President's Message David Vandenbroek, President



Tim Culbertson: Holocoglossums: The Next Great Thing in Vandas

Tim Culbertson and Ashley Grable, First VP

One of Tim Culbertson's passions has always been plants. He began growing orchids as an offshoot from working at Longwood Gardens in Philadelphia just after college. From the very beginning it was all about *Paphiopedilums*, particularly awarded and select clones of historic importance, of which his collection numbers nearly 3,000. Tim currently manages the *Paphs* at Sunset Valley Orchids, and he does hybridizing in a wide range of genera. He is an accredited judge with the American Orchid Society, and he has served in various capacities with multiple orchid societies in California and on the East Coast.

He loves meeting other people who like orchids, too; doing so often finds him traveling to shows, vendors, and people's greenhouses to see the latest and greatest in new hybrids and to get the best orchid gossip. He likes to be involved in plants as much as possible; in addition to Longwood, he has worked at the Smithsonian Institution tending to their orchids, and he worked for years for the United States National Arboretum, collecting rare plants and documenting cultivated species and hybrids for their herbarium. In short, he really likes plants.

For the March meeting, Tim will share a presentation on *Holocoglossums*: The Next Great Thing in *Vandas. Holcoglossums* are a

relatively new genus to Vandaceous breeding, and they are already making a big splash. They are miniature, adaptable, and make great compact plants for windowsills or outdoors in Southern California. By combining Holcoglossums with basically every Vandaceous genus under the sun, breeders have been able to come up with some spectacular new combinations; in many cases, these are so new that they haven't even been named yet! This is truly cutting-edge breeding, and you will be amongst the first to see and appreciate these new directions in miniature Vandaceous plants. By the end of this presentation, you will have a new appreciation of the range of plant habits, floral forms, and colors of Holcoglossum species and hybrids, as well as an appreciation of their lovely flowers and ease-of-growth.



The SDCOS Board of Directors is undergoing some changes. We have 2 openings on the current board and will have 2 additional openings on the new board in June.

First off, I will not be running for a 3rd term as President. I have enjoyed my two terms so far, and look forward to continuing to serve as Past President, however I have an exciting opportunity which will likely prevent me from showing up in person to meetings or shows for a time, and so it does not make sense for me to continue to lead the society. I look forward to continuing to grow orchids with you and maintaining connections, but may be (even more) out of contact in the coming year.

We do not currently have someone to step into the **President** role, and are hoping to find someone before the June elections.

Additionally, we have current openings for **Secretary** and **Director at Large**. If anyone is willing to serve in these positions starting immediately, we would greatly appreciate it. Members could plan to either serve until the election in June, or volunteer to serve an entire term.

Last, we will also be looking for a new **2nd VP** to start after the June election.

Officially, the Nominating committee collects the names of all interested people and solicits volunteers and presents to the Board their recommended slate of officers. Because we are having a high turnover and have two currently open positions, we are starting the search a bit earlier than usual.

I know many people have volunteered in the past and many people already have their niches carved out, working in conservation, table. membership. plant show setup/teardown, and many more - thanks to everyone who is currently or has been part of the team that helps make this society function - I appreciate the people currently serving and those who "did their time" helping keep this organization, which was founded 78 years ago in 1947, running without which I wouldn't have been able to enjoy this great society.

Thanks for reading - if you feel any of these 7 positions could be right for you, please let me know. Looking forward to continuing to grow orchids with you!

General Outline of SDCOS Position Primary Responsibilities

President

- Run the general meeting, including agenda, announcements, and raffle
- Host (via Zoom) the monthly Board of Directors meeting (1st Thursday of each month)
- Make sure all standing committee positions are filled and committees have the resources needed to do their work
- Serve as a defacto member of all committees
- Appoint Nominating Committee and make sure the Board is staffed

2nd VP

- Primarily in charge of the monthly Culture Class
 - Find monthly culture class speakers
 - Write Newsletter article about that month's culture class
 - o Introduce the CC speaker
- Attend the monthly Board of Directors meeting (1st Thursday of each month)
- Organize up to two repotting workshops per year
- Ultimately responsible for making sure the AV setup / Zoom is working (though we are organizing an AV Team to alleviate this)

Volunteers Needed: General Outline of SDCOS Position Primary Responsibilities (continued)

Secretary

- Attend the monthly Board of Directors meeting (1st Thursday of each month)
- Take the meeting minutes at the Board of Directors meetings and any General Meeting where official business was conducted (such as the Election in June and conservation fund approval)
- Present the minutes for approval by the board, making any necessary revisions
- Keep official copies of the minutes and records of all meetings of the Board of Directors
- Once per year, in August, submit the ~2 forms necessary to register the society with the government (easy, we have detailed guides)

Director at Large

- Attend the monthly Board of Directors meeting (1st Thursday of each month)
- Give guidance at the Board meetings and vote on motions
- NOTE: this is a 3-year term, to provide continuity to the board
 - All other Board positions are 1year terms and need to be reelected every year
 - This position needs to be filled immediately to finish the last/current 3-year term.
 - Following that, this position needs to be filled for the next 3year term starting in June.
 - These 2 segments do not need to be the same person, so if you want to serve 4 months and leave, that would still be helpful.

AV Team

- Before the pandemic, it fell to the 2nd VP to set up the projector and mics for our speakers; after the pandemic, we added a Zoom component, which added slightly more complexity to the situation.
- Jack DeTate has been the only person who knows how to do this for years, and we want to change that, as Jack sometimes cannot make meetings.
- We are seeking to build a ~3 person team
 of people that can all do the setup this
 would mean that no 1 person needed to
 be present at every meeting we
 envision members of the AV team taking
 turns and filling in for each other so we
 can have a good AV experience without
 ever being too much of a burden on any
 1 person
- After training, responsibilities include:
 - Showing up at the General Meeting in time to set things up (~5:45ish)
 - o Getting out laptop
 - $\circ \quad \hbox{Connecting speakers and mics}$
 - o Starting/running zoom
 - Packing everything up after
- Note: I was trained how to do this by Jack last month - if you know how to use Zoom, the rest was surprisingly easy - it's way more intimidating when you don't know what goes into it.

Kid's Corner Volunteer

Nancy has run the Kid's corner at our shows for many years and would like some help and, eventually, to pass on the responsibility. At first this position would be helping her set up, clean up, and run the Kid's corner at the shows, during which time you would learn the ropes and see if this is something you might like to take the lead on sometime. Even if you don't want to run it, any help would be great, even if it's just being able to take some of the work 1 day each show.




