions regarding the speakers' stipend and travel expenses but those issues were resolved during the Treasurer's Report section of the meeting. Kay made a motion to accept the August financials. The motion was seconded, voted upon and approved.

Membership Report: - Bob Clark

The issue of coordinating the printing, folding, stamping, and mail-out of the few hard-copy newsletters has been resolved for now by Betty Kelepecz stepping up to assume this task. Most newsletters are now disbursed to the membership through email service.

President's Items:

1. The new model for the newsletter continues in the development and transition phases. A link will be imbedded in the newsletter for those wishing to read the Board minutes in their entirety. Kay will find the person who will develop, test, and place the link to the Board minutes in to both the electronic and hard-copy newsletter. For

those people receiving the hard-copy of the newsletter and who do not have a computer to make use of the link but desire to read the minutes, they should let Kay know and a copy of the minutes will be provided to them.

- 2. Carol Kerr presented to the Board the preliminary changes for the SDCOS website that she, Jack Schaefer, and Jennifer Buckner have been working on. The Board members were impressed with the changes proposed and offered suggestions for the coloring, spacing, sizing, and content of various pages.
- 3. Kay is formulating a survey of current, new, and prospective SDCOS members. He requested of the Board and SDCOS membership to email him suggestions for questions and topics to be surveyed.

First Vice-President Items: - Debby Halliday Debby will provide in the October newsletter information and details regarding the October meeting's main speaker.

<u>Second Vice-President Items:</u> - Ken Campbell

- 1. Ken will provide in the October newsletter information and details regarding the October meeting's Culture Class.
- 2. Ken presented his "Second VP Talking Points" to the Board. He listed the speakers and topics arranged for the October and November General meetings.
- 3. Ken has purchased the license data for the installation of "Windows 10" on the SDCOS presentation computer. Items regarding ownership of the license were discussed with some details yet to be resolved. Ken will work on those.
- 4. Other purchases of hardware and software had been made which exceeded the \$120.00 amount the Board had previously approved. There was enlightening discussion regarding purchase procedures, not exceeding approved purchase limits, and the need for

correct itemization and receipting of purchases. After a lineal review of the expenses requested for reimbursement, the Board selected those items to reimburse. The Board is aware that due to price fluctuations and changes from the time of expenditure approval to actual purchase there may be a ten to twenty percent fluctuation in reimbursement requests. Kay made the motion to adjust amounts approved for presentation expenses, it was seconded, and approved.

Past President Items: - Scott LaBouff

- 1. Scott presented two bus excursions to "The Huntington Library, Art Collection, and Botanical Gardens" located in San Marino, California which are in the planning stages. This was a follow-up of the announcements Scott had made at the September 5th General meeting where he conducted a visual show of interest from the attendees. One excursion will be in October, the other in January 2018. Both will include tours of the botanical greenhouses but the January date will include more of the 'back lot' greenhouses that most visitors never see or visit. Scott will be providing more information on both excursions.
- 2. The Balboa Park SDCOS signage issue was discussed. Carol Kerr presented pictures of the signs, 'flags', sandwich boards, etc. to be considered. Following discussion, decisions were made to purchase specific items. Scott made a motion to expend no more than \$749.00 including taxes and other fees to purchase new signage. The motion was seconded, voted upon, and approved. It is planned that the new signage will be available for the October Fall SDCOS Park Show.



For those of you who breed orchids, researchers at Kumamoto University have developed a cultivation kit that does not appear to require sterile technique but rather uses live fungus to feed the germinating plants and report that cultivation efficiency is very good! Perhaps they will share their live cultures of bacteria and fungi that make this possible.

Since the culture of mushrooms for culinary use is now well established, maybe co-culture would work? There are mail-order mushroom cultivation kits where one buys a "log" that has been infected with fungi that under the right conditions yields multiple crops of tasty mushrooms - could something like that be developed for orchid seedling culture?
