Culture Class, October 2nd, 6:30 pm John Oswalt: Orchids Outside the Pot Text by John Oswalt

Next thing you know, the roots are wrapped around the outside of the pot in a tangled mess. Or the plant has continued to produce bulbs, sheaths and new roots well beyond the boundary of the pot. Perhaps the plant looks happy and healthy, but what do you now do? Do you let it continue to grow wild or try to tame it into a new pot?

The October culture class will be based on the July 2018 American Orchid Society Orchids Magazine article, written by Sue Bottom. Sue writes a monthly article "For the Novice" and is an active member of the St. Augustine Orchid Society. John will review her June 2018 article points and solutions along with some additional suggestions.

General Meeting, October 2nd, 7:30 pm Angelic Nguyen: Fragrant Orchids Text by Debby Halliday, First VP

Our speaker for October will be Angelic Nguyen from Orchid Design in San Jose. Her topic will be Fragrant Orchids.

While most orchid enthusiasts are well aware that some orchids, such as Cattleyas, often smell quite good, many people don't realize just how many orchids actually are fragrant. At Angelic's sales booth at orchid shows, it's typical for people walking into the booth to ask, "What smells so good?", since fragrant orchids are one of her specialties. And while

there are a few orchids (fortunately very few) that have rather unpleasant odors, Angelic will talk about and show her excellent photos of the many different varieties that generally have very nice and interesting fragrances. You are sure to find more than a few that you might want in your collection. Included will be like the chocolate-scented favorites Oncidium Sharry Baby and coconut-smelling Maxillaria tenuifolia, but also more uncommon orchids such as the nightfragrant Rhyncholaelia digbyana (which needs to attract a moth as a pollinator), a few Phalaenopsis with fragrances, and many, many others.

Angelic Nguyen is an artist and designer who has been growing orchids for about 20 years. The varieties she grows include hybrid and Cattlevas, Cymbidiums, species Phalaenopsis, Dendrobiums. Laelias. Oncidiums, Lady Slippers, Lycastes, Bulbophylums, Vandas and many others. Recently she has also been concentrating on photography and has taken thousands of pictures. orchid She started her company, Orchid Design, in 1999 and has been participating in the Pacific Orchid Exposition, the Santa Barbara International Orchid Show, the San Diego International Orchid Show, and many other shows for the past decade. She is also an experienced presenter and frequently speaks and shares her pictures with orchid and garden societies. She has been involved in helping orchid societies with promoting orchid shows, including design and printing for postcards, brochures, and flvers. She is very active on social media and has also served as president, show chair, and as a board

There will also be a signup sheet at the October meeting. We need help starting Friday morning when we pack all the materials we need and haul them to Balboa Park for set up. It ends with take down on Sunday afternoon. In between, we need volunteers to man the cash registers, plant hotel, and provide security. Please consider signing up as we need your help. It is time well spent and an opportunity to get to know your fellow members.

The show will feature a number of vendors selling orchids for those wishing to shop. We will have a space for members that want to sell plants or related materials. If you want to sell plants, please let me know (davehoff5@yahoo.com) so I can provide enough space. You will need to tag your plants with bar codes and that needs to be arranged through Kay Klausing in advance.

Conservation will be selling plants to raise money for their projects. If you have plants you wish to donate to conservation, please bring them in Friday afternoon or Saturday morning. If you cannot bring them to Balboa Park, please contact Ron Kaufmann or Betty Kelepecz to make other arrangements.

All orchids have been tested free of Cym. Mosaic Virus and Odon. Ringspot Virus. All

have been rewrapped in the Japanese style and repotted in black plastic Japanese pots. These are species and a few hybrids. Some are inexpensive and some are rare. Photos can be sent if requested. Orchids can be mailed, at a minimal cost, to the contiguous states.
