

#### General Meeting, September 4<sup>th</sup>, 7:30 pm Tanya Lam: Long Lasting and Frequently Blooming Orchid Species Text by Debby Halliday, First VP

September's topic should be interesting to everyone. We are all trying to create collections with at least a few blossoms to enjoy, no matter the time of year. Many of us are also becoming more interested in growing more of the many fascinating orchid species. This lecture brings together both of these desires with a talk about long lasting and frequently blooming orchid species.

Our speaker is Tanya Lam. Tanya is an accomplished orchid grower and has spoken to many societies on various orchid topics. She lives in San Jose California where she grows many orchid genera both outdoors and in greenhouses. Tanya is juggling every day to work full time, travel frequently for business, take care of family, and tend to her orchid collections. As Tanya has expanded her collections over the past 20 years, she

has tried to have different orchids in bloom every day of the year. She does not want to miss seeing the blooms just because she is on business trips.

After seeing plants grow in their habitats in Thailand, Brazil, Ecuador, and China, she realized that the geographical diversity of orchids would help her achieve her goals. Tanya has now grown species from every continent and continues to search for long lasting and frequently blooming species to add to her collections.

For her presentation in September, she will share a list of recommended plants including photos and a brief overview of the growing conditions for each.

This is a great opportunity to learn about some orchid species that will add diversity and flowers to your collection. Don't miss it!

Tanya will also be speaking at the Palomar Orchid Society meeting on Wednesday night, where her topic will be "How to Get Your Orchids to Thrive in Challenging Environments".

Culture Class, September 4<sup>th</sup>, 6:30 pm Kay Klausing: Water – The Life Blood of Your Orchid Text by John Oswalt

No! Please do not water your orchids by placing ice cubes on the potting media once per week! Most of your orchids are native to tropical rainforests, or mountainous coastal regions or Mediterranean type climates. They do not like ice. The best way to care for your orchids is to simulate their natural habitat as much as possible and this includes giving them a quality drink of water.

We all know that San Diego water is not so healthy for our plants. Unless you live in parts of North County where clear water from the desalinization plant is blended with the local water, your water is hard, (high in total dissolved solids – TDS), alkaline (high pH) and likely high in chlorine. The dissolved solids are mostly salt and many of your orchids will not like this. When you add fertilizer to the water, you are essentially adding even more salt to the water. Your orchid might have trouble absorbing all the good nutrients, because of the bad salt in the water. Sounding hopeless and complicated?

Luckily, Kay Klausing is at your service to make sense of this! He will give us a water chemistry lesson that we can all understand. He will "boil this down", (no pun intended), to the simple facts. Then, he will offer advice and simple lessons learned to help you properly care for your valuable plants. He will offer solutions and some options that you can choose from to make your plants happy. The session will be informative, fun and helpful. Please come with your questions. Please join us for this fun and informative session prior to our main speaker. The presentation will begin promptly at 6:30 pm. Hope to see you there!

We owe a thank you to all the people who helped with the latest orchid show in Balboa Park. It starts with the set up crew on Friday afternoon followed by members bringing in plants to display that evening. It ends with the take down on Sunday and a trip back to the storage locker. In between is the show itself and all the volunteers that help with things like security, plant hotel, coffee and snacks, kid's corner, speakers and all the activities that make the show a success. It was one of the best attended shows we have had in quite a while. Members brought in 142 plants to show and put up 2 displays.

Thanks go to Pam Peters and Jerry Spencer for their work on registering and setting up all the plants that our members brought in. Thanks also to the volunteers that judged and awarded the orchids on Saturday morning. A list with the winning plant for each section and its owner is included in this newsletter. There were a particularly high number of species orchids this time and it is always interesting to see the diversity they offer. There were also a high number of eye catching Vandas and Phalaenopsis to add some flair to the show. All in all, there were a lot of spectacular flowers and they made for quite a show. Thanks to all the people that brought in plants.

Another big part of the show is the orchid vendors and all the plants they have for sale. We had a total of 14 vendors with a stunning array of orchids for sale in addition to a number of plants offered by individual members. Conservation had a booth as well

and they brought in over \$3600 to fund their activities. All in all, we sold over \$20,000 worth of plants (including Conservation) which is a new record for shows in the park. Special thanks go out to the people that worked the cash register and the volunteers that worked the sales booths. We have another show coming up at the end of October so start thinking about it. Start prepping your orchids to bring in and think about volunteering to help. It is a good way to meet other members and pick up tips about growing orchids.

#### Potting Workshop a Great Success! Text by Debby Halliday, First VP

We had a well-attended and successful potting workshop at Debby Halliday's on August 11<sup>th</sup>. Over 20 people attended including John Oswalt, Dave Hoffmaster, and Jack Schaefer who contributed their expertise in helping other members with their potting projects. Ben Machado provided us with a variety of pots and choices of mediums, so everyone could find the supplies they needed.

The workshop started promptly at noon with a delicious buffet of potluck offerings from our participants. Although the weather was warm, we all agreed that it was no worse than anywhere else that day. At least we had shade and a breeze. I think everyone enjoyed getting to know one another as we sat around several round tables in the garden for lunch.

Then it was time to get down to business. Debby gave a demonstration of repotting an overgrown Phalaenopsis. The group was attentive and asked great questions. John Oswalt then tackled an extremely overgrown cattleya, showing members how to get it out of the pot and divided into reasonable pieces. He then demonstrated potting some of the pieces up into new free standing plants. (We are growing the 6 divisions from this donated plant and they will be available for sale once they have settled in.)

Members then brought out their own plants and the job of repotting got underway in earnest. It's different to repot a plant with





your own hands, with expert advice, than it is to just watch someone else do it. Participants got better and more confident as the workshop went on. John had a cymbidium group on the lawn, where they spread out burlaps and really got their hands dirty! Cymbidium repotting is a hard job and everyone appreciated having John's help to do it.

After the plants were safe in their new pots, most of the group toured Debby's greenhouse and gardens. It was a busy afternoon, but people went home satisfied, confident, and having made some new friends. It was a worthwhile day!

Special thanks to all who stayed late and helped clean up the patio and kitchen.
