On March 11, 2019, we lost a long-time member of our society. Bob Hodges was known as someone who always volunteered to help whenever we needed a hand, and many times when we didn't even know we did. Bob passed away after complications with Parkinson's and injuries caused by falls. His daughter, Susan, was with him and cared for him during his last days. She will place his urn sometime in May, per his wishes. He will join his late wife, Martha, Susan's mother, who passed in November 2013, at Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery in Point Loma.

In the past, I remember seeing him bring in plants to our shows in the park. I tried to get first choice when they came in because they were always of great beauty and quality. Other members have talked about seeing him always helping with setting up and visiting our Spring Shows. He and his daughter especially enjoyed visiting last year's Spring Show. He was our Society representative to the Balboa Park Board for many years. He also was our Society President from 1978 to 1979 and the Spring Show Chairman for 1977, 1978, 1987, 1988, 1989, and 1990.

Bob always tried to keep one of each type of orchid, although Paphs were his favorites. Susan remembers having fun filling the pouches with water as a kid and her dad, Bob, gently explaining that they didn't like all that water and that she needed to empty them out.

Bob will be missed as a member of our society and as our friend.

Jerry and Anita Spencer and Debby Halliday brought in a lot of plants, and we had some lovely additions from Bruce Berg, Kay Klausing, Carol Kerr, and Fely Acantilado. Local Coronado growers also contributed some nice plants to fill out the display.

It was a beautiful exhibit. Our cool cloudy winter meant that we still had Aussie dendrobiums, lots of gorgeous cymbidiums, and Debby's huge *Brassia* Rex 'Chorus Line' in perfect condition for this show. We also had a selection of cattleyas, paphs, phals, and other varieties to wow our visitors. The Coronado show is always fun because all the visitors already like flowers, but most of them have never been to an orchid show. They are just amazed by the beauty and variety of the plants we all love to grow.

The judges handed out lots of blue ribbons as well as some special awards. Jerry and Anita won Best Cattleya, Debby won Best Cymbidium, and Best Orchid for her *Brassia*. Our display was also voted Best Display in the Horticultural Division!

The display was full of visitors both days and we gave out lots of bookmarks and advice. Many people were interested to hear about our July show and several plan to check out

our meetings. It felt like a very worthwhile outreach event.

We have been participating for the past three years and plan to attend again next year. In addition to our display, there are many exhibits plus food, a beer garden, and a live band. This event has been held in Coronado for more than 90 years. If you've never participated, consider it for next year. The event is usually 2-3 weeks after our spring show and it's a great outlet for those stubborn beauties that refused to open in time for our show.

# An AOS/Spring Show Story Text by Bruce Berg

In addition to buying new orchids from my favorite vendors, something I enjoy about our Spring Shows at the Scottish Rite Center is that our society members bring in their best plants and put them in beautiful displays either following the show theme or set out on tables alongside hundreds of other blooming flowers on display open to the public. Our showroom is about 18,000 square feet, including about 10,000 square feet of vendor sales area.

As a committee member, my job this day was to sign in volunteers and help them by telling them where they were needed. Another of my favorite things about the show is listening to the stories that our members have to share about their experiences. This year we were fortunate to host the Spring Members Meeting of the American Orchid Society. which was held in conjunction with our Spring Show. They enjoyed touring our display area after conducting AOS judging of our member plants; this year they awarded 12 plants. The Newport Harbor Orchid Society was awarded the AOS trophy for the best exhibit of orchid flowers or cut flowers. They also awarded Newport Harbor the Orchid Digest Trophy for the best exhibit by an Amateur grower, covering 30 sq. ft. or more, demonstrating high flower quality and excellence of culture (we typically have 3 or 4 societies join us at our show). The AOS judges enjoyed a buffet lunch hosted by our society and enjoyed orchid tours offered by the orchid growers located in beautiful San Diego County.

Back to the story: Stewart Walton, a friend of mine and fellow society member, relayed a story that after judging, he saw that George Hatfield, a nationally known AOS recognized hybridizer and judge of Cymbidiums was looking over our Cymbidium display area. He recognized George from the many presentations he has made to our society over the years and remembered that his favorite hybridized cymbidium was made by George: Stewart had won that orchid as a seedling at a society raffle two years ago. The plant was an unregistered plant tagged Frank Kageyama 'Keiko' B/CSA X Voselsang 'Eastbourne.' As Stewart and George were talking about the plant, George told Stewart that the plant had been registered as 'Jean Hollebone' and said "There she is just over there if you want to meet her!" How many times have we seen plants named after someone and wondered who they were? Stewart was introduced to Jean, who, coincidentally did not know of the honor George had given her by naming a cross for her and the three of them had a great time taking photos and talking about Cymbidiums. A great reason to go to AOS events and to visit with people.



# Repotting Workshop Wrap-up Text by Bruce Berg

This weekend I made three new friends at the repotting workshop at our house! Pam Miller, Val Rosenberg, and Val's daughter Michelle Rosenberg are new members who came to our Spring Show and wanted to learn more about orchids; they talked with my wife, Carol, who told them about the potting workshop this past weekend. They were thrilled to sign up and plan to become active members. So if you see them at a meeting, say hi! We also had Sue Waugh, a relatively new member, bring in a big Cymbidium that Charlie Fouquette demonstrated how to divide using a fillet knife and a hammer, lamenting about not having his trusty machete at hand (I see another excuse to go to Harbor Freight). Members Dave Hoffmaster and Charley Fouquette helped with showing the guests how to repot the smaller plants. Ben Machado brought in the materials and gave us an intro on what supplies are needed to repot orchids. Susie, his wife, helped with setting things up. Sue Waugh helped Carol put together a great casserole for lunch to go together with other snacks brought in by the participants.

The weather was great and we all enjoyed talking about orchids. Peter Tobias gave an impromptu presentation on the various types of orchids, using my plants as specimens, and using a seed pod from an Epidendrum to educate us on the ways orchids reproduce in the wild

Culture: Zipties

When I returned from our Spring Show, I had several orchids that needed to be mounted. I had the wood, but did not relish the work involved with wrapping and tying fishing line to the wood to attach moss and the plants and then wrap line around the plant with more moss as a cushion to protect the tender roots. I thought about it for awhile and had an "a-ha" inspiration: I had some zip ties left over from another project and realized that they would work as well as fishing line to secure the plants to the mounts. I presented this idea at the Species meeting last month and was told that this was a technique that "everyone knew about." Since this was new to me, I thought I'd share it with other "new members like me" who don't know about it. I used all the standard techniques to mount a plant and just substituted using zipties for fishing line.

I used black ties, but clear or white would work just as well. If you are concerned about the appearance of the ties, you could disguise them with a bit of Spanish moss. Remember to put the locking piece of the ziptie to the back of the mount. Steps are "moss, roots, moss, ziptie" and you are done. You may want a second ziptie to help hold the roots and help support the leaves. Just do not tighten the zipties too tight! The zipties can be snipped off when the roots have established a firm grip on the plant.
