It's a bit of a rough time for the Society's Board, but I'm hopeful that by this time next year we'll have things sorted out better.

We welcomed Easter with a truly outstanding orchid show! Our members brought in 243 beautiful blooming orchids. We had many entries in our species classes, which really brings the wonder of orchids to our visitors. The plant quality was very high, enabling the AOS judges to award 8 Awards of Merit.

Jerry & Anita Spencer took Best of Show with their glorious specimen sized Ctt. Blazing Treat 'Rainbow Valley'. With its many heads of deep orange-red blooms, it also earned the Forrest Robinson Cultural Award. Congratulations to Jerry and Anita. The prize for Most Unusual Species went to John Snyder and his unique Pleurothallis sp. orchid. You know it's unusual when the species hasn't even been identified. Its creamy ribbon-like sepals and filamentous orange petals combined with a pale orange bulbous lip to create a very unique flower. Congratulations John, and thank you for sharing it with us.

People's Choice went to an impressive semialba Cattleya hybrid, Lc. Park Ridge 'Thornridge', brought in by Xavier Hung. The dramatic purple lip, bright white petals and sepals, and abundant flowers made a real show stopper and caught the eyes of many visitors. Rounding out the top five People's Choice winners were *Paph. rothschildianum* by Paolo Green, *Paph. micranthum* by John Snyder, Galeopetalum Memoria Loren Batchman by Rachel Burns, and *Arpophylum giganteum* by Betty Kelepecz. As always, many different plants were chosen. More details in the next newsletter.

Special thanks to our superb show committee who really carried the ball this time. I was out of town a lot, but everyone stepped up and made sure their part of the show ran perfectly. - History Rooted Nobility (Samurai), What Makes a Fukiran Special?
- Variegation, Leaf Shape, Root Tip Color, and Tsuke (joint where leaf meets the stem)

• Appreciation and Culture of Fukiran. In front of the posters were 12 different forms of *Vanda falcata* plants in matching vases. Thank you, David, for such a beautiful and informative display.
